



Aligned with their common vision of creating sustainable livelihoods, the initiative will help empower rural artisans to scale their entrepreneurial endeavours.

Affairs, Flipkart Group) highlighted the significant role of handicrafts in improving rural livelihoods, giving a glimpse into the holistic rural development efforts of HCL Samuday and Flipkart Samarth respectively. Hon'ble chief guest, Shri Keshav Prasad Maurya (Deputy Chief Minister & Minister of Rural Development, GoUP) lauded the partnership and saw it as the beginning of a transition towards a

# **Celebrating International Kangaroo Care Day**

On May 15, 2022, HCL Samuday celebrated International Kangaroo Care Day to spread awareness of Kangaroo Care for babies across 11 blocks of Hardoi. Awareness events were conducted in 15 Health Centres for pregnant women, lactating mothers, staff nurses & other community health workers through a demonstration of Kangaroo Care. With the aid of pamphlets & IEC tools, 493 beneficiaries were made aware of how skin to skin contact between the baby & parents strengthens their bond and promotes the emotional & physical development of the baby.







# Persuasion and right guidance by the ASM paved the way to a healthy mother

**Organisation:** India Health Action Trust

Project Title: Improving Maternal, Newborn and Child Health Outcomes

in Tribal Areas of Madhya Pradesh

**Project Location:** Shahdol district of Madhya Pradesh

Kavita Singh was six months pregnant when the ASHA Sahyog Mentor (ASM) approached her during one of the field visits. The ASM found that Kavita was suffering from health issues - vertigo, weakness and swelling in legs. The ASHA shared that during the ANC visit, Kavita's Hb was 8 gm/dl, BP 123/76 and weight was 45 Kg; however, these indicators were not updated in the MCP card. The ASM inquired about the uptake of IFA and calcium supplements, to which Kavita shared that she has stopped consuming them as she used to feel nauseated. The ASM explained to her about the need for IFA and calcium for a pregnant woman, and if she consumes the supplements along with something sour food curd/lemon, it will reduce nausea. The ASM also advised her to include


green leafy vegetables, cereals, locally available fruits, and iodized salt in her diet, Further, upon ASM's suggestion. Kavita visited CHC Jaisinghnagar for confirming her Hb, and it was found to be 7gm/dl, for which she was prescribed iron sucrose administration. Her family refused to opt for it on the pretext of some myth. The ASM and ASHA discussed cleared the myth and counselled them about the benefit of iron sucrose to bring the Hb to a desirable level. With rigorous efforts and repeated visits by the ASM and ASHA, the family agreed and allowed Kavita to take the iron sucrose dose; this increased Hb to 9.4 gm/dl. On February 13, 2022, Kavita gave birth to a healthy baby with 2,700 gm weight without any complications.

19 year old Sangla is a mother from Taknyu village located 57 kms away from the district headquarter Tuensang. The village is very remote with no network connectivity or a health facility. She is married to Beso and the couple make a living through farming. She said, For me ANC check-up and institutional delivery was beyond imagination since our village is far from the health centres. I never thought of going for a check-up. When I got pregnant for the first time, I could not open up and ask anyone for information about pregnancy- not even with my mother in-law or siblings. 99



# Sensitization workshop conducted on family planning

A sensitization workshop was conducted with key stakeholders (local and religious leaders, shopkeepers, etc) and CBOs on Family Planning by Vatsalya NGO, Lucknow from May 10-12, 2022 where a total of 160 community members participated.

The main objective of the activity was to increase the involvement of men in family planning & to improve the availability of family planning services and reproductive health of women in the age group 15-49 years.

Mother's Day is a day that every child celebrates in honor of their mothers. It's a day dedicated to honoring and celebrating mothers. School children took part in various activities with SHEF - HCL Foundation teachers to celebrate this everlasting bond of love and affection with mothers.

The day was celebrated at 16 schools, with around 948 children participating.

Her daughter has been coming to Gurukul Point of CHETNA-HCL Foundation to study. Worried about her daughter's future, Sangeeta also started working as a cook in a few houses. She is also the primary care giver for her husband. But despite everything, she wants her daughter to attend private school and her dream is to make her a police officer.

Due to the poor financial condition of the house, we migrated from the village to the city in search of better opportunity and quality education for the children. But due to Lockdown during the pandemic, it became difficult to manage the expenses and arrange food for the children. We were approached by Chetna -HCL Foundation where they had enrolled our children to the Gurukul centre and ensured learning and mental wellbeing for the children. Our children were also mainstreamed to the nearest Government school. I am glad that all this became possible with the support of CHETNA NGO & HCL Foundation.

### **Ensuring access to Government programmes**



Firoza, 61, is a home based tailor and member of the Shahnawaz Mahila Gat of the women's collective in Taj Bagh.

