Operationalization of Center for Upholding Human Animal Relationships (CEN-UPHAR)

We are proud to announce the operationalization of Center for Upholding Human Animal Relationships (CEN-UPHAR) in Noida, Uttar Pradesh, India.

CenUPHAR is a groundbreaking animal welfare center developed in partnership with the Greater Noida Industrial Development Authority (GNIDA).

From sterilization of community animals in Greater Noida, to community awareness and compassion building programs for schools, colleges, and Residents' Welfare Associations (RWAs), this center caters to it all. Our center is equipped with various facilities: an Operation Theatre, Dog Kennels (including isolation kennels), activity hut for carrying out awareness workshops, animal food preparation room, a working office and a meeting room. Additionally, a basic working laboratory and a biomedical waste incinerator are currently under pipeline.

The event was attended by Dr. Nidhi Pundhir, Senior Vice President of Global CSR at HCLTech and Director, HCLFoundation, Mr. Indu Prakash, OSD GNIDA, Mr. Bharti, OSD, GNIDA, Mr. Gaurav Baghel, GNIDA and Dr. AK Dwivedi from the Chief Veterinary Office, Gautam Buddha Nagar. HCLFoundation signs MoU with UPNEDA

Samuday by HCLFoundation has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Uttar Pradesh New and Renewable Energy Development Agency (UPNEDA) in Lucknow to promote solar energy projects in rural Uttar Pradesh. Under this partnership, the Foundation will assist UPNEDA in managing 40 solar mini-grids across the state, building on the success of 32 mini-grids established in Hardoi district, that have been providing reliable electricity to 41 villages. This collaboration also aims to support the development of 75 solar villages across 75 districts in UP, furthering the program's commitment to renewable energy and sustainable rural development.

The MoU was exchanged by Shri Anupam Shukla (IAS), Director, UPNEDA, and Mr. Alok Varma, Project Director - Samuday & My Clean City, HCLFoundation, in the presence of Mr. Rakesh Agarwal, Senior Program Officer, UPNEDA.



Supporting Flood Victims of Typhoon Yagi

Typhoon Yagi, known in the Philippines as Severe Tropical Storm Enteng, was a deadly and extremely destructive tropical cyclone which impacted Southeast Asia and South China in early September 2024. It had severely impacted the Northern Vietnam areas, one of which is Lao Cai province, triggering landslides and causing significant damage to communities. Many families lost their homes and possessions. HCLTech Vietnam called for urgent support to help them recover and were able to voluntarily collect:

HCLFoundation at the International Conference on Sustainable Urban Water Management for Fast Growing Cities

Our research, "Groundwater and Beyond: Sustainable Solutions for Water Body Rejuvenation in Gautam Buddha Nagar, India' has been presented in the International Conference on Sustainable Urban Water Management for Fast Growing Cities', sponsored by Dept. of Science and Technologies, Government of India and organized by AMU, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, and BITS Pilani Hyderabad. Our work, co-authored by Dr. Nidhi Pundhir, Dr. Santanu Basu, Ankit Kumar, and Shahbaz Anwar, garnered appreciation for its real-world applicability, with particular acknowledgment of HCL Foundation's impactful contribution. Our presentation has won the Best Paper Presentation Award! Furthermore, a €200 voucher presented to HCLFoundation by Springer Nature in appreciation of the quality of research conducted. This conference was dignified with the presence of 100+ participants from IITs, NITs, international universities and corporates.







Dr. Nidhi Pundhir was a keynote speaker at CSR & ESG Summit 2024 held in New Delhi on the topic 'Creating a Shared Future: Sustainable Cities & Thriving Villages'. She emphasized on three pillars – PPP Model, Citizen Engagement & Behavioral Change and Technology led Innovation for achieving the same.

Dr. Nidhi Pundhir discussed the Sports for Change initiative, emphasizing how 'our focus is on enriching lives of young athletes and bringing them out of the circle of poverty in one generation, and not just increasing medal counts'. She further stressed the need for bringing in private sector efficiencies in India's sports federations, alongside a distinguished panel featuring Sara Abdullah Pilot, Hakimuddin Habibullah, and more – moderated by Sonali Chander.



