Key Highlights

Delivering Warmth: HCLFoundation's Emergency Response to Cold Wave

Amidst plummeting temperatures in January of 2024, HCLFoundation sprung into action, partnering with its wide network of NGO partners and HCLTech volunteers to extend warmth and hope to those battling the bitter cold in Delhi, Noida and Lucknow.

The HCLFoundation teams traversed 55 locations across Noida, Gautam Buddha Nagar, Lucknow delivering essential relief kits to people in dire need.

The relief kits were curated to combat the biting cold - from thermal blankets to winter clothing and nutrient-rich food supplies, each kit served as a lifeline for those braving the harsh elements without proper shelter. Our efforts were bolstered by a collaborative spirit, with our partner ecosystem from Chetna, Empowerment for Rehabilitation, Academic and Health (EFRAH), Ankur Yuva Chetna Shivir (AYCS) and Doctors For You (DFY) – alongside the dedicated HCLTech volunteers.

The coming together of project directors, field officers and committed volunteers - each played a role in the success. The impact of the emergency response reverberated through the testimonials of those we reached. Feedback echoed gratitude for the warmth and protection provided during a time of dire need, reaffirming the significance of our timely intervention.



Star Team Member

In the bustling heart of Nagpur, amidst the challenges and triumphs of community development, stands —Piyush Wankhade –Manager, HCLFoundation's flagship Uday programme in Nagpur. Piyush's story is one of resilience, adaptability, and as we will see – an unwavering commitment to social progress.

Excerpts from an interview - edited and condensed for clarity.

An alumni teacher

Piyush's professional odyssey commenced in the halls of academia, where his passion for education germinated. Despite starting with engineering (He holds a BE in Electronics & Communication from Nagpur University), his heart gravitated towards the profound complexities of India's education system. Teaching at the Polytechnic of his alma mater served as the catalyst for him, igniting, as he puts it, "that spark to take up education as my chosen field."

"There is no point sitting outside the system and cribbing about it"

Piyush ventured beyond the conventional, as he went on to pursue a Master's in Education from Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), specializing in the nuanced realm of higher education. The journey ahead, as Piyush puts it, "was marked by a series of firsts"—from pioneering educational initiatives to spearheading transformative policies.

First of Firsts

"Since my childhood, a lot of things that I was part of were firsts or firsts," says Piyush as he mentions his tenure with the Government of Andhra Pradesh that saw him orchestrate the implementation of educational schemes such as the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), navigating the intricate corridors of policy- with finesse.

Then, a pivotal moment came when his expertise propelled him to the helm of strategic initiatives at a more pan-India level with MHRD, Golat New Delhi. But he fondly recalls both - the vibrant streets of Hyderabad as well as the dynamic landscape of Delhi. He says, "Learnings were aplenty - both at work and in life. I'm still friends with my roommates from my rented space in Lajpat Nagar, Delhi - whom I make it a point to meet whenever I visit the capital."

A seamless transition - well, almost!

Piyush mentions how moving to HCLFoundation was 'almost' seamless. "Seamless because – of course, it was guided by my urge to work out of my hometown. Something that I now also realize is once I joined, it was seamless also because all I had to do then, was merge my corporate debut with my ethos for social development. And that happened quickly!"

- "And not-so-seamless because?", we asked him.
- "Because, I had never even used Outlook before!"

What does a day-in-the-(work) life of Piyush look like?

"So, I recently started exercising. Turns out - there's lot of pressure to then be in shape! (laughs)".

And then you dive - head on - into the day's tasks!

My role transcends mere coordination; it is more of solution finding. We are like a bridge between corporate funding and local partners. We look at reports and Excel sheets and correlate with work onground. You may even find me working out of the partner offices pretty often. And then there are the field visits – where we meet the participants – at least once a week. So you see, there is lots of local partner engagement and stakeholder management (both internal & external)."

In the same breath, Piyush (with his affable demeanor) says, "Almost all my work friends are from HCLTech and I routinely sit for lunches with the Admin or the HR team."

