To date, 27,000+ children and young sportspersons have benefited from the programme.

# Disaster Risk Reduction & Management: HCLFoundation's Flood Response

From July 8, 2023, northern India experienced severe rainfall leading to widespread floods in the plains adjacent to the Yamuna river.

HCLFoundation conducted rapid assessment and initiated emergency relief operations with the Civil Administration and local NGO partners, between Sector 94 to Sector 135, NOIDA, Uttar Pradesh.

#### During the response:

5,000+ flood displaced people reached out

150+ animals rescued & treated

1,000+ animals fed

800+ patients reached out through over 15 medical health camps

500+ mosquito nets, soaps, WASH kits and sanitary pads distributed

Teams were also deployed for efficient and proper waste management. The spirit of volunteerism reigned high. Volunteers from HCLTech came forward to contributing their time as part of their Power of One programme. Volunteers from the Clean Noida Volunteer Club (under My Clean City) came forward too – collecting dry food and putting together kits that included sanitary pads, soaps, mosquito repellents, dal, rice and pulses.

And just like that, a 100+ people strong team comprising HCLFoundation employees, NGO partners and volunteers from HCLTech and Noida RWAs collectively supported in the relief operations over the course of 12-14 days.

This edition of the Catalyst features a section called, 'Star Team Member of the Month'. This section narrates stories of grit and of exceptional work of HCLFoundation team members – who went above and beyond their call of duty. Work that deserves to be celebrated and recognized.

One such member is Abhishek Narayanan, Deputy Manager, Animal Welfare, Harit by HCLFoundation – who led (by example!) the Foundation's flood response at Noida in July 2023.

#### Excerpts from an interview:

A Head full of dreams... Abhishek had "dreams of snakes," since his childhood. In his words, "my mother, as advised by relatives and well-wishers even opted for a religious solution to the issue –took me to the temple – to 'take care' of it. Yet here I am – years later – in love with snakes, reptiles and all animals at large!"

#### Background

Abhishek is a Delhi-born, but pursued his Bachelors in Physiotherapy from Maharashtra; then came back to Delhi and landed a job. Not very gratified with a conventional medical degree, three years later, he opted for a Masters in Environment Studies. That, he mentions, marked the start of "passion meeting purpose", adding, "I finally got to do what I loved to do. I joined an NGO working with Animal welfare. In the beginning, I was responding to animal rescue calls. That gave me sufficient contentment." Gradually, I worked with major projects focused on animal welfare, animal-inclusive disaster response, project management and monitoring and such."

# What does 'A day-in-the-life-of Abhishek' at HCLFoundation look like?

The day starts – almost always – early. Mentally mapping out the priorities of the day and beginning animal welfare at home – considering the pets we have. Work is a combination of Animal Welfare, yes, but also project management in a big way. I have started liking

excel sheets and budgeting and data and all things numbers. Indeed, it is this combination of my passion with my work that brings in the purpose. And it gives me more happiness!

#### One big learning.

That children are intrinsically connected to- and drawn to- animals. The 'fear of animals' is what parents pass onto children.

#### A fond memory around animal rescue.

Oh, I remember it distinctly. Our extended team were called upon to rescue a leopard spotted inside a sugarcane field. The field had ripe sugarcane, and had reached heights of 10–12 feet. The leopard was injured too, with its paw caught on the inside of a jaw trap. Funny as it may sound, we (i.e. myself & the veterinarian) scooped up in the 'claw' of a JCB earthmover – entered the field, the driver steering us through the field. The vet successfully darted the leopard, we rescued it, and the operation was a success. It's also memorable for one more reason: I met my future wife here.

Interviewer: How nice! she must have been supporting that rescue op, right? Abhishek: yes.

Interviewer: As the... photographer?

Abhishek: No.

Interviewer: Oh, the area manager?

Abhishek: No. Interviewer: Then?

Abhishek: She was the vet!



Abhishek is based out of Noida where he stays with his wife, Dr. Reetika Maheshwary, Eli (the Dachshund), Mimi & Mimo (their Red-eared slider turtles) and Arya & Sansa (their indie cats, named after the sister duo from the hit American fantasy drama TV series – Game of Thrones)



### Harit School Update, Chennai And Noida



**Nutrition garden** was set up in Avadi government girls school, Chennai with the support of our Environment Education partner TIDE. A garden maintenance calendar was developed in discussion with students for maintaining the garden.

With an aim to educate students on ecological and medicinal value of native trees and also to learn the local and botanical name, **Native tree tagging campaign** was held at three government schools and one police boys and girls club with the support of our environment education Partners, Tree Craze Foundation in Noida and TIDE in Chennai.



140+ students participated

71+ native trees identified and tagged

### Bandenallasandra Lake



**Pre intervention:** A polluted Bandenallasandra lake. Entry of sewage water and other effluents had choked aquatic ecosystem of the lake.

