With India Health Action Trust (IHAT), Child Rights and You (CRY), and The Corbett Foundation (TCF) – winners of the HCLTech Grant in Health, Education, and Environment, the visit provided a first-hand experience of the transformative impact these initiatives have had on the communities they serve.xtension for Community Healthcare Outcomes (ECHO) India, won the Best Practices Award in the #Health Category.

#### **Inauguration of Nanhe Parinde Vans**

The 'Nanhe Parinde' project was launched today at the Mahanagar Police Station, and a special inauguration ceremony was also held at the HCLTech Campus. The project, launched by the Lucknow Police Commissionerate, HCLFoundation, and CHETNA NGO, aims to provide education to underprivileged children. Three mobile education vans will be operated at 12 locations in Lucknow, equipped with various educational tools, including chairs, desks, books, libraries, sports equipment, and worksheets. The vans are also equipped with CCTV cameras, TVs, and speakers. Each van will have two teachers, a driver, and a helper, who will provide education to the children. The project aims to benefit around 600 children who are unable to attend school due to various reasons.

Some leaders carve their path with strategy, others with passion—Gaurav blends them both effortlessly. His journey has not been a straight road, but a compelling narrative of grit, ingenuity, bold turns and impact.

Excerpts from an interview – edited and condensed for clarity.

# Star Team Member

#### Rooted in values: Early life and education

Born in Renukoot, a small town in Sonebhadra, Uttar Pradesh, and raised in Varanasi - Gaurav grew up in an environment shaped by movement and adaptability. As Gaurav notes in his signature, jovial way, "this was all thanks to Baba! It was his job with UP Power Corporation - a transferable job that required him to be stationed near the power substation. And with him - all of us! My mother, elder sister and I. Therefore, even after we moved to Banaras my schooling [which happened at Hermann Gmeiner School (part of SOS Children's Village)] - happened where it did because it was the only school in the vicinity to my father's official accommodation - at the outskirts of the city!" Gaurav tone immediately saw a shift to seriousness as he says, "But you know what, when I look back and think, it was this very initial exposure - where resilience, inclusivity, and community-building were ingrained in daily life. This might as well have ended up laying the foundation for my work today."

#### A man of many 'firsts'

Academically, Gaurav evolved from, in his words, "a mediocre student" to one who "chartered his own course." Despite initial expectations to pursue engineering, he realized his passion lay elsewhere. After a Bachelors in Information Technology and a brief, unsuccessful attempt to crack competitive exams, Gaurav finally earned his first 'first' – a MBA in Rural Management from KIIT School of Rural Management, Bhubaneswar (where he was silver medalist). He later pursued a second masters – Master of Public Administration (MPA) at the Illinois Institute of Technology, Chicago, deepening his understanding of social impact and policy-making.

"I'd be remiss not to mention the incredible professors who shaped my journey—especially Prof. T. Kumar.", says Gaurav, adding, "You know the kind—always approachable, ready to help you make sense of just about anything under the sun? That was him. He played a huge role in shaping my understanding of the development world. And life." (Fun fact: Prof. Kumar also taught Vineet Mishra, our M&E lead, our Star Team member from October 2024. Clearly, his lectures come with an unofficial quarantee of making it to this section!)

Gaurav goes on; noting with equal measure of pride and humility - "I've been the first in my family to pursue a non-conventional MBA; first to travel abroad and earn a second masters, and," he pauses momentarily before finishing his sentence with a smile, "first to have a 'love marriage!"

#### From classrooms to forever: Love, choices, and leaps of faith!

While Gaurav was navigating the world of rural development, he also discovered something just as profound—love. He met his now-wife, Shrabani, during their time at KIIT University, and their bond quickly grew. Such was their connection that when prestigious placements (*Gaurav took names, but sorry we shan't publish them!*) came knocking, they made the bold decision to put love over ambition.

As Gaurav further narrates his story, one begins to notice how it wasn't just about romance— it was about shared dreams. He puts it succinctly, "we spent long hours studying together - to even strategize ways to land internships in the same cities! Yes, we briefly even navigated 'long-distance'." He then takes a long pause, and says, "We built our relationship on teamwork and trust." Indeed, their love deepened through these experiences, and soon, they decided to take the next big step: following their placement, they got engaged. Marriage followed shortly after. Their journey—from sneaking in time between internships to taking weekend road trips just to see each other—is the kind of story that movies are made of.

When the opportunity arose to study abroad, they took a leap of faith together, moving across the world to the United States. Even then, their choices were guided by a commitment to each other—Shrabani turned down a fully-funded opportunity at a prestigious university to ensure they could study in the same city.