One big learning?

I have, three, actually! One: we need to understand that everyone has their own work and pressure. So, it's important to build relationships and work together. Two, knowing what your leader/RM or anyone in the system would 'ask for next' and being ready with that. Lastly, listening actively! That's helped me a lot! I try not let anything pass by me without making a note about it.

A memorable experience?

Hands down - it has to be the Sports for Change National Finals in Nagpur in 2022! Hosting 700+ children, the teams - local and outstation - and ensuring their welfare! A thrilling, memorable experience!

One advise to the younger lot wanting to pursue a career in this space?

I am not sure if I'm old enough for it, but sure! The CSR space is filled with nuances; there still are things that are evolving but it is a space that has been welldesigned and well thought out. It is fast-paced and it requires you to be on your toes! So, being fast paced and adaptable to this ever-evolving space and still being patient - because if you really want to make a change, be aware of the fact that on-ground things will not change overnight! Respect the process and trust the process.

Piyush is Nagpur-based where he stays with his family. Such is his love for music, that ask anyone in HCLFoundation and they will corroborate the fact that he can (almost always) be found humming – at work, travelling – everywhere. Ask him if his passion for music extends into a similar passion for dance as well, and he is quick to reply, "Yes! So you know the Ganpativisarjan dance? Well, that's more like my brand of dancing!"

Manjha awareness in Bengaluru

On the eve of Sankranti, 20 HCLTech employee volunteers participated in a manjha awareness and cleanup drive at Bengaluru's iconic Lalbagh park along with our NGO partner Avian and Reptile Rehabilitation Trust. In a collaborative effort, the day was spent raising awareness against the perils of manjha to the visitors of the park as well as cleaning up manjha from some of the oldest trees of Bengaluru. The volunteers enthusiastically participated in all aspects of the event like surveying the trees for manjha, participating in the cleanup, attending the manjha rescues, documenting the whole process as well as directly interacting with the public with an renewed hope to make a positive change in the lives of the wildlife around us.



Environmental awareness through grassroot comics

Comic distribution and community engagement sessions was organised by World Comics India in Sorkha, Noida. 35 students from the local communities reached out to 50 households, engaging 150 community members to install 4 comic notice boards. Nearly 100 environmental awareness comics was created under Sorkha-Ek Jan Abhiyan campaign by these communities.

Strawberry farming started in Hardoi

In place of traditional Rabi or winter crops such as wheat, pulses, mustard and vegetables, one may now also see strawberries in the fields of Kinotti village in Hardoi.

To meet the goal of increasing farmers income, new crops have been introduced in the geography through Samuday by HCLFoundation.

In October 2023, strawberry saplings were provided to 5 farmers; 4,000 saplings per farmer, covering an area of ~1 kachha bhiga land for each farmer. After good fruiting, farmers have now started harvesting the fruits, readying to market after proper packaging. The first harvesting was done on 30th January the rest are in ripening stage and will be harvested when they reach their peak colour and sweetness. Ensuring improved market conditions for the upcoming fruit harvest shall continue to be a priority for Samuday.



HKPCL awarded Outstanding FPO in Uttar Pradesh Award 2024

Hardoi Kisan Producer Company Limited has once again bagged the prestigious title of the Outstanding Farmer Producer Organisation in Uttar Pradesh 2024.

The award was presented to HKPCL by Shri Surya Pratap Shahi, Agriculture Minister of Uttar Pradesh during the Uttar Pradesh Diwas event held from January 24-26.



Swachhata Sangam organised

Samuday organized the 'Swachhta Sangam' at Sandila Nagar Palika Parishad in Hardoi with the purpose of engaging community members and making them aware of best practices in Solid Waste Management (SWM) and sanitation. During the event, multiple activities were carried out such as dance, speech and skit focusing the issue. Chairperson and other officials of the Palika office along with ward members were present during the programme which engaged 170 residents of the area.