On June 1, 2021, Firoza along with LEARN field staff, the leaders and other members of her group visited the District Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Centre to meet with the supervisor to submit a formal application of non-delivery of Take-Home Ration (THR) kits in the Ekta Chowk and Khadim Galli areas of Taj Bagh area. Firoza and the other

members of these areas were facing issues as the ASHA Worker of ICDS sub centre i.e. Anganwadi number 120 refused to distribute these THR kits to the members of the community. Under ICDS, Anganwadis across the state are providing free and nutritious meals to children, supplementary nutrition, healthcare, and pre-school education.

After this successful intervention by LEARN and HCL Foundation the women's collective, in July 2021 Firoza started receiving the takehome ration kits for her family which includes three grandchildren. She says, "LEARN - HCL Foundation se hume itni madat hoti he., acche schemes ke bareme batate he... Abhi hume barabar anaj mil raha he"

(We receive a lot of help, we get to know about various schemes... now we are receiving ration regularly). Despite this success, the ICDS centre is only able to do intermittent distribution of THR, due to uncertain supply. LEARN - HCL Foundation team may need to continue their correspondence and follow-up with various government departments to ensure access to these THR kits through the ICDS centre.

## Normalizing institutional deliveries

Jasmine Bibi is a 23-year-old woman, a migrant from West Bengal, who lives in the Sarfabad slum. During a community awareness meeting on ANC PNC, Jasmine Bibi informed our staff that she is 7-months pregnant with her third child and her husband and in-laws are against immunization and institutional delivery.

Her in-laws believe that vaccination and institutional delivery are not needed and bothersome. Till date, no one in their family has been immunized; they have all given birth at home and are healthy. She, too, should follow the tradition. Her previous 2 ANC checkups were also not done. During the home-based delivery of the second child, her vaginal bleeding continued for 4 months.

She was terrified for both her and her child's life. She did not want to face the same situation during her third pregnancy and wished for proper health checks and institutional delivery.

The community mobilizer conducted an IPC session with Jasmine Bibi's husband. Incorporating a flipbook, a video on ANC PNC, breastfeeding, and an immunization card, he was informed of several advantages, such as how ANC would lead to the early identification and management of various health concerns like anemia, diabetes, etc. and how vaccination would protect the health of his wife and child. He was also linked to people who had used the services. He initially resisted. Through our constant efforts, after four sessions, he agreed to vaccination and institutional delivery after realizing the importance of such activities.

Jasmine Bibi's immunization and third ANC check-up were completed after we linked her to ASHA worker. She was overjoyed.

The community mobilizer empowered Jasmini Bibi to take a stand for herself and assured her of constant support and help. With new found confidence for the sake of her unborn child Jasmine Bibi protested against her inlaws who insisted on home birth. She stood steadfast in her position and fought hard against them, finally persuading them to accept institutional delivery.

# WASH (Water, Sanitation & Hygiene) awareness sessions at Hyderabad

To promote sustainable WASH behavioural practices MARI NGO with the support of HCL Foundation have conducted 27 Awareness Sessions or Short Workshops with Students and Community Members covering 281 participants covering the catchment communities of 10 Government Schools in Asif Nagar Mandal, Hyderabad.



These sessions helped to sensitize on importance of sustainable WASH behavioural practices for clean & healthy environment at Schools & Communities. These sessions covered various topics like sustainable maintenance of WASH Infrastructure at Schools, importance and process of hand washing, present trend & prevention of COVID-19, importance of vaccinations, menstrual hygiene and solid waste segregation.











### Rain water harvesting structures

In view of upcoming monsoon season, to enhance & recharge ground water levels at the schools, 05 - Rain Water Harvesting Structures have been created at 05-Government Schools namely GHS Vijayanagar Colony, GGHS First Lancer, GBHS Goshacut, GHS Langer House and GBHS Humayun Nagar schools in Hyderabad.

These structures at schools help schools and surrounding locations to recharge ground water levels, also promotes both water and energy conservation.

Approximately 5,000+ people will be benefited directly and indirectly.











### **Graduation Day Ceremony -Make India Capable course**



To enhance employability among youth, Head Held High Foundation with the support of HCL Foundation has imparted 1,000 Hours "Make India Capable" Skill Development Training for 34 job seekers / youth.

This training is helping the youth to understand the Industries' employment requirement and mitigate the Skills Gap.

The training covers Soft Skills, Life Skills, Employability Skills, Micro Soft Certification and 21st Century Skills. Post Training 30 students got placed with different employers in multiple sectors like IT, ITES, BPO, Sales & Marketing etc. The salaries ranging between ₹9,000/- to ₹15,000/-. Remaining candidates have opted for Higher Education.

Story of Bhargavi is not different from many women who got married at a young age and had to leave her studies. Her decision to dropout from education not only affected her employability but it also started affecting her son's education as she found it difficult to assist him in his studies. Being a single parent she had to strive through all these by herself.