Gaurav Majumdar, represented HCLFoundation at the Rountable on Shaping Children's Future in India organised by UNICEF. Several think-tank organisations and INGOs attended the meeting and deliberations about the overall ecosystem development and strategies for engagement towards the 2030 goals. Meeting was chaired by UNICEF India Representative Ms. Cynthia McCaffrey and Leila Pakkala, Director UNICEF supply division.



In a world of 'social impact', Vineet Kumar Mishra, Senior Manager, Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) at HCLFoundation, stands out as someone who thrives on 'making every effort count'. This month, we celebrate Mishra ji's(as he is fondly called by his colleagues) incredible journey – his commitment to driving meaningful change, and his role in shaping HCLFoundation's path toward robust, measurable outcomes and impact.

Excerpts from an interview – edited and condensed for clarity.



Rooted in values: A childhood that inspired change

Born in Gorakhpur and raised in a joint family steeped in education and inclusivity, Vineet's upbringing was – in his words "the perfect foundation" for his future. How so? Vineet goes on, "Take for instance, my grandfather. As a principal, he ensured education was accessible to everyone, often waiving fees for students who couldn't afford them," Vineet shares with pride, adding, "People like him then do not have to imbibe or teach lessons to their children/grandchildren. They lead by example and just like that – become role models!"

"Your question has prompted me to reflect on how fortunate I was to have grown up in an environment where every individual's potential was nurtured, irrespective of challenges," he tells the interviewer. We speak of inclusivity today, but I saw exemplary inclusivity way back: a differently-abled aunt rose to become a school principal – right in my family – in a small town! This is not just the backdrop of my life – it is the compass that guides me – till date."

From bytes to bridges | Devt Sector - "by choice"

Not many know this, but Vineet's professional journey began conventionally as a SAP consultant in the Tech industry. However, something was missing. "I felt restless—I wanted to contribute beyond systems and processes. My heart lay in creating change at the grassroots level," he explains.

Encouraged by an article on rural management during his engineering years, Vineet decided to switch paths. Despite initial challenges convincing his family about the leap into an unconventional career, Vineet went on to pursue an MBA in Rural Management from Xavier Institute of Management, Bhubaneswar. "It was a bold move, but I wanted to join the development sector by choice, not by chance," he emphasizes.

Measuring what matters: The science of M&E (& hello, HCLFoundation!)

Vineet's dedication bore fruit when he joined HCLFoundation in 2018 as an M&E Officer. (Thanks to a job opening he was informed of by Priyta, his wife.) Over the years, he's grown into a senior managerial role, building frameworks that ensure the Foundation's projects deliver sustainable, measurable impact.

Ask Vineet how he would explain what he does for a living to a child, and he says almost immediately, "You see, M&E isn't just about data—it's about accountability and outcomes that ultimately transform lives. Imagine this: we're spending resources to uplift communities. My role is to ensure we know exactly how those efforts are creating change," he explains.

Clearly, his approach to M&E is rooted in rigor and transparency. He focuses on designing SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Time-bound) indicators. "For example, it's not enough to say we've reached 10,000 children. What matters is how their learning outcomes have improved or how enrollment rates have increased," he elaborates.

"How else do you think Foundation's commitment to meaningful, long-term change is ensured?," Vineet asks rhetorically but with a smile.



Without waiting for a reply he goes on, "You simply have to be meticulous - so that every project—whether in education, health, or livelihood—delivers on its promise."

Balancing acts: "Life is all about balancing - all the time" A father of two, Vineet's philosophy on work-life balance is refreshing. "Parenting, for us, is not an extra task—it is seamlessly integrated into our daily lives," he shares, adding, "Whether it's involving our children in morning routines or teaching by example, we need to very consciously bring the same focus and discipline to our personal lives as we do to our professional roles."

In the same breath, Vineet say, "Yes, life is about balancing – all the time", but also credits his ability to juggle responsibilities to better half Priyta and his supportive family. He also feels what has worked for him is 'staying present'. "When I'm at work, I give it my all, ensuring there's no spillover into family time," he says, adding that this discipline helps him achieve peace of mind in both spheres.

Memorable moment

"One of the most inspiring experiences was meeting leaders like Kapil Dev and Roshni Nadar in person during the initial HCLTech Grant events. Their stories, their vision were eyeopening," he recounts.

He also mentions how he and his peers have, "witnessed the evolution of the development sector - from charity-driven initiatives to data-backed, strategic programs. Dr. Nidhi [Pundhir] always says and I agree that the introduction of scientific frameworks in CSR have been a game-changer. Today, projects are more accountable and impactful."