Bandenallasandra Lake covering an area of 28 acres has been rejuvenated in Bengaluru, Karnataka, increasing the lake's water holding capacity to 367,936,000 liters. This lake located close to HCLTech Campus in Jigani, Bengaluru is part of the series of tanks located in Anekal region. Its rejuvenation is crucial for the health of these entire series of lake ecosystems and it will act as hotspot for birds & other

fauna population while supporting the local flora.



## Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation Centre maintenance

Around 12 HCLTech employees volunteered at Bannerghatta Rescue Centre along with our NGO partner Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation Centre. Volunteers helped in upkeep and maintenance of the Centre and also assisted the team in developing outreach materials like wildlife masks etc., The developed materials will be used during the awareness sessions organized by the NGO in the schools located near the periphery of Bannerghatta National Park.





### Income Increase for Farmers from Tomato Cultivation



At a time when the country saw the price inflation of tomato and most consumers have had to change their eating habits to deal with the situation, certain progressive farmers saw this rather optimistically. More than 20 registered farmers associated supported under Samuday programme were able to sell their produce at Rs.40-60/kg which led to an increased income generation for them.

This is the result of Crop Diversification project under Samuday. Earlier most farmers used to cultivate traditional crops on their land and could obtain minimal profits. But dedicating a portion of land to grow vegetables and fruits, their profits have multiplied five times from the same piece of land. The farmers were provided crop advisory, training and demonstration about best farming practices; technical support for crop cultivation; and facilitation on sorting and grading of produce & marketing support thorough collection centers. This has also inspired other nearby farmers to get associated with our project to learn, understand and opt for better technologies, early sowing, and choice of best suited varieties to achieve better profit and price realization for produce.

### Promoting Clean Energy Adoption with Solar User Groups

July saw meeting with the 32 Solar User Groups across 41 villages in Hardoi, under Samuday's village electrification project. The team facilitated discussions about solar energy utilization to meet their electricity needs, sustainability, and reducing their dependence on non-renewable energy sources. Brief, information-packed sessions on safe electricity usage were carried out. The meetings were used to inform and explain benefits of clean energy usage and its social, economic and environment impacts. It also served as a platform to clarify community member's doubts and gather their feedback.



## Marking World Hepatitis Day

On July 28, 2023 i.e. World Hepatitis Day – teams across Samuday aimed to raise awareness about its causes (its symptoms & prevention, and to mark the importance of seeking care and treatment at health facilities) along with trying to reduce misinformation regarding hepatitis & thus eliminate associated stigma. 834 individuals were reached out to in the process.

#### **Learning Kits Distribution**

New batch trainees has received the learning kits during the course induction. Which consists of study material of various course topics.



#### Commencement of Training for New Batch of GDA trade

In response to the growing demand for trained para medical staff at Nagpur, training under the General Duty Assistants trade continued for the current academic session. This year also saw 50 students from marginalized backgrounds enroll into the course. The training sessions commenced at the Besa Yuvakendra, Nagpur.





#### Personal Hygiene Training

After having provided infrastructural support at three NMC schools, the trainings on maintaining proper personal hygiene and cleanliness were conducted for over 150 students from these schools. Special sessions for female students with focus on menstrual hygiene were also conducted.

#### **Tech on Wheels**

Continuing the effort to provide basic computer courses to the students from NMC Schools, batches from three different schools with close to 100 students were enrolled at the Tech on Wheels Bus.



#### **World Youth Skills Day Celebrations**

HCL Yuvakendra in partnership with Bright Light Society at Hyderabad celebrated World Youth Skills Day on July 15, 2023, which saw 90+ youth participate.

HCL Employee volunteers and faculty has interacted with the youth towards a bright career and to grabbing placement opportunities.



#### STEM Sessions at Govt. Schools

Science Sessions were organized along with practical sessions for Govt. High School Students, helping students towards enhancing interest and knowledge in Science and allied subjects. A total of 104 students participated in Science experiments.

#### **Orientation Activities**

The schools reopened after a long summer break of 1.5 months. With our orientation activities, we tried to bring joy and creativity into the classrooms to allow children to get back to the learning process.



#### **World Population Day**

On world population day (11 July), a debate and essay writing competition was done in the schools to allow children to express their thoughts on the given theme "भारत की बढ़ती जनसंख्या -समस्या एवं समाधान"



#### **School Readiness**

Carrying forward with our school readiness process, children of classes 1 and 2 are engaged through HCLFoundation Shiksha video content and worksheets and different creative classroom activities.





#### **Recreational Tour of Eligible Couples**

A Recreational Tour for eligible couples, with a focus on family planning issues, was organized in partnership with VATSALYA. The tour aimed to create a fun and interactive environment where eligible couples could learn, discuss, and make informed decisions regarding their family planning options. A total of 32 eligible couples from intervention slum communities participated in the activity.



#### **Purush Sammelan**

Purush Sammelan was organized on 15th July'23 with the aim of sensitizing males from intervention slum communities about the importance of family planning and encouraging their active participation in family planning initiatives. The event was attended by the Assistant Chief Medical Officer (ACMO) Dr. Vinay Mishra, and the Medical Officer in Charge (MOIC) Dr. Dhirendra, and Dr. Neeraj, who provided valuable insights and guidance to the participants. A total of 53 males participated in the activity.



