Shaping green careers

The HCLFoundation's Green Skilling initiative equips youth with essential skills for sustainable livelihoods. Launched in 2019, the program has trained 600 individuals, preparing them for careers that blend innovation with environmental responsibility.

Students gain hands-on experience in cutting-edge fields, including Electric Vehicle (EV) technology, Solar PV Technology, sewage treatment plant (STP) operations, and community-based waste management. The curriculum fosters expertise in renewable energy, water management, and waste recycling, empowering youth to drive sustainable change.

Strategic partnerships with government Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) ensure high-quality delivery of Solar PV and EV courses.





Charging ahead with solar energy

With a diploma in electronics and communications, Meghavath Rathore researched industries with potential for growth and landed on solar energy. The Yuvakendra's free solar technician program aligned perfectly with his vision. Over three months, Meghavath Rathore honed his skills, from installing solar panels to understanding energy storage solutions.

"My family has always encouraged me to think out of the box, to innovate. And my dream is to launch a startup using solar for social good, for example, cars driven by solar power. We must harness the power of the sun."










Why Power Tools matter in the modern economy

This hands-on program bridges classroom learning with real-world application, preparing students for roles in construction, manufacturing, repair, and infrastructure projects.

The course provides access to cutting-edge tools, industry expertise, and skill certification, ensuring career readiness and growth.

At just 16, Ederish dreams of creating opportunities, not waiting for them. Enrolled in Yuvakendra's power tools course in Chennai, he's mastering welding, drilling, and cutting to support his family's transport business.











Baking and Confectionery

This course provides a thorough grounding in the essentials of baking and confectionery, from understanding key ingredients to mastering professional techniques. Participants gain hands-on experience with industry-standard equipment, ensuring they build the skills required for success.

The curriculum covers a range of sweet and savoury delights, including cakes, breads, cookies and lavash, fostering creativity and precision.

These classes serve as launch pads for youth to craft fulfilling careers and explore their culinary passions.





Sweet dreams are made of these

"Yuvakendra gave me the confidence to turn my passion for baking into a career. The skills I learned shaped my journey. I am excited to keep growing, one recipe at a time."

Shivani always admired the artistry of baking, drawing inspiration from the intricate designs she scrolled through on Instagram. And her friend's recommendation to join Yuvakendra that transformed her fascination into a career.

Through a year-long, intensive course, Shivani gained expertise in baking breads, cakes, cookies, and pastries. She mastered precise measurements, learned to experiment with flavours, and discovered the art of creative cake decoration. The supportive trainers and free access to quality ingredients at Yuvakendra helped her excel.

All of 22, Shivani bakes for a renowned organic bakery and dreams of taking her craft global.





Wheels of Hope: Skill Rath

Its 5 pm in the evening. And as the sun gets ready to set, a bright yellow and white bus rolls down the bustling streets of Chennai, carrying with it hope for a better tomorrow.

Visiting various areas of Chennai, 'Skill Rath' as they are named – are rewriting the future of vocational training. For these vibrant, tech-laden buses are more than just vehicles; equipped with state-of-the-art tools to teach drone technology, 3D printing, and other new age skills, they are gateways to possibilities.

The first Skill Rath rolled out in January 2022 and immediately captured the imagination of young people. In slums across Chennai, youth step aboard the Skill Rath and are introduced to jobs of the future. They marvel at the drones taking flight and watch a 3D printer sculpt their imaginations into reality. Here, they aren't just learning; they're discovering the thrill of creation and what the future holds.

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Skill Raths don't stop at sparking curiosity; they guide students toward Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), offering pathways to skill-based careers. By bridging traditional education with cutting-edge technology, these mobile marvels are transforming dreams into opportunities.

Objectives

• Introducing new-age skills and cutting-edge technologies like drone operations and 3D printing.

• Igniting curiosity and interest in STEM fields.

• Promoting diverse courses offered by ITIs, emphasizing the potential career paths available to students.

• Supporting admissions to ITIs.

 Increasing awareness about vocational training in schools and communities.

• Providing opportunities to school drop-outs to enrol in ITIs for skill-based education.





Coding his way to success

"Centum and HCLFoundation didn't just teach me to code; they taught me how to think, solve problems, and present myself with confidence."

Hrithik's journey from theoretical college lessons to a structured, hands-on training program at Centum transformed his career path. Having mastered coding languages like Java, Python, and SQL, he refined his problem-solving skills through the Yuvakendra training.

Applying theory, he learnt how to solve problems through designing and writing codes. Mock interviews sharpened his articulation, and Yuvakendra's professional trainers instilled confidence. Today, Hrithik is set to join Tata Consulting Services (TCS) as a systems engineer.

"I was rejected by TCS in my first interview. But I applied again after completing my Yuvakendra training. This time around, I was well versed and articulate. The soft skills training gave me the edge. My trainers taught me to think, present, and believe in myself."