This is when she enrolled herself in Make India Capable project of Head Held High Foundation under skill development initiatives of HCL Foundation in Bangalore. Now Bharghavi not only teaches her son, but many children in need of assistance in their basic education. Bhargavi is also looking forward to develop her career through the skilling initiative that enabled her with technical skills and 21st century soft skills.





### A mother's love

Mariya is a resident of Yarahandahalli village at Jigani Taluk, she is a calm and hardworking woman. She always aspired to become an entrepreneur since she wanted to alleviate her economic condition and give employment opportunities to the people around her.

She is an amateur in stitching and tailoring. In the past, she has been passionately acquiring stitching skills. She is known teach tailoring to a few ladies in the area. Even though she does the tailoring on her she wasn't in a position to gain more skills since she couldn't afford any of the training to upgrade herself. Unfortunately, she is the only one who earns in the family and her husband is a drunkard and doesn't have any job at the moment.

She had heard about training through the mobilization efforts of EDII - HCL Foundation. From day one, she was an active learner and learnt the required skills to make jute products. She always showed extra interest to learn new techniques from the trainer and tried lots of design varieties at the training location. Post the training, she joined the group enterprise and have been doing various products to support her livelihood and also to bring up the enterprise. Recently, she was able to produce more than 50 jute file orders and made various products for the local shops. In spite of her hard economic conditions and with a baby child, she is determined in her journey to become a successful entrepreneur.

Their interest in their career did not leave them blank. After having kids, that interest turned into a goal of building their career and helping their family as well. needed to achieve anything. Now they are engaged in all the learning activities and are experiencing the transformation. They are also teaching their kids and are confident that they will make the most of this opportunity.



### **Plastic heist**


Markets are the main distributors of Single-Use Plastic and major producers of plastic waste. Markets and shopping complexes were selected as a key area to run plastic awareness campaign in May. Inspired by the Spanish TV show, Money Heist, Clean NOIDA initiated an open market campaign that included taking away of plastic by individuals wearing the Money Heist costume. On May 7, the campaign was rolled out in popular market places of Noida (Sector 18 market, Ganga market, Godavari market, Brahmaputra market, sector 50 shopping complex). It contributed in heisting away unnecessary plastic with the motto of motivating people to switch to 'zero plastic life or reduce plastic consumption'. The campaign was accompanied by a street play

about out the harmful ways plastic affects us, and social experiments to educate the masses and create an impact. In the process, we reached out to 1,380 citizens and collected 200 kgs of plastic.

This #NoidaPlasticHeist campaign is to educate the masses about responsible use of plastic, and the dangers of overflowing landfills that are full of toxic, non- biodegradable plastic. Through this campaign people were encouraged to recycle waste, boycott plastic bags, and understand micro plastic waste that makes its way into the oceans and the harmful presence of which is felt at different levels in the food chain.






### **Turning a new LEAF**

With the support of HCL Foundation, Access Development Services, organized a three day long skill development and training workshop for SHG members of Barola village, Noida. 15 women participated in this training workshop to develop products specific for local market. This workshop was conducted after a month long market study in and around Noida. The aim is to train women to develop edible products catering to the local markets, ensuring consistent flow of business. The project New LEAF (Livelihood Enhancement of Artisans for Future), is working in hub and spoke model with Noida as spoke and Gurugaon, Khurja and Aligarh as spokes.

# HCL Foundation team members shares her experience Blog by Anjali

There is nothing more satisfying and merrier than seeing the happy faces of children. The three days visit to different NGO partners- CHETNA, Rasta, Katha and Bodh and the interaction with the students at their centers was altogether a new experience.

They are extensively working in support of HCL Foundation under HCL Uday on ground level with children from the underserved community. The life of these children who earn their livelihood or support their family by picking rags, working in industry, selling petty goods, working as domestic servants, and in worst case by begging. HCL Foundation aims to provide education to these children and adopting the best efforts to mainstream them with all possible guidance.

In our visit, we saw the young children of age group 3-15 years. These children were either who are drop-out from school or are pursuing non-formal education or enrolled in school sitting in a room practicing counting and reciting poem. Seeing us, they were so joyful and affectionate.

The similar smiling faces and cheering reactions were seen in different centres of NGOs where students were very keen to learn. When we interacted with students and enquired about their dreams for the future, many different replies came. One of the little girl said, she wants to go in Army, one said I want to earn a lot to feed my parents, one said I wish to go to school for studying.....many different emotions and experiences were attached with different answers.

The best effort was by CHETNA which has an extended program known as 'Nanhe Parinde' that is a mobile van having all equipment and support material like TV screen, books, worksheets, stationery, wash basin, umbrellas, chairs etc. for teaching on the side of road under the tree. They teach students of the migrated community like construction workers, house maids etc. The facilitators primarily ensure that students don't miss their classes and interact with the community members to send their students.

It is very apt to say that education paves the way to have equity and better livelihood conditions. I would like to complement the tremendous work of all NGOs working either in schools or in the community who are preparing the children and developing them for a better life ahead.
