HCL Grant Edition VIII



HCL Grant has completed its 4th stage of "Field Level Due Diligence" for HCL Grant Edition VIII. 51 organizations (17 in each category) were selected in Proposal Review round which went through an audit exercise of field visit by HCL Grant Subject Matter Experts. Alongside, detailed due diligence is conducted by the Governance partner. The two teams undertook a joint review of the applications and basis each other findings 30 organisations (10 in each category) were selected for the 5th stage Sub Jury round.







HCL Grant consolidated its field level due diligence round, wherein Subject Matter experts came together with HCL Foundation team in the presence of Ms. Roshni Nadar Malhotra, Chairperson HCLTech; & Dr. Nidhi Pundhir, Vice President (Global CSR) & Director HCL Foundation; to select the top 10 NGOs under each category – Environment, Health & Education.

In the process to identify the best NGO for receiving the HCL Grant, the eminent experts travelled over 1,00,000 kilometers to visit 51 NGOs in 61 districts of 22 states to understand their work and present their cases for the Sub-Jury round. More than 3,000 hours have been invested in this stage of the selection process.

Two days' state level training of Nodal officers of State Council of Education Research and Training from 10 districts of Jammu and Kashmir on School Safety and Security was organized by Save the Children, HCL Grant Recipient, 2020, Education, at Srinagar on 9th and November 10, 2022.

Participants included officials from Directorate of School Education Kashmir, Head of Institutions and Teachers. The objective was to discuss about the significance of school safety plan and hazard management in schools. Participatory group work exercises were conducted on identifying risk, understanding hazard and risk children face in and around schools.

Ata Ul Muneem Tak (Personnel Officer DSEK Kashmir) Inaugurated the workshop by throwing insights on importance of school safety and management plan, a day long training programme was organized with more than 60 Teacher's and HOI's from 30 intervention school of district Budgam at Hotel Golden Leaf - Hyderpora Srinagar on 12 Nov.

Personnel Officer (DSEK) inaugurated the workshop with his inaugural speech on Importance of school safety and Plan. He further addressed participants with various examples of Harzard incidences took place in schools of India and within Kashmir division were due to lack of proper planning the vulunerabilities had severe adverse effect. Run when you can, walk if you have to; crawl if you must, just never give up.

Like any other youngster, Bhimambika, a resident of Lebgeri, Village, Koppal district, Bangalore wanted to compete in the running events at her school's sports day. It was difficult for her to accept that she would always have to walk with the support of crutches after three amputation surgeries in a successive five years ago due to a non-healing infection. It was definitely difficult for her to embrace herself physically. It was when she was on the verge of losing hope that her right leg would ever again be a functional part of her body, the Centre for Spinal Cord Injury Rehabilitation and Research and the Assistive and Adaptive Technology Department of Association of People with Disability, HCL Grant Recipient, 2022, Health Category equipped her with a prosthetic limb.



I was skillfully taught how to handle myself with my new, lightweight leg by the team of rehabilitation professionals from APD. They also enabled me with the opportunity to engage in para-sports and obtain support for my career and livelihood. I was so thrilled to hear my family and friends tell that Bhimmambika is walking again and will soon learn to run as well."

Child Rights and You

A resident of Barkheda Village, GunaDsitrict, Madhya Pradesh, Savita (name changed) is a drop out from class 8th. Savita's father does not contribute much to the family income like rest of the Bedia men and her mother is a homemaker and is mentally challenged. Savita was under constant pressure from her family to enter in commercial sex to support the family financially like one of her aunts. She had only two options like other girls of her age, either to marry or go ahead for sex work. She had almost given up to her fate and was in the verge of entering into the traditional sex work when she came in contact with the team of Child Rights and You, HCL Grant Recipient, 2021, Education Category. After continuous

counselling and home visits, the team was able to convince her family and more importantly Savita herself to join the Kishori Group (Adolescent Group) and gradually she was involved in the activities of the group. She started attending the meetings regularly which helped her to change her mind. She chose to continue her education and was facilitated to get admission in Govt. Higher Secondary School, Maksudangarh. Currently, she is a student of 9th standard. The team is continuously in touch and doing regular follow-ups with her to ensure that she continues to follow the path she chose for herself.