Turning struggles into stepping stones

Gillala Asha • Hyderabad

"They say when a door closes, a window opens. For me, Yuvakendra was that window, helping me rebuild my life."

Growing up in Hyderabad, Asha remembers the hardships faced by her small family of four. Tragedy struck when her father, the family's sole breadwinner, passed away unexpectedly, leaving the family in turmoil. With her mother too ill to work, Asha faced a dark and uncertain future.

In 2019, Yuvakendra's mobilization drive gave her a lifeline. Enrolling in their Customer Executive course, she gained technical skills like MS Office and customer communication.

After securing a job post-training, Asha aimed higher. She joined HCLTech, doubling her salary. Today, she supports her family and has invested in a home with her husband. But her greatest satisfaction comes from motivating Yuvakendra trainees to dream big by sharing her story.







Apparel Manufacturing Technology

Offering hands-on introduction to the apparel industry, the course equips participants with modern garment production techniques, fabric testing methods, and essential skills in garment construction. With a focus on quality and precision, learners gain a deep understanding of industry standards while developing their creativity and technical expertise. Exposure visits give young people an insight into the competitive world of fashion design.

Whether aspiring to be designers, tailors, or quality controllers, this course prepares youth for diverse opportunities in the world of fashion and apparel.

Refrigeration and Air Conditioning

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Students opting for this course gain hands-on expertise in HVAC system installation, servicing, and troubleshooting.

The curriculum covers installation procedures, routine maintenance, and effective solutions for common system problems. Students learn essential skills for diagnosing and repairing air conditioning units, ensuring peak performance.



"It's a princely amount for a school dropout," says Karthik. "Yuvakendra taught me to turn setbacks into comebacks."



Turning setbacks into success

A. Karthik 📀 Chennai

"Immobilized in bed after my accident, I never imagined it would help me open doors to financial independence."

After a bike accident forced Karthik to abandon his studies, he was distraught. With both parents not working, it was hard for the family to make ends meet. A chance meeting with the outreach team of Yuvakendra, led him to enrol for a 45 days course in AC repair and maintenance.

Mastering essential repair and installation skills, he landed a job at Voltas. Within months, Karthik rose from helper to "legend technician," earning ₹60,000 monthly.

The next step - to open his own AC service centre.











Certificate in Health Care

Graduates can pursue further education in Auxiliary Nursing Midwifery (ANM) and General Midwifery Nursing (GNM) for enhanced career prospects in nursing and healthcare services. The demand for trained health care assistants is consistently high across various sectors.

Career opportunities for graduates include:

Assistant to Nurse (Rugna Sahayak) course, affiliated with RTM Nagpur University, offers foundational training in home-based and hospital patient care. The curriculum focuses on understanding human anatomy, primary health care basics, and patient interaction. Practical skills are developed through hands-on experience at local health facilities.

• Hospitals & clinics: Assisting in emergency wards, ICUs, and supporting senior nurses.

• Employee health clinics: Providing first aid and health emergency support in workplaces.

• Self-employment: Offering home-based care for patients and elderly individuals.

• Old age homes: Providing daily care for elderly residents.

• Flexible employment: Working in health care camps, blood donation drives, and vaccination clinics.





A new identity. A new beginning.

Suchita Ruprao Shirbhate **Nagpur**

"I learned to depend on myself. Now I teach others to do the same."

Ill-treated by her husband and in-laws, Suchita refused to let her circumstances define her. After her marriage ended, Suchita enrolled in the assistant nursing training course offered by the Yuvakendra in Nagpur—a decision that transformed her life. Over six months, she mastered patient care and hygiene

Starting as a caregiver to an elderly patient, Suchita impressed her employers at Ashwasth Services with her professional demeanour and empathy. She was soon promoted as Office Manager, where she expertly juggles operations, mentoring, and client management with ease.

Wanting to give back, she teaches at the Yuvakendra, training other girls in patient care. "This place gave me stability and strength. And I want to pass this strength on to other girls. Once skilled – you can conquer the world."









Tailoring and Dress Making

This course in tailoring and dress making offers a comprehensive introduction to techniques for creating custom garments and accessories. Participants learn foundational skills such as pattern making, stitching, and fabric handling, enabling them to design and craft unique pieces.

The course provides the knowledge and hands-on experience needed to bring a student's creative visions to life.





Stitching together a new life

Nazma • Meerut

"I didn't just learn how to tailor—I reclaimed my dignity."


In 2022, Nazma found herself wrongfully imprisoned. A false accusation turned her world upside down. Desperate and despondent, she wanted to find meaning in her life. She enrolled for a three-month tailoring course, run by Yuvakendra for prison inmates. It was here she discovered her purpose.

Upon her release, Nazma started a tailoring business and gradually built a loyal customer base. Today, she employs six women, including girls from her resettlement colony.