Chicago then became their new home, and with it came a fresh set of challenges and adventures.

Life in the U.S. was a whirlwind of academics, part-time jobs, and adjusting to a new culture. Gaurav and Shrabani leaned on each other as they navigated everything from brutal Chicago winters to late-night study sessions. He notes, "While we were fortunate to have the unwavering support of Shrabani's uncle and aunt, who helped us settle in and find their footing in a new country; but our journey was far from easy..."

If I have to use a quote to describe that brief period during that phase, I would quote Javed Akhtar from this Prime series "Angry Young Men", where Javed saab tearfully recalls and as he says, "There are two kinds of deprivation – of sleep and of food – that leave a mark on you that you never forget." Gaurav pauses, looks away and recollects himself. He is referring to that time when he lost his wallet, ID cards and money in a foreign land. That time of learning, growth, and an unbreakable partnership. That time of them working part-time jobs to support themselves, including long shifts at Subway. But being the jovial Gaurav as we all know him, he says, "at least I mastered the art of making sandwiches – while juggling coursework – which, in a way, is also, a first!", he laughs off.

#### From rural foundations to global perspectives: A day-in-the-life of Gaurav at HCLFoundation

Gaurav's professional journey began with Jeevika - Bihar's State Rural Livelihoods Mission, where he worked closely with grassroots communities. His time at Heartland Alliance in Chicago further honed his commitment to working with marginalized populations, particularly undocumented minors. Today, as the Lead for the Skill Development & Livelihoods theme at HCLFoundation, he brings a wealth of experience to large-scale programmes that empower a significant demographic the underserved youth of this country as well as uplifts communities through sustainable employment opportunities. Not just that, another key focus area of his is *My E-Haat*, HCLFoundation's special initiative that bridges the gap between artisans and customers. It leverages tech to empower artisans by providing market access and visibility, ensuring their craft not only survives but thrives in an increasingly digital economy.

Ask him how he manages all this and Gaurav says, "It's my wonderful team. (And I wake up early! That too!) But on a serious note, a significant portion of my work at no revolves around a few key things: strategic planning, stakeholder engagement, and risk management. Then there are the finer things such as developing frameworks for capacity-building programs, ensuring financial prudence in project execution, and overseeing field operations. Ultimately, balancing project ops while troubleshooting challenges - is a skill one must cultivate. Only then can you ensure that an initiative runs smoothly - while continuing to foster innovative partnerships."

#### Memorable moment(s)

"There are two that stand out. The first was when I realized that scaling *Skill Development & Livelihoods* would be far more effective if I were closer to the NCR region - the centre of Policy making. But the big question was—how do I bring this up with Dr. Nidhi? When I finally did bring it up & shared my desire to relocate from Lucknow to Noida with my family, her response was just two words: *'Come tomorrow!'* Haha, I will always remember that - for it speaks volumes of the leadership's foresight w.r.t. encouraging team leads as well as trusting their vision - which inturn enables us to proceed with confidence.

The second was taking my dad to the HCLTech Lucknow campus for the first time. It was a proud moment to show him where I work. Another special memory was bringing Shrabani and Abhijeet (my son) to the campus for the Diwali party—it was wonderful to share that experience with them."

Any advice to the younger lot aspiring to work in the CSR space?

"Whatever field you choose—CSR, NGOs, or beyond—dive deep. If you want a meaningful career, invest time in real, on-ground work. Be mindful of peer influence and appreciate what you have. I recently visited the National Association for the Blind, New Delhi and was struck by how children without sight still found joy. It's a reminder to respect what we have and make the most of it.

Gaurav is Noida-based, where he lives with his wife and Abhijeet - their 2-year-old son. A staunch tea enthusiast, he won't be caught swapping his chai for coffee anytime soon. An early bird by habit (but not always by choice), he balances his love for books and binge-worthy OTT shows, often inspired by stories of struggle—perhaps a nod to his own eventful journey. His comfort food? A hearty plate of rice, dal, and aloo posto (a Bengali staple made with poppy seeds), with a side of nostalgia. He firmly believes in planning meticulously for work but leaving life to fate. If given a superpower, he'd rather redo (than undo) some of the things he did in the past! Oh, and his dream holiday destination? Anywhere, as long as it involves a riverside - or beach, a heavy sprinkling of spirituality and a leisurely stroll through a bustling local market.