Divisional workshop held in Prayagraj for orientation & planning on DLCC & AI

A one-day orientation workshop on 'Digital literacy, Coding, Computational Thinking & Artificial Intelligence' was organised in Prayagraj in collaboration with SCERT and Dept. Of Basic education, GoUP, for BSAs, DIET Principals and Lecturers, District Coordinator Training, District Coordinator Girls' Education, teachers from KGBVs, and master trainers of Fatehpur, Kaushmabi, and Pratapgarh & Prayagraj districts.

Mr. Vijay Vishwas Pant, Commissioner, Prayagraj and Ms. Tanuja Tripathi, Additional Director, Basic education, Prayagraj graced the event with their presence.

The attendees were briefed on the huge impact that DLCC & AI will be able to make in imparting 21st century skills amongst students. The master trainers present in the workshop were previously part of the 5-day ToT held in Lucknow. They used the platform to share and demonstrate their learnings and insights. The participants discussed at length about the rollout strategy and plan of execution for trainings and classroom teachings in their respective districts.



Transforming lives through Chikankari

The Chikankari art-based project under Samuday by HCLFoundation envisions to accelerate change in the lives of rural women from Hardoi by amplifying their income generation pattern and reinstating the existing traditional values. The project is not only promoting financial independence but also fostering the sense of pride among them. In January 2024, around 100 women engaged in embroidery & stitching have done exceptionally well in delivering order of 1,000+ pieces of women & men's kurta and chikankari diary covers.







Empowering rural women through Dairy development

With the vision of increasing women participation in dairy development*, 12 womenheaded dairy farmers association (DFA) have been established in January. These DFAs will facilitate milk collection at village level. These DFAs are managed completely by Women Dairy Farmers and will also be operated by women secretaries.



Tuberculosis Demonstration and Elimination project

Samuday, through its Tuberculosis Demonstration and Elimination project is supporting the National Tuberculosis Elimination programme (NTEP) for the TB Mukt Panchayat initiative. In January, an active casefinding activity was conducted in five panchayats of Ahirori and Sandila blocks in Hardoi. During this outreach activity, TB champions visited a total of 243 households. With NTEP team, TB Champions facilitated the submission of 122 sputum samples to the designated microscopic center, all of which got negative results in microbiological investigations. Additionally, through a series of awareness activities, team successfully reached out to over 700 individuals, providing valuable information on tuberculosis prevention and management.





To provide for economic independence and social empowerment, Samuday is training women artisans on developing natural fibre-based products. The project focuses on skill development in craft products made from natural fibres like Moonj grass. The team has also collaborated with a marketing agency to ensure provision of sustained marketplace. In January, 109 women artisans underwent training on Moonj basketry and crafts, by inclusion of basic skill, product skill, leadership and ancillary skills. The Samuday team also conducted a workshop for the women on market trends, quality checks and packaging. The artisans displayed their finished products after completion of the workshop.

Right Skills, Bright Future

Youth from the Training and Skill development Center in Hardoi are being trained in three in-demand trades - Solar PV Installer, Assistant Electrician, and RAC (Refrigeration and Air conditioning). Apart from providing theoretical and practical skill sets, developing their soft skill is also kept in focus. In January, 11 youth completed their training in Solar PV Installer trade and got placed in Manpower Groups Services India Pvt. Ltd.

National Girl Child Day celebrated

National Girl Child Day (NGCD) was celebrated on 24th January in Hardoi with multiple sensitization activities organized in schools and public health facilities of the district. Awareness activities and orientation sessions on various activities related to pre-conception and pre-natal diagnostic techniques (PCPNDT) Act, and Gender equality were conducted. A total of 164 individuals were reached out to through health facilities and 2,000 adolescent girls were addressed across 20 schools. 500 adolescent girls were screened for their Hb (hemoglobin) level; IFA and Moringa Supplements were given to them to combat iron deficiency anemia. Various activities like drawing competition, poster presentation, rangoli, street play, etc. were conducted with adolescent girls to increase awareness and impart deep rooted behavioral changes for long run.