#### **Cross Learning Visit of Adolescents**

Adolescent girls from intervention communities visited Shankerbaksh Kheda village, Mohanlalganj, and interacted with adolescent group members of the village. During this cross-learning visit, both the group members shared their experiences on the process of group formation, selection of group leader and members, roles, and responsibilities of the group, and the changes brought about by the work of the group. A total of 20 adolescents participated in the activity.



#### **World Population Day and Week**

Mamta HIMC with the support of HCLFoundation organized a myriad of activities with young married couples and married couples – aimed at creating awareness around the benefits of family planning or contraception as well as preventing related health risks in women.

The discussion was done on topics such as contraception methods, its benefits, unwanted pregnancy and effective family planning.

Male participation was ensured in all the activities and Group meetings were also conducted with Pregnant and lactating mothers. Counseling sessions were also done during door-to-door visits.

Linkages were established with ASHA for the supply of family planning methods. A Happy Dampati activity was organized for promoting of male engagement and an increased uptake of Family Planning Services.



#### State Assessment NQAS UCHC Indiranagar

HCLFoundation and Mamta HIMC have been tirelessly working for upgradation work under continuation and strengthening of 5 Health urban health Facilities as per Kayakalp Assessment and NQAS (National Quality Assurance standards) guidelines. In July, State Assessment Team NQAS, assisted one UCHC – Indira Nagar after assessment suggest some improvement as per protocol.

Assessment team selected UCHC Indiranagar for national assessment which is proposed in the month of October 2023.



#### **FLW** training

Mamta HIMC, with the support of HCLFoundation, today organized a training session on breastfeeding at UCHC Khuramnagar. MOIC Dr. Dheerendra Singh and medical personnel discussed the benefits of breast-feeding by role-playing using dolls demonstration technique to FLWs.



#### **Jute Training**

Aawahan The New Voice debuted the Jute development training at the Livelihood And Skill Development Centre. The major objective of the training is to sharpen skill sets and bring out improvement in regular product. This training is being run by National Jute board (NJB), Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India. 12 SHG members from Producer Group (PG) participated in the training and developed jute products, where Master trainer Mr. Puspjit also discussed aspects of marketing and selling process.



#### World Youth Skills Day

On World Youth Skills Day, HCLFoundation and Safe Society team came together to support and uplift our youth – celebrated the talents, potential, and aspirations.



#### **Health Camp for Women**

A Health awareness camp for SHG Members was conducted with support of HCLFoundation by the SAFE Society at Rajkheda, BKT in Lucknow. The camp focused on women's health and had the presence of a gynecologist. Approximately 70 women benefited from the camp.

The primary objective of the camp was to diagnose and address various health issues commonly experienced by women, including urinary tract

infections (UTI), sexually transmitted infections (STI), leucorrhoea, back pain, and pelvic pain during menstruation. The participants were provided with information on preventive measures for these conditions, and free medicines were distributed by the organisation.

Dr. Sunita from the Community Health centre and a representative from the village head were actively involved in the camp.





#### Menstrual Hygiene Management Sessions In **Schools Under Pahal Initiative**

HCLFoundation in partnership with Safe Society successfully completed the first module of Menstrual Hygiene Management Session in 10 schools in Lucknow. During the session, both boys and girls participated in a privilege walk and gained a better understanding of menstruation while dispelling myths. We emphasized the importance of boys to make menstruation as a gender-neutral subject and encouraged a supportive environment for our women and girls.



#### Aspiring Entrepreneurship Workshop (AEW)

A Five-day Aspiring Entrepreneurship Workshop(AEW) was conducted of which 28 Army Veterans took part.. On the culmination day, they presented business plan in groups on ideas such as Organic compost, Poultry farming, Garment shop, RO Business, Dairy farming, etc. made with the help of I-create team. 20 of them signed up for future mentoring. The workshop is designed to promote entrepreneurship and help them in establishing business through a five years continuous process of one-to-one support and mentoring.

#### Supporting 'School Chalo Abhiyan'

It was a moment of joy as III children identified out-of-school were streamlined into the formal schooling ecosystem from Grades Nursery to Class 8 at Gautam Budh Nagar, Noida in partnership with Nanhe Parinde team from Chetna.

The effort is a continuing one towards ensuring that every no child is left behind in receiving formal education.



### DDP Team along with HCLF Team visited Prayatna's ERC at Dadri

Dadri Development Project Team visited Prayatna's Enterprise Resource Center based in Dadri Kalonda village. DDP team participated in an active discussion with the program participants, mobilizers and project coordinators to understand their market-linkage strategy and establishment of ERC.



#### **Learnings from HCLTechies**

Udayan Care Yuvakendra saw a guest session on – How to communicate effectively during group discussions – conducted by HCLTechie Kartik Venkata Mutluru in an activity-based learning method. The session focused on group dynamics & learning and was one among a series of sessions that Kartik undertook to interact with participants – contributing over 7 hours of volunteering.



#### Partner Convergence
