
### HCLTech launches Climate Action Grant in the Americas

HCLTech Climate Action Grant in the Americas was launched on September 19, 2023.

To combat the impact of climate change, HCLTech will grant \$5M over five years to impact-focused, Americas-based not-for-profit organizations to scale and replicate their projects.

The HCLTech Grant has a history of supporting India-based, non-governmental organizations (NGOs) for the last eight years and is now being launched in the Americas to empower NGOs and further scale their grassroots innovation in climate action.

### International Coastal Clean-up Day

HCLFoundation along with NGO partners, HCLTech employee volunteers and community members came together for a community plogathon. A total of 1575 participants across Pattninapakkam beach – Chennai, Ramanathapuram, Gulf of Mannar, Kothapatanam Beach – Vijayawada, Maple Beach – Karnataka; Cherai Beach – Kochi; Penttakotta Beach – Odisha participated in collection of 6,067 kilograms of waste materials. Various activities including street rally, theatre play, sand art were conducted to signify the importance of coastal conservation.



### World Cleanup Day 2023

The World Cleanup Day was observed in a week-long manner – from Sept 11 to 17, 2023. Multiple activities were carried out across different locations.

#### With sanitation workers & residents

Activities included the 3Rs rally, plogging drive, wall art, pledge taking ceremony and more. 2100+ sanitation workers participated in awareness rallies on 3Rs and nearly 100 kgs of dry waste was collected by the Clean Noida Volunteers Club (CNVC) members through plogging drives.

#### With school students

World Clean Up Day was observed on 16 September 2023, with Earth Paradise School and in Godavari Market of Noida city. The day started with a Training and Capacity Building Session with 100+ school children on plastic waste and its impact on environment, followed by collection and donation of 15 kg plastic waste by the school children – which later was sent to a recycling facility.

Post the session, a rally and a cleanliness drive was conducted in two market areas – Jaypuria Plaza and Godavari Market. Approx. 300 kgs of waste was cleaned from the markets and their surrounding areas.



# Observing Poshan Maah (National Nutrition Month)

Samuday by HCLFoundation marked the annual Poshan Maah (National Nutrition Month) with malnutrition screening activities, nutrition camps and multiple awareness generation activities at the Gram Panchayat level. Carrying forward the 'spirit of convergence', Samuday supported the nutrition month through its nutrition, adolescent health, telemedicine, community health projects to cover and propagate the importance of nutrition amongst multiple stakeholders across the lifecycle.





# Star Team Member of the Month



In our pursuit to highlight the human forces at the heart of HCLFoundation's transformative work, this month, we bring to you the incredible journey of Mr.

Umakant Pandey – Senior sector lead of Agriculture and Allied Initiatives at Samuday by HCLFoundation.

Excerpts from an interview – condensed and edited for clarity.

#### Growing from Humble Roots...

Born and raised in a quaint village in Azamgarh, Mr. Umakant Pandey's roots are deeply embedded in agriculture - or as he puts it, "you see, the connection with the soil has always been there". His formative years were spent amidst the lush fields of his village, fostering a profound connection with the land. Pandey's educational journey began right at home, and it wasn't long before he decided to pursue his passion for the natural world graduating with an honors in Botany from DAV PG College, Azamgarh and then at the Forest Research Institute, Dehradun - for a postgraduate degree in Environment Management - an education that would later shape his career.

### A Turning Point and Commitment to Community

In 2003, a pivotal moment altered the course of his life – an opportunity arose to work with a non-governmental organization; and a fellowship from the Embassy of Netherlands – on an

earthquake reconstruction and rehabilitation project in Bhuj. This experience ignited a passion for working with communities and their natural resources. Mr. Pandey shifted his career trajectory from research to community service.

#### No looking back.

Over the years, Mr Pandey's expertise have taken him through various roles – his work has encompassed projects in medicinal plant cultivation, diversified agriculture, and rooftop rainwater harvesting, all of which are tied with the common thread of service to the community.

However it was in 2015, that Mr. Pandey, in his words, "returned to his roots" i.e. the state of Uttar Pradesh, "all thanks to HCL Foundation". He remembers how his recruitment was a swift affair and his journey began with a heartwarming offer letter within a week of his interview!

### Championing Agriculture. Transforming Lives.

When asked of a fond memory, at work that left an impression on him – and he says with pride: Yes, there's one that I remember fondly! It was in 2016, during a community interaction in Hardoi, where Mr. Pandey was present with the then chairman, Mr. Shiv Nadar, where he, as he puts it "witnessed Mr. Nadar's vision first hand. He challenged us to double farmers' incomes while ensuring sustainability." He says with pride how he and the team set out to fulfill this promise – accomplished it – and how it acts as a guiding force even to this day."

It is through the continued innovative practices that he and the team have achieved big; reaching over a lakh households – who are marginal farmers, thus impacting the life of 5 lakh people in the HCLFoundation operation areas.

#### "Sit with the farmer!"

Five years on and a day-in-his-life still revolves around designing community-

focused programs, overseeing their implementation, 'troubleshooting', and providing support, mentorship and quidance to his team. Ask him "Any advice for the younger lot/aspiring professionals, sir?" and he instantly replies, "Sit with the farmer!", stressing the need for hands-on learning and a grounds-up approach. He also recalls seeing the incredible journey of many of his younger team members - most of whom were fresh graduates - who, despite their initial lack of hands-on knowledge, have grown to become formidable agents of change. He says, "empowering one's team is very, very important."