First District Task Force Meeting held for National Quality Accreditation of public health facilities

Samuday by HCLFoundation is supporting Health Facility Accreditation under the National Quality Assurance programme (NQAP) of public health facilities (CHC, PHC, SC) in Hardoi. On 16th January, under the chairmanship of CDO, a first ever district task force meeting for quality was held. CMO (Chief Medical Officer) Hardoi, ACMO (Assistant Chief Medical Officer) panel, MOIC (medical Officer Incharge) of concerned blocks, DPRO and representative of PWD took part in the same. The samuday team along with its partners presented findings of baseline assessment of 11 facilities done with the help of NOAS - National Ouality Assurance checklist. 30,000 checkpoints were assessed under various departments of health facilities; gaps identified and support required were presented to the CDO, CMO and the participants.

HCLTech Grant begins with the Stage 6 of the selection process

HCLTech Grant has commenced with the final leg of due diligence of the shortlisted NGOs, as a precursor to the Grand Jury. The governance partner is close to the completion of the detailed diligence exercise for all the selected organizations. Simultaneously, the work for The Fifth Estate Edition VIII has also been initiated, to publish the exemplary work of the top 30 NGOs, selected in the HCLTech Grant selection process.

Unit of Hope Medical Team: Comprehensive Assessment and Intervention for Special Children's Medical Needs

Specialists from the Unit of Hope at St. John Medical College visited AIFO INDIA's project office. They screened children with disabilities, assessed their needs, provided medication, and referred those requiring further investigation and treatment.



Physio Drive: Identifying and Assessing Physiotherapy Needs in AIFO INDIA's Project Area

A Physiotherapy drive, assisted by volunteers from Spurthy College of Physiotherapy and Dr B R Ambedkar College of Physiotherapy, reaching out to 69 Persons With Disabilities (PWDs). Across localities including Haragadde, Suragajakkanahalli, Yadavanahalli, Attibele, and Bidaraguppe, individuals were assessed, provided therapy sessions, and given guidance on home exercises. The drive extended benefits to PWDs from distant places.



Inclusivity and Empathy Sensitization: Fostering understanding for Children with Disabilities within the school community

A school sensitization programme was held at the Haragadde Government High School and Neraluru Government Higher Primary School, respectively, which saw a total of 195 pupils getting educated on disability inclusivity, types, causes, and the rights of persons living with disabilities, fostering awareness and understanding.



BBMP doctors onsite training for DPCP

After obtaining the BBMP's approval of 10 PHC allotments in the South zone of Bengaluru for involvement in the BUMHI project, an on-site training programme for the medical officers of the selected PHCs was conducted on January 6, 2024 after discussion with South Zone Medical Officer, BBMP. With the support of various prominent BBMP representatives, including the Special Commissioner of Health, Chief Health Officer, and District Mental Health programme Officer, the doctors were foundationally trained on common mental disorders and their management and the schedule of the Diploma in Primary Care Psychiatry (DPCP) programme was provided to them by the Department of Psychiatry at NIMHANS.



SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Graduation Day of MIC students

HCLF- Head Held High Yuvakendra students graduated from the Make India Capable programme. The students were trained in IT and 21st century soft skills over a period of 3 months and on Job Training of 1 month. 30 students who are graduated from this batch are all set to go for the placement drives.

Mental health awareness programs and community engagement programme at Ejipura Government Primary School

The field team was approached by the headmistress of the Elipura Government Primary School for the conduction of an awareness programme for the parents of the students and teachers. 36 parents of the school children in class 6 who were to face public exams in March were addressed on mental health, how to identify distress and information regarding BUMHI modules for the interested parents and Tele-MANAS for free counseling for the children, parents and family members. Soon after, about 8 of the teachers in the school were made to take part in a mental health awareness activity and information was given to them regarding how they can identify distress and how the referral system from field to the hospital may work. After this, they were involved in an engagement session about mental health. They gave valuable input on the existing mental health issues in the community and possible barriers and solutions to the same.





We can beat Cancer together!