Advice for aspiring changemakers?

To those aspiring to join the development sector, Vineet has clear advice: "Know your passion and commitment. This field demands more than just interest—it requires a deep

connection to the cause." He urges young professionals to embrace the sector's scientific approach and think strategically. "The development space has evolved; it's no longer about vague goals. It's about delivering measurable outcomes and making a tangible difference," he says.

Oh, the bonds we make!

Of course, the milestones, impact successes and memories are both personal and professional validations for Vineet and his decision to pursue a career in development, however Vineet's time at HCLFoundation isn't all about frameworks and reports—it's also about camaraderie!

How?

Vineet fondly recalls the hilarious moments during team meetings to shared laughs over classic Bollywood references: "One time, during a meeting, a colleague used a scene from Andaz Apna Apna to lighten the mood. It was spot-on, and we just couldn't stop laughing – for straight 10 minutes!" he recalls. He then adds, "a supportive, fun work environment is just as crucial as impactful work."

Interviewer: Was it Robin Thomas? Vineet: You are damn right!

Vineet is based in Noida, where he resides with his family, now joyfully expanded with the recent arrival of his baby girl – just a month old. A fan of The Pursuit of Happyness, Vineet picks mountain retreats over the beachside. Known among colleagues as a "news junkie," he's the go-to person for timely WhatsApp updates on breaking, big, or noteworthy events! True to his roots, Vineet prefers a steaming cup of desi chai over coffee and finds solace in a comforting homecooked thali, complete with dal, rice, vegetables – and dahi!

The event commenced with a briefing of the importance of wildlife conservation and biodiversity preservation, followed by an immersive exploration of the local ecosystem, facilitated by NGO partner members.



Environment awareness sessions with 'Harit Club' students in Noida

Harit Club students from various government schools and Police Commissionerate in Gautam Buddha Nagar were a part of various environmental education and awareness sessions. Under the Theme "Save Insects, Save Birds" of World Migratory Birds Day students made feeders and water pots from recycled materials for birds. In addition, through interactive games and handson activities, students discovered the value of watersaving and reuse practices. These immersive experiences are but a nudge to encourage them to adopt water-conscious habits at home and ultimately foster a ripple effect of environmental stewardship within their families and community.



Seed Collection Drive at Thiruvannamalai Hills

A team of 10, including community members, students, and volunteers, came together for a three-day seed collection drive in the scenic Thiruvannamalai Hills. The hills, known for their dense forests, rare tree species, and medicinal herbs, provided the perfect environment for this effort. With the support and permission of the Forest Department, the team collected over 20 different seed species and plant cuttings for grafting. These treasures have now been carefully sown in mother beds at the Adavi Nursery to nurture future greenery.





Wildlife Week Volunteering Activities in Bengaluru

As part of the National Wildlife week celebrations three parallel volunteering events were conducted in collaboration with our NGO Partners.

To give the activity a holistic approach the events covered various aspects of conservation:

- Know the biodiversity around: An assisted nature walk at Govindapura reserve forest with our NGO Partner SayTrees. The nature walk was followed by an exploratory biodiversity survey where the volunteers learned methods to identify bird, insects and plant species around them and also learnt about survival mechanisms birds, butterflies and insects do to escape their natural predators. And concluded the session with a discussion of the things they learnt about biodiversity.
- Contribute: A visit to ARRC, Sonnenahalli Village.
 Where the volunteers understood how the
 rescue and rehabilitation of urban wildlife works
 and helped build double door mesh to make the
 enclosures for the rescue animals.
- Educate others: An awareness rally with our NGO
 Partner WRRC. Which started from Bannerghatta
 Zoological Park to the village panchayat. The
 rally was to address the issue of glue traps used
 in agricultural fields and how it affects the native
 biodiversity. It was followed by an awareness
 session on the drawbacks of glue traps and
 alternative methods which can replace them.

HCLFoundation schools under GenCAN celebrates International Day of Climate Action

On October 24, Generation for Climate Action (GenCAN) schools celebrated the International Day of Climate Action at multiple HCL locations including Lucknow, Chennai, Nagpur, Bengaluru and Hardoi. A series of awareness sessions on climate change through quiz, skit, poster making, elocution were conducted.



