



## Key outcomes of HCLTech Grant 2023 Pan India Symposiums


- The C20 (Civil 20 India 2023) initiatives align with SDG No.1 and support the G20's goal of inclusive and sustainable growth.

# Promoting climate resilient agriculture in forest fringe villages of Sundarbans!

#### Visit to Lokmata Rani Rashmoni Mission:

- HCLTech Grant visited Deulbari and Purba Gurguria villages of Kultali block of South 24 Parganas for the field monitoring visit of Lokmata rani Rashmoni Mission, HCLTech Grant Finalist 2022, Environment Category. The programme participants have set up Nutritional Gardens in the backyard of their homes and are producing organic vegetables and selling the surplus.
- Poultry farming and goat rearing has been followed by the beneficiaries as the alternative source of income.
- One common facility centre has also been set up in which one rice mill and two other machines for the production of rice, chilli dust, turmeric dust, flour and more, have been procured with the support of HCLFoundation.
- Team also visited the in house laboratory that has been set up in one of the villages where farmers are preparing their own bio-fertilizers in their fields without spending additionally.





#### Project Intervention had let to the set-up of:

- 100 Nutrition Garden
- Utilization of 01-hectare underutilized land
- 80 farmers involved in 'No-to Inorganic Agriculture (NIA)' using 5.7 hectares of land

I was in complete disbelief when I first learnt about domesticating (indigenous) bees in a beebox but when I attended the practical training I was in complete awe. Honey bees are our assurance for better crop produce and I am completely committed to conserve them now. I have started looking at bees beyond honey now, I know they (bees) are important for environment and ecosystems so I have befriended them."

# Association of People with Disability, HCLTech Grant Recipient 2022

The bravest hearts are the closest to God...

"Every teenager fantasizes about attending the college of his dreams and choosing his own path in life. Every youngster waits for the day when he will have his parents' permissions for hanging out, going on picnics, and stay up late studying with his peers. My interests and preferences, however, always varied while I was a teenager. My parents used to say I was way more mature than the kids of my age. But it's always about the situations and circumstance that mold you into the person you are destined to be. One day, despite my mother's disapproval I decided to go to a nearby temple early in the morning in my bicycle, and unfortunately, I met with and accident that took a huge toll on me mentally and physically

It was very shattering for me when I learnt that

devoted and inspiring mother always needed my concern, so I couldn't just sit back and cry. She has always been through all my thick and thin. When she learned of my diagnosis, she was able to control her emotions, but I know that deep down she was inconsolable. My maternal uncle made me understand that I needed rehabilitation. Within two months of receiving rehabilitation treatments after being referred to The Centre for Spinal Cord Injury Rehabilitation and Research of Association of People with Disability (APD), Bangalore, I had mastered most of the self-management abilities. I however encountered several complications which were expertly managed by a holistic approach of the professionals in the APD.

I have injured my spinal cord and I will be wheelchair bound for the rest of my life. My





I was the youngest of all the individuals receiving rehabilitation at the facility, and everyone was constantly in awe of my acceptance and positive perspective toward my altered and enhanced talents. I've been inspired continually by everyone around me who now recognize my potential to excel in para-sports. My ideal peer trainer in APD is Mr. Kantharaj, a para-athlete who has always been there to mentor and assist me.

I will shortly be taking my board examination, and I am so grateful to my mother for making sure that both my new school and house are accessible to those in wheelchairs. Since it's common knowledge that God gives his harshest conflicts to his strongest soldiers, therefore I am content knowing that I can still set a very high standard for society. I'm Saidarshan, a 17- year-old young gentleman who will adapt to this new existence in a different way and become the survivor who helps others and benefits this society."



# Language and Learning Foundation, HCLTech Grant Recipient, 2022

Mr. Mahendra Kumar Mandami, a CAC (Cluster Academic Coordinator) of the Lohandiquda block's Badrenga cluster, has participated in the five-day ToT workshop as a DRG teacher in Language and Learning Foundation's Multi Lingual (MLE) Programme. Mr. Mandami has 15 years of teaching experience and has been working as a CAC for the last three years. Bastar is his native place and he is very close to the culture and loves to speak in his mother tongue. That's also one of the big reasons that he is sensitive about education in his mother tonque. Mr. Mandami actively participated in the ToT and led numerous discussions during the fiveday workshop, demonstrating his interest in MLE. He brought up his previous classroom experiences in the workshop where the teacher did not understand the child's language. He was convinced about the importance of the MLE in the Bastar district after the various brainstorming sessions in the workshop. He also encouraged other DRG members to participate in group discussions and presentations. He led the group discussions, presented charts, and demonstrated the MLE processes and learnt that as a DRG teacher he has to ensure active participation in block-level training and that, as a CAC, he needs implement MLE education in his cluster
