








Education in Emergencies -Enabling E-learning through our network of partners

HCL Foundation, under its HCL Uday program, has enabled e-learning. It facilitates children's access to educational material through WhatsApp, audio messages and other online platforms. With its NGO partners, teacher trainings are being organised using video conferencing. Under HCL Foundation's Sports for Change program, regular fitness session for children are being conducted with NGO partners Dribble Academy & Kutumb Foundation using technology. Through these sessions, children are able to keep up their fitness levels and enthusiasm.




A Stitch in Time, Saves Lives

HCL Foundation has activated its SHG network in time to ensure supply of masks across the country

This is a story of emerging stronger, of creating value and opportunities, and empowering those most affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic. Under the

Livelihood initiative of HCL Foundation across HCL Uday locations, an army of trained SHGs women members are putting their stitching skills to use to help others and are making lifesaving masks.





Awahaan, with the support of HCL Foundation, started working in Sarojini Nagar Block in Lucknow to create livelihood opportunities for SHGs who lost their sources of income to the pandemic. To create income generation and health awareness amongst this group, they trained 12 members from 7 SHGs to make masks through video calls. The raw material and cut pieces of cloth are being provided by Khadi Gramodyog Sansthan, free of cost and it also purchases all finished masks. 4000+ masks have been produced till now.



AROHA, HCL Foundation NGO Partner in Nagpur, runs two skills and training centres where they trained women to make school uniforms. They were taught how to make masks for their families and the community, and they swiftly made 3000 masks till 14th April. In the second week of April, 700 families were supported with dry ration kits and AROHA, with the support of HCL Foundation, contributed 700 packets of 3 masks each, towards distribution in the community along with the dry ration kits. In all, 2100 masks were distributed in the community.







HCL Foundation Academy Creating a world full of possibilities

Continuity of Dairy Operations


- 2 times daily at all AMCU centers




Powering through Lockdown