# Supporting environmental action

#### Marking the International Environment Education Day at Chennai

On the occasion of International Environment Education Day, TIDE in partnership with HCLFoundation conducted a session to enhance environmental awareness and understanding of sustainability followed by a quiz in Government Boys Higher Secondary school, Kamaraj Nagar and Jaigopal Garodia Government Girls Higher Secondary School, Nanganallur where 91 students participated enthusiastically. 300+ students from 8 schools were part of Midline assessment conducted as part of Harit school program. This assessment will help in understanding the improvement in learning level of students in terms of knowledge, awareness, attitude towards environment and make any changes in the modules if necessary.



52 students from 8 schools successfully completed the GenCAN challenge in Madurai. Through the programme, a development of environmental stewardship was observed where students participated in communicating and acting for climate change mitigation. They have performed skits and mimes, created poems, painted charts, taken pledge, rallied around their schools and homes, given speeches during school assembly and conducted waste collection and segregation drives to spread awareness on climate change. For climate action, these schools have conserved water by fixing leaky taps and promoting rainwater harvesting, conducted a one-hour "switch-off" campaign to save electricity, changed to greener LED bulbs, recycled paper, and plastic, and shifted to cleaner modes of transport- that is walking and cycling.





#### Debris-free Gulf of Mannar

As part of the "Debris-free Gulf of Mannar" initiative, MS Swaminathan Research Foundation organized shore clean up drives in 4 village clusters with the participation of local fishermen, women and community leaders (Shanmugavel pattinam, Therku pudhukudiyiruppu cluster in Ramanathapuram and Inigo Nagar, Terespuram Clusters, Thoothukudi) which resulted in the collection of over 3,123 Kg of Ghost Nets, 95 Kg of plastic bottles, 237 kg of Glass Bottles, 28 Kg of Clothes and 111 kg of Mixed waste. The diverse debris collected underscores the marine faceted nature of Marine pollution and emphasizes the urgent need for targeted interventions to address the issue. More such cleanup drives and targeted awareness creation programs shall be organized In the upcoming days.





#### Nature conservation sessions, Gautam Buddha Nagar

In January 2025, the Gorakhpur Environmental Action Group (GEAG), supported by the HCLFoundation, conducted seven environmental education activities in Gautam Buddha Nagar, Uttar Pradesh, benefiting 153 participants. Activities like: "Save Water and Save Earth" drawing activity at Police Line, hands-on organic composting sessions and home visits, poster designing on food chains and nature conservation at Composite School Yakubpur, a session on natural ecosystems at Nagla Charan Das School and sessions focusing on the 4Rs (Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) were some of the major activities. These activities boosted environmental awareness, practical sustainability skills, creativity, and responsibility towards nature, with participants committing to water conservation, composting, and eco-friendly practices.





# Transforming rural communities

# BIRD visits Samuday's climate resilient interventions in Lucknow

The Bankers Institute of Rural Development (BIRD) in Lucknow, a training wing of National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD), visited Samuday by HCLFoundation on January 21, 2025. As a part of their fiveday training program on 'Bankable Models for Mainstreaming Climate Financing', Dr Snehal M Bansod, Course Coordinator, BIRD & FM- NABARD, along with 15 bankers visited various intervention sites and received an orientation of the programme.

Additionally, the agriculture team showcased the sustainable value-added products of the Hardoi Kisan Producer Company Limited (HKPCL), an FPO supported by Samuday. The field visit focused on climate resilient interventions such as the Centre for Agriculture Technology & Transfer (CATT), solar mini grids, and sustainable livelihood practices.

#### Robotics technology training held for Anganwadi workers

In a move to strengthen early childhood education, Samuday by HCLFoundation led a day long training program for 100 Anganwadi workers from 28th-30th Jan. Aimed at enhancing teaching skills, the training focused on integrating technology into the classroom through WizBot robotics, an innovative approach to advance student creativity and logical thinking.

The training covered the use of WizBot in classrooms, button coding, and creative learning activities. Participants also explored the various features and functions to improve lesson planning and child development. By equipping Anganwadi workers with new skills, the program aims to significantly enhance the effectiveness of Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) for over 3,800 children.





#### Happy School Program celebrates Republic Day at Anganwadi Centers in Hardoi

As part of the Samuday's Vidyarambh Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) initiative under the Happy School Program, 98 Anganwadi Centers (AWC) celebrated Republic Day on 26th January with over 4,400 young learners and 200+ teachers in Hardoi.

Activities like cultural performances, patriotic recitations, and creative art sessions instilled a sense of national pride among participants, fostering deep appreciation for India's heritage.



# Parent engagement sessions held across AWCs in Hardoi

The Vidyarambh Initiative for Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) conducted a session across 98 Anganwadi Centers to empower parents of children aged 3-8 as part of the Happy School Program across various blocks of Hardoi throughout the month of January. The session promoted the importance of early brain development, positive parenting, play-based learning, and creating a stimulating home environment to encourage a strong foundation for growth.