Lung Cancer Screening

In partnership with Cancer Institute, we conducted a survey in the community to identify tobacco smokers/chewers aged above 45 years, who consume more than a pack a day. This initiative aims to screen for lung cancer and provide cessation intervention. From 39 households surveyed, we identified 10 tobacco users.



Breast and Cervical Awareness:

Adyar Cancer Institute (WIA), in collaboration with BROSIGA Anganwadi centre, organized an awareness session titled "Breast and Cervical Awareness" for women in Gandhi Nagar, Chennai, on January 29, 2024. A total of 18 women benefitted from this programme.



Empowerment through Puppets

In collaboration with NalandaWay Foundation, we've empowered students with the values of Hope, Gratitude, and Kindness through an engaging puppet show. Facilitated by experts in theatre activities, the programme reached 130 primary students at Chennai Primary School, Ezhil Nagar, with plans for expansion to five more schools. Additionally, 70 middle school children participated, enriching their understanding through captivating stories.



Along with NGO Partner

Sochara Community House Visits were carried out in Ambedkar Nagar. The team conducted house visits in Ambedkar Nagar to raise awareness among community members and police club students about essential hygiene practices at home and in public, such as wearing slippers and preventing stagnant water accumulation.



A Rangoli Competition at Perumbakkam Community

Representatives from 12 blocks enthusiastically participated in a rangoli competition centered around themes of water sanitation, hygiene, handwashing, water conservation, waste segregation, and environmental cleanliness. Approximately 300 community members, including children, gained awareness on these vital topics. Prizes were distributed by police personnel and HCLTech volunteers.



Republic Day Celebration

A special Republic Day event unfolded with the hoisting of the flag by esteemed guest Mr. Ravi, SI (Child Welfare Officer) of Sholavaram police station. The day featured captivating group dances, a mime performance depicting the "Life of a Military Officer" by girls, a pyramid display by boys, and a fancy dress competition for younger participants at Anandhallam. Each participant was honored with a prize.



Pongal Celebration

At CHES Anandhalllam, Pongal festivities were joyously observed. Children engaged in precelebration activities by painting Pongal pots, tidying up their surroundings, and adorning the venue. Dressed in traditional attire, they partook in various games and entertainment sessions. The highlight was the traditional preparation of "Sweet Pongal" in a mud pot.



A Social Security Scheme Camp took place at Tank Factory, facilitated alongside our NGO Partner, Hope Foundation. At the camp, community members applied for Mudalvar Kapedu Thittam (Health Insurance), opened bank accounts, obtained disability certificates, and community certificates. ~250 families attended, benefiting from these essential services.



Skill Rath Vehicle Visit

Grey Sim Learnings Foundation (HCLF partner) organized a Skill Rath Vehicle visit to the TVK Nagar Police Boys and Girls Club. Ms. Kokila facilitated a robotics session, providing valuable knowledge and skills to the children.



Khelo India Women's Rugby League

Students from Chemmenchery Police Boys and Girls Club secured third place in the Khelo Women's Rugby League and were honored by Mr. Muruqan, Inspector of Police.



Pongal Celebrations

Police Boys & Girls Clubs: Vibrant Samathuva Pongal celebrations were held at various locations including Tank Factory, Villivakkam, Ayanavaram, Nungambakkam, Ambattur Estate, and Ezhil Nagar, in collaboration with the Police Boys & Girls Clubs. A total of 380 students showcased their talents through Rangoli, essay writing, speech delivery, drawing, and fashion shows – highlighting the festival's significance. The event culminated with the distribution of prizes to competition winners and the sharing of sweet Pongal with all participants, fostering a sense of joy and unity.



Republic Day Celebrations

Republic Day was celebrated at various Police Boys and Girls Clubs, with flag hoisting ceremonies led by Inspectors of Police. Club students also actively participated in the events.



SFC PBGC Football Qualifiers

The SFC Football Men's Qualifiers saw active participation from our sports players at Perambur. Ms. Anbukarasi, Inspector of Police – TVK Nagar, honored our players and extended best wishes.