Animal Welfare Convergence Workshop

8 NGO partners working on the theme of Animal Welfare joined the Harit team from different locations. The participants included leadership teams, project coordinators and Veterinarians from the partner NGO offices

- On Day 1, Partners presented their work done in collaboration with HCLFoundation followed by a tour of the ARRT rehabilitation center and set the base discussion for developing a successful compassion building campaign.
- On Day 2, along with a tour of the Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation Center the partners ideated and discussed multiple outreach strategies in developing the compassion building campaign. Second half was spent in visiting CUPA's spay and

- neuter Center which included a tour of the center followed by a discussion of case studies which the NGO Partners experienced in their projects which facilitated cross learning and sharing good practices followed by the organizations.
- On Day 3, workshop at Bengaluru concluded with a session on developing SOPs for data collection, monitoring and management related to Animal Welfare with Dr. Harish Kumar Tiwari from IIT Guwahati. This was followed by an online session with Dr. Santanu Basu and then a discussion with Dr. Zaman on creating a module with best practices followed by partners who have projects on Animal birth control.





Celebrating excellence in sports in Hardoi: Felicitation Program for teachers, and Investiture Ceremony for athletes

At a recent Felicitation Program on October 3rd, 37 sports school teachers and coaches were honored for their contribution towards various competitions led by the GoUP and HCLFoundation in Hardoi district of Uttar Pradesh. Held at HCLFoundation's Sandila office, the event was graced by esteemed guests including Mr. Vijay Pratap Singh, (Basic Shiksha Adhikari, Hardoi), Mr. K.B Awasthi (District Physical President of Athelics & Kho-Kho) and Ms Shinla Singh (District Physical Secretary of Athletics & Rifle Club), who fostered discussions around sports achievements and future improvements.

In a simultaneous event celebrating young athletes, the upper primary school in Itara, Pihani block of Hardoi district, held an investiture ceremony for its house groups. HCLFoundation presented athletes with sports kits as part of their participation in the Sports for Change competition. Both events aimed to highlight the role of sports in community development.



HCLFoundation continues educational support to 146 Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBV) in UP

Following the successful Digital Literacy, Coding Skills and Computational Thinking (DLCC) and Artificial Intelligence (AI) training of 133 teachers in 146 KGBVs across 156 blocks in Uttar Pradesh, HCLFoundation is moving to the next phase by providing ongoing support to Samuday's educational interventions. Motivating teachers, raising awareness among students, ensuring technical functionality, assisting with software installations, and demonstrating UPOER, an Open Education Resource portal usage are part of several efforts led by the Foundation. Through the curriculum, students are also learning block-based coding on Scratch platform, while 163 teachers were introduced to basics of computers like MS paint, MS office. Networking and Internet. So far, HCLFoundation has reached 29 KGBVs in Lucknow, Raebareli, Lakhimpur Kheri, Fatehpur, Kausambi, Prayagraj, Unnao, Hardoi and Pratapgrah Districts.



Swachh Bharat Diwas engages community members to promote cleanliness

Swachh Bharat Diwas 2024 was organized on 2nd October at the I.R. Inter College in Sandila, marking the conclusion of the "Swachhta Hi Sewa (SHS)" campaign. A rally engaging school students, teachers, HCLFoundation members, and local community leaders passed through key areas of Sandila, with a goal to raise awareness around cleanliness, waste management, and environmental responsibility in the community.

With a total of 93 participants, the program served as a motivational platform for community members to sustain their efforts in environmental conservation.



Shramdaan and Swachhata Pledge taken at Kachhauna Patseni

A cleanliness initiative under the Swachha Nagar Pariyojana was held at Kachhauna Patseni on 2nd October. Celebrating the spirit of Gandhi Jayanti, the activities focused on promoting Mahatma Gandhi's ideals of cleanliness and community participation in waste management. With a total of 285 participants, the initiative aimed to engage students, volunteers and local residents in a cleanup activity, focusing on collecting litter, particularly plastic waste. Each participant was also provided with biodegradable bags and gloves to facilitate the cleanup.

As the event came to a close, participants gathered to take the Swachhata pledge, and committed to keeping their homes, workplaces, and public spaces clean. They also vowed to reduce plastic usage, segregate waste at home, and inspired others to join the movement.