# Showcasing Samuday craftsmanship at PFC meet in Noida

Samuday showcased the products from its handicraft's initiative at the 8th annual Partnering for Change meet from January 12th to 14th on the HCLTech Sector 126 campus in Noida.

Crafted by women artisans, the handmade items highlighted the craftsmanship of rural artisans, while showcasing the impact of Samuday's livelihood intervention. In addition to being provided with a platform to connect with stakeholders, the products also received appreciation from Simon England, Board Director at HCLTech.



#### Promoting handcrafted products at Awadh Shilp Gram Exhibition

Artisans under Samuday's handicraft initiative were invited by the Mission Director - UPSRLM (Uttar Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission), Government of Uttar Pradesh, to showcase their handcrafted products at the Lucknow Diwas and Republic Day Exhibition at the Awadh Shilp Gram from 24th to 26th January.

The event provided a remarkable platform to celebrate rural artisans, promote sustainable livelihoods and engage with a diverse audience. Visitors at the exhibition appreciated the intricate craftsmanship and stories that inspired the handcrafted pieces.



#### Chikankari artisans visit Rangsutra Crafts in Mirzapur

A group of 83 Chikankari artisans from Samuday's Chikankari Cluster Strengthening initiative visited the Rangsutra Crafts center in Mirzapur for an exposure visit on 6th January.

This visit encouraged learning through observation, and helped gain insights into market trends, customer preferences, quality standards and cultural values, boosting self-confidence and motivation levels. It also promoted interaction with old weavers and departmental employees to better understand supply chain management of raw materials, compliances, monitoring activities and other steps involved to ensure market readiness. This Samuday led initiative aims to create alternative livelihood opportunities for 150 beneficiaries, while engaging them in Chikankari craft production, including embroidery and stitching.



# Dairy animals' kits distributed among 4,000 farmers

Samuday's Dairy Development Project in Hardoi organized a Dairy Animal Kits Distribution Program from 2nd to 21st January across 5 blocks of Hardoi district. So far, the HCLFoundation team has distributed 4,000 kits to each dairy farmer with an aim to highlight the importance of continuous practices and essential medication in improving productivity.

As part of the program, farmers were also given practical demonstrations, and a Training of Trainers (ToT) session was held for Samuday's team from Tadiyawan, Ahirori, and Sursa blocks. This was part of efforts to equip them with best dairy farming practices and strengthen capacity building at the grassroots level.



# Samuday-led FPO Stakeholders Meet held in Vilathikulam

Samuday by HCLFoundation conducted a Farmer Producer Organization (FPO) stakeholder meeting to exchange ideas and discuss strategies to enhance sustainability and growth of FPOs. Held at the agricultural office in Vilathikulam on 7th January, the meeting provided individual FPO representatives with an opportunity to present their challenges and specific needs, focusing on areas like access to credit, capacity building, supply chain improvement, and expanding market opportunities for products.

Dr. E. Vadivel, Strategic Advisor from the Tamil Nadu Consortium of Farmer Producer Companies Ltd. was also in present at the meeting and shared valuable advice on improving the operational efficiency, market linkages, and financial stability of FPOs.



#### Empowering Tamil Nadu farmers with Moringa cultivation insights

As part of Samuday's agriculture intervention in Tamil Nadu, an exposure visit with 30 farmers exploring moringa cultivation was held on 24th January at Greenera Pvt Ltd in Erode, Tamil Nadu.

During the industrial visit, 28 best-selling moringa-based products were showcased to demonstrate value addition opportunities, and a field visit was conducted with stakeholder farmers actively engaged in moringa cultivation. Farmers shared their experiences, highlighting the benefits, processes, and risk management strategies involved in moringa farming. A detailed field discussion also took place, providing valuable insights and practical knowledge to support the farmers in enhancing their cultivation and exploring value-added opportunities.



# Climate Smart Agriculture - Front line demonstration

As part of Samuday's agriculture intervention in Tamil Nadu, a field day was conducted for 45 farmers at Namasivayapuram on 30th January to demonstrate the benefits of advanced agricultural practices in a progressive farmer's field. The demonstration plot exhibited significant improvements over the control, with observations indicating larger cob sizes, higher number of filled grains, and enhanced crop health. These outcomes highlighted the effectiveness of integrated input management in boosting yield and productivity.