### On work, organizational culture and lifework balance...

Mr. Pandey candidly recalls that simple moment when he knew that his association with HCLFoundation was going to be "a long one!" It was when in the initial days, the senior leadership, including the chairperson, provided us with the flexibility and freedom to design projects based on community needs. He adds, "that freedom was everything. Of course, that did not mean that the ever-important approvals were done away with. They are essential and we would always need them. But it demonstrated the organization's commitment to community-driven initiatives and the liberty to design projects tailored to local needs. That's when I knew this association would be a long one. A fulfilling one. By God's grace it has." Umakant Pandey is Lucknow-based where he stays with his wife and three children - two daughters and one son. Pandey has also recently authored two papers, focusing on reducing pesticide usage and costs in agriculture while promoting natural farming practices - both of which were published in reputed agricultural forums and journals. Umakant loves road trips and long-drives with his family - especially if they're in the hills!



### World Rabies Day

A weeklong awareness campaign on rabies prevention and management followed by Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV) drive was organized across Bengaluru, Chennai, Coimbatore, Noida. 739 free roaming and community owned dogs were administered with Anti-Rabies Vaccines (ARV). 130+ people were sensitized on various paradigms of dog mediated rabies in India and methods to address the issue.



### National Level Youth Climate Leaders' Summit

A two-day National level Youth Climate Leaders' Summit was organized as part Generation for Climate ActioN (GenCAN) initiative in partnership with Centre for Environment Education (CEE). Day 1 saw an engaging dialogue unfold between students and climate experts, including Ms. Heeta Lakhani, Dr. Santanu Basu, and Shri Kartikeya Sarabhai. Interaction provided insights to students on how to proactively engage in climate action in their schools and personal lives. On Day 2, students from various schools discussed about their observations and results they have gathered and analyzed for calculating school carbon footprint.

Over 250 students from different vernacular medium schools across 16 Indian States came together to strategize on adapting to and mitigating the global concern of climate change.



### Dragon Fly walk at Harit Upvan Sorkha

A fascinating dragonfly walk took place at Harit Upvan Sorkha, attracting the curiosity of enthusiastic participants from the community. Attendees had the unique opportunity to observe and learn about these captivating insects – guided by Mr. Ishtiyak Ahamad where this session provided a deeper insight into the world of dragonflies, their ecology, and their crucial role in the ecosystem.







### Adolescent health Anemia Camp inauguration

The Adolescent Health Anemia Camp Kothawan block of Hardoi saw inauguration by Dr. Nidhi Pundhir, Vice President - Global CSR, HCLFoundation on Sept 27. The camp is focused on anemia among school-going adolescent girls.

In her engagement, she carefully understood the elements of the program and implementation

strategy. - actively interacting adolescent girls and motivating them for Iron Folic Acid tablets and moringa supplements along with healthy diet.

Dr. Pundhir also actively interacted with adults, engaging in open discussions about their healthcare needs and concerns.



# 7136 adult learners in New India Literacy Programme

HCLFoundation has successfully facilitated enrollment of 7136 adult learners in NILP\* (New India Literacy Programme) in the month of September 2023. As per NILP, portal data, eight blocks of Samuday intervention area have registered the highest turnout beneficiaries for the exam in Hardoi district. This success is a result of the Sakshar Samuday project through which more than 1,31,000 adults in Hardoi have learnt to read & write, becoming neo-literates.

<sup>\* -</sup> NILP is a govt-led initiative launched in 2022-23 and caters to illiteracy in the age group of 15 years and above. Its objective are to enable learners with increased access to learning certifications, paving way to enhanced confidence in adults of rural India.



### Celebrating cleanliness: Swachh School Mahotsav Highlights

Under the Clean Village project of Samuday, Swachh School Mahotsav was held at S.M.D. College Kachhauna, Hardoi. The event celebrated the efforts of eight primary schools in promoting cleanliness and safe hygiene practices. It further aimed to instil hygiene awareness among students and honoured schools excelling in cleanliness standards.



### Para vets given Training Completion Certificate

19 youth from Hardoi were awarded with the Para vet Training Completion certificate. They completed a 45-day classroom and practical training at Uttarakhand Livestock Development Board and a 45-day on-field training under the supervision of Samuday's veterinary team. These skilled youths are now deployed in our project area as Artificial Insemination technicians and have started giving the services to dairy animals, owned by the dairy farmers supported through Samuday. In addition to impacting animal health and productivity, this upskilling has also led to gainfully employing youth and facilitating a sustainable source of income.



# Samuday team participates in the inauguration ceremony

On 19th September, Samuday participated in the inauguration ceremony of Rashtriya Poshan Maah, a month-long event to mark the importance of proper nutrition and acting on its various determinants with focus on convergence.

#### Case Story of Yuvakendra trainee

Ms. Naga Lakshmi attended government residential school, consistently achieving high marks and nurturing ambitious aspirations for her future. However, her parents arranged her marriage soon after she completed her graduation. Subsequently, she became a mother of two children, dedicating five years to tending to her family's well-being. Yet, her desire for employment and independence persisted.

Though her husband supported her, her in-laws discouraged her from pursuing work outside the home. One day, she encountered about Grow program, and she convinced her husband that she could contribute financially to the family without any upfront fees. Undeterred, she exhibited exceptional dedication, commuting 60 kilometers daily for training sessions. Her routine began at 4 am, encompassing household responsibilities before heading to work. She returned home at 8:30 pm. Her relentless efforts culminated in a monthly income of INR 15,000, which she diligently saved for her children's education.

With unwavering faith in the HCLF Yuvakendra programme, Ms. Naga Lakshmi even referred a relative, who successfully completed the training and secured a position at Paradise.






# Online Learning Sessions by Academy