Integrated Solid Waste Management Initiative Launched for 3 ULBs in Hardoi, Uttar Pradesh

On 10th October 2024, HCLFoundation and CDC Trust partnered to launch a new initiative addressing integrated solid waste management (SWM) across three urban local bodies (ULB) of the Hardoi district, namely Mallawan, Beniganj and Kacchauna. The meeting emphasized forming ward level committees, hiring Swachh Mithras, and engaging green friends for effective project implementation.

This solid waste management project will aim to transform the ULBs into model areas for sustainable waste management and community-led environmental stewardship. Key efforts will include mass awareness campaigns on waste segregation, collection, and disposal, with active involvement from the ULBs officials, local communities and government departments.



A collaborative Initiative for Model Villages in Hardoi District

HCLFoundation and the Institute of Development Management have collaborated on a new project with a goal to address challenges around integrated solid waste management across seven Gram Panchayat's in Hardoi district of Uttar Pradesh. Activating the Resource Recovery Centre (RRC), the partnership aims to foster active participation of community members, Gram Panchayat representatives, and key government departments to ensure the effective implementation of integrated solid waste management solutions. By embedding these practices at the grassroots level, the project will promote cleaner communities, focused on reducing the environmental footprint and improving overall quality of life in the district.



Model Health Facility at Samuday celebrates World Mental Health Day

The Model Health Facility under Samuday by HCLFoundation observed World Mental Health Day on 10th October by conducting various sensitization and counselling sessions on the importance of mental health for patients, adolescents and healthcare workers. Sessions were held at various locations including government schools, Community Health Centre Sandila, Primary Health Centre Tikari and Sub Centre Raiso, witnessing a total participation of 219 beneficiaries.



VidyaGyan students' Summer Exposure visit to Hardoi

Students from VidyaGyan – an initiative by Shiv Nadar Foundation, visited several of Samuday's interventions as part of their institute's Summer Exposure Visit. A total of 42 students from Sitapur campus joined Hardoi to gain a deeper understanding of the interventions around holistic rural development. Some of the interventions visited included Crop Diversification, Primary School, Handicraft, Milk Chilling Plant, Overhead Tanks, Pond Rejuvenation, Telemedicine Centre & Panchayat Bhawan.



NQAS certification achieved for three public health facilities in Hardoi

Under the quality accreditation of public health facilities program, three facilities supported through Samuday by HCLFoundation, namely Som, Sandila Ayushman Arogya Mandir (AAM), Pihani Community Health Center (CHC) and Kothawan CHC received their NQAS (National Quality Assurance Standards) certification on Oct 1, 18th and 20th respectively. The facilities were accredited for successfully fulfilling the required criteria for certification.



Nikshay Diwas organized in Hardoi

Samuday by HCLFoundation organized Nikshay Diwas under its TB Elimination project on 11th, 12th, 15th and 16th of October across two blocks of Sandila and Ahirori in Hardoi district. During the event, anthropometry of 556 tuberculosis patients was conducted, and patients were offered counseling on the disease, importance of nutrition and value of treatment adherence.



TB Awareness activities and antistigma campaigns in Hardoi

Tuberculosis (TB) awareness activities and anti-stigma campaigns were held at 57 locations in Sandila and Ahirori blocks of Hardoi district through the month of October as part of HCLFoundation TB Elimination Project. More than 15,000 residents were educated on signs and symptoms of TB and the importance of timely treatment. With a goal to reduce stigma and encourage early diagnosis, activities were conducted across schools, madrasas, community centers, and health facilities using interactive discussions, posters, and educational materials to engage the community.



Anemia screening of 16,000 adolescents under Kuposhan Mukt Gram Panchayat

Under Samuday's Adolescent Health Anemia Program in Hardoi, 16,000 adolescents across 4 blocks of Hardoi were screened for their Hemoglobin levels to estimate their anemia status. Young adults from 100 schools will receive follow up sessions over 3 months to ensure adequate IFA (Iron Folic Acid) and Moringa consumption. They will also be offered counselling sessions.



Community events in Hardoi attended by 1,000 residents

Various community level events were held throughout October across 4 Gram Panchayats of Hardoi district, namely Kothawan, Behender, Sandila and Kachhauna. These included mothers meetings, group discussions, Interpersonal communication sessions, adolescents meeting, ASHA, ANM and Anganwadi workers meeting. Attended by 1,000+ residents, themes of discussion included anemia, malnutrition, nutrition, hygiene, breast and complimentary feeding and changes during adolescent age.