#### Community volunteers facilitated under ICAT initiative in Thoothukudi

Under the ICAT initiative by Samuday, a group of 95 community volunteers and 8 TMU (Task Management Unit) members were provided with additional materials to facilitate their day-to-day tasks on 9th January at the Union office in Vilathikulamblock of Thoothukudidistrict. Items included t-shirts, water bottles, umbrellas, notebooks, caps, and laptop bags. Mr. Vishwalingam, Mr. Dev, Mr. Vikas, and Mr. Madhu from HCLFoundation actively participated in distributing the materials as well.

The initiative is aimed at motivating and equipping volunteers for enhanced community engagement.



# Milk containers distributed under animal husbandry initiative

The camp served a total of 113 beneficiaries and offered various services like ANC screening, child screening, dental checkups, lab testing, counselling with a female doctor & pediatrician, and general OPD prescription.



#### National Girl Child Day observed

Under its Kuposhan Mukt Gram Panchayat, Samuday by HCLFoundation was observed in 20 schools across 4 blocks on 24th January in Hardoi district of Uttar Pradesh. The event brought together adolescents and community members for a series of vibrant events, with activities such as drawing competitions, slogan writing, essay writing, rallies, self-defense training, quiz competition, group discussions and rangoli-making lined up for the 2,565 attendees.

Participants included 100 teachers, adolescents, community members, ASHA (Accredited Social Health Activist), AWW (Anganwadi) and ANM (Auxiliary Nurse Midwife) workers, who raised awareness on gender equality and educational rights for every girl child.



#### MHC screened beneficiaries on World Leprosy Day

Samuday observed World Leprosy Day at three model health facilities including Community Health Centre (CHC) Sandila, Primary Health Centre (PHC) Tikari and Ayushman Arogya Mandir (AAM) Raisoon 30th January.

A total of 394 participants including Front Line Worker's (FLW), community members, PRI members, Community Health Officer, medical officers, staff nurse, counselors and pharmacists came together to observe the day. The event also had awareness and counselling sessions, health screening of 149 beneficiaries and an oath ceremony for leprosy eradication.



#### Training of solar mini-grid operators

#### Bengaluru

#### **Menstrual Hygiene Practices**

HCLFoundation, in partnership with United Way Bengaluru, recently held a Menstrual Hygiene Practices Workshop for 66 Anganwadi workers in Srirampura. The training provided crucial information on menstrual health, covering topics such as the menstrual cycle, common disorders and their treatment, the importance of nutrition, premenstrual syndrome, menopause, and dispelling prevalent myths. Participants also received menstrual cups and educational materials on maintaining healthy hygiene practices.



#### Empowering Young Voices: Celebrating National Girl Child Day

On Jan 25, a special awareness session was held in honor of National Girl Child Day, organized by SOCHARA, focusing on empowering young girls and highlighting their significance in society. The event emphasized the importance of education, equality, and opportunities for girls. Many young participants shared their thoughts, expressing pride in being girls and discussing the challenges they face. The session aimed to inspire confidence and encourage girls to dream big, reinforcing the message that they are capable of achieving great heights. Facilitated by the local field team, they created a safe space to discuss mental health challenges and support each other. Their first meeting included a pen-holding activity to explore stress. This initiative highlights the importance of community-based mental health efforts and the women's commitment to self-care and mutual support. The group plans to meet regularly to discuss other crucial topics and strengthen their supportive network.



#### Campaign by Child Health Ambassadors on Waste Segregation

On January 18, 2025, Child Health Ambassadors (CHAs) organized an awareness campaign on waste segregation and cleanliness, reaching over 500 households and engaging more than 650 community members across various areas. The campaign emphasized the importance of waste segregation for health, education, and well-being, using impactful slogans and skits to highlight the dangers of poor sanitation. Fifty children actively participated, showcasing their commitment to creating cleaner and healthier communities. This event demonstrated the leadership and creativity of CHAs in advocating for sustainable practices and public health.



#### Empowering Retiring Indian Army Personnel Through Entrepreneurship

HCLFoundation has sponsored and funded Business Information Centers (BICs) in Bangalore and Lucknow to train retiring Indian Army personnel in entrepreneurship, encouraging them to become job creators. In January 2025, three workshops were conducted: two in Bangalore, covering 68 personnel, and one in Lucknow, covering 22 personnel. Their business ideas ranged from mushroom farming, RO plants, and computer coaching classes to pappad making, fish farming, football coaching centers, two-wheeler spare parts, millets farming, grocery shops, garment manufacturing, paper plate manufacturing, cycle shops, medical shops, and hardware stores. Certificates were distributed to the participants, recognizing their efforts and achievements.



#### **Republic Day Celebration at Yuvakendra**


### **Resilient Responses for Winter Risk**