Over 1,000 children screened for nutrition status at home-based nutrition camp

Children of residents in Sandila, Behender, Kothawan and Kachhauna blocks of Hardoi between age group of 6 months to 5 years were screened to monitor their nutrition status. Of the total 11,272 children screened, 926 were identified as severely malnourished, who were then admitted for 14 days to be part of the home-based nutrition camp organized by HCLFoundation. Post the camp, children are set to receive consistent follow up over 5 months to monitor growth.





Kisan Mela Goshti held at CATT in Sandila

The Kisan Mela Goshti was organized on 28th October at the Center for Agriculture and Technology Transfer (CATT) in Sandila. The event brought together farmers, government officials, and the HCLFoundation team for an enriching day of knowledge exchange and practical demonstrations.

Deputy Director of Agriculture, District of Hardoi, GoUP, Dr. Nand Kishore, along with other government officials present, promoted sustainable agriculture practices, focused on controlling crop residue burning and raised awareness about various government schemes around farmer welfare. Interactive sessions encouraged farmers to discuss challenges and gain valuable insights, underscoring the collective commitment towards advancing local agriculture.



Samuday's handicraft expansion across ten districts of Uttar Pradesh

Samuday by HCLFoundation conducted assessments in Chaka and Bahadurpur blocks of Prayagraj district from 15th to 18th October, interacting with district officials, local artisans, and stakeholders. The team assessed the existing natural fiber-based handicraft clusters, observing craft-making skills among local artisans for expansion. Through collaboration with district officials, Samuday aims to create sustainable support systems, enhance livelihoods, preserve cultural crafts, and empower communities. This is a significant step towards building a resilient handicraft ecosystem in UP.



Dairy Farmer Associations convene for profit distribution at Annual General Body Meeting in Sandila

Priyanka's Journey to Overcoming Educational Barriers

Priyanka, from Barkheda village, embodies resilience in the face of adversity. Born into a family of modest means with four daughters and three sons, Priyanka's early education journey was marked by hope but also great hardship. She successfully passed her 8th standard in 2016, but her dreams of continuing education were crushed by her family's financial struggles and the long distance between her village and the nearest secondary school. By 2018, Priyanka had no choice but to drop out.

Her story took a pivotal turn in July 2021 when CRY-HCL began identifying children in her village who had dropped out of school. When the team approached Priyanka, she expressed a strong desire to resume her studies, but her family's financial limitations made this seem impossible. Priyanka was soon linked with the adolescent group, where she participated in life skills sessions and engaged in sports, helping her regain confidence. The project team also counseled her parents, helping them see the value of education and convincing them to support Priyanka's aspirations subsequently getting her admitted to School.

Priyanka faced further challenges, including preparing for her exams without adequate resources and a delay in receiving her results. In her first attempt at the 10th standard exams in 2022, Priyanka unfortunately failed, a blow that might have discouraged many. However, with unwavering encouragement from the CRY-HCL team, she re-enrolled in NIOS (National Institute of Open Schooling) in 2023, determined to succeed. In July 2024, Priyanka's hard work paid off as she passed her 10th standard exams. The joy her success brought to her family was immense, and more importantly, it marked a significant moment for her community. Priyanka's achievement has opened doors not only for herself but also for other girls in her village who now see that education is within their reach. Priyanka dreams of becoming a fashion designer, a career that reflects her creativity and determination. She enjoys drawing, mehndi design, and fashion, and she's eager to use her talents to make a positive impact on other girls like herself.

The project aims to upskill unemployed and under-skilled youth, wherein reaching 150 students per session.




Mobile Robotics Training Programme

Social empowerment of women through counselling

The Counseling Center addressed a total of 42 cases, consisting of new, old, and Tele counselling. Among these, there were 18 new cases physical, and 16 old physical cases and 8 Tele new cases. Additionally, 241 Tele follow-up sessions were conducted via telephone counselling, along with 14 new cases reported. The predominant issues reported encompassed husband harassment, wife harassment, alcoholism, dowry, mother-in-law problems, and property disputes. The center's pivotal role in addressing these pressing concerns underscores its importance in providing essential support to individuals and families in need.





America

In late October, our dedicated volunteers from HCI Tech Poland have been hard at work at the Food Bank in Krakow - diligently sorting tons of food and hygiene products. These weighed and sorted donations are destined to reach the most needy residents of Krakow, including those recently affected by the flood.