"Girls here led a tough life. Many are not allowed to step out of their homes. I teach them tailoring for two hours daily, charging a nominal fee of ₹200 per month. Four girls have already completed the training and are now working from home."

Nazma dreams of owning her own house and expanding her business into a full-fledged boutique.









Graphic Design

In this course, students master the art of visual communication by learning key principles such as colour theory, typography, layout, hierarchy, and composition.

Students gain proficiency in industry-standard software, including Photoshop, CorelDRAW, Lightroom, and InDesign, preparing them to craft professional, visually impactful designs.



Today, Nidhi works as a Graphic Associate at PhysicsWallah, earning over ₹30,000 per month. She designs social media banners, YouTube thumbnails, and corporate logos. "Yuvakendra didn't just teach me software; it taught me how to carry myself, present ideas, and connect with clients confidently."





Designing her own success

Nidhi Kumari 📀 Noida

"When I bought my first laptop and scooter, I knew I was on the right track."

Nidhi Kumari was unsure of her career path until her brother, a Yuvakendra alumnus, introduced her to their graphic design course. With an interest in design and a desire to be independent, she enrolled. Over three months, Nidhi mastered tools like CorelDRAW, Photoshop, and Illustrator while honing essential soft skills such as client communication and professional conduct.




Entrepreneurship at Yuvakendras

The entrepreneurship model at Yuvakendras fosters an entrepreneurial mindset and equips course participants to turn their ideas into successful ventures. Through a blend of practical learning and mentorship, the model focuses on key areas such as:

- Business fundamentals: Youth gain insights into marketing, finance, operations, and customer service.
- Soft skills: Communication, leadership, and teamwork are emphasized as core entrepreneurial traits.
- Innovation & creativity: Encouraging problem-solving and innovative thinking.
- **Mentorship:** Guidance from experienced entrepreneurs helps youth refine ideas and navigate business execution.



- Networking: Access to a network of successful entrepreneurs and industry leaders.
- Workshops & simulations: Interactive sessions on pitching, budgeting, and market research offer hands-on learning.
- Alumni network: A thriving community of young entrepreneurs provides ongoing support and collaboration opportunities.







Inclusion at Yuvakendras

Inclusion at Yuvakendras is a core principle that ensures all young people, regardless of their background, abilities, or identities, feel valued, respected, and have equal opportunities to thrive. This approach promotes diversity, social equity and community cohesion, vital for youth development.

• Celebrating diversity: By hosting festivals, cultural events, and art forms from varied traditions, Yuvakendras foster cultural appreciation, reduce prejudice, and encourage mutual respect.

• Gender equality programs: Our centres challenge stereotypes, empower young women, and support boys in developing emotional intelligence and respecting gender diversity.

• Community outreach: Initiatives target marginalized youth from low-income families, rural areas, and under-represented neighbourhoods, offering transportation, free resources, and awareness campaigns to enhance participation.

• Skill development: Vocational training, career counselling, and entrepreneurship programs equip disadvantaged youth with employable skills, fostering financial independence and resilience.

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Courage beyond constraints

S. Gomathi • Chennai

"My son gives me purpose and Yuvakendra gave me hope."

Abandoned by her husband due to her disability, Gomati's world turned dark. But for the sake of her son, she persevered. A resident of Kannagi Nagar in Chennai, she joined the Yuvakendra training program for persons with disabilities. A three-month course taught her computer skills and spoken English. Within 20 days of completing her training, she secured a job in Spencer's billing department with a salary of ₹16,000 per month.

Living with her six-year-old son, Gomati manages all aspects of life.

As she says "Don't let your disability hold you back. Use it to propel yourself forward...to learn and grow."





Breaking barriers with every lesson

Shubham Sharma • Ghaziabad

"When I joined NDS, I didn't just learn skills— I found the tools to live on my own terms."

Born deaf, Shubham experienced the challenges of a family desperate for solutions and a society that misunderstood him. "My family tried everything—temples, black magic, and home remedies—fearing what would happen to me if they weren't around."

His life took a turn when he discovered Noida Deaf Society (NDS). There, he not only learned professional skills like hospitality, retail, and workplace etiquette but also how to communicate effectively.

After mastering sign language, he returned to Yuvakendra as a trainer. His classes go beyond technical lessons; they address the challenges of navigating society as a deaf individual. "I want to shape a more inclusive society, starting with students. In class, I often share my experiences—turning challenges into humor to make them relatable. I encourage students to see themselves as capable and independent."

Connecting with Government Schemes at Yuvakendras

The Government of India has implemented various schemes and programs aimed at empowering youth through Yuvakendras (Youth Centers) and other related initiatives. These schemes focus on youth development, skill-building, education, employment opportunities, entrepreneurship, and social welfare. Below are some of the key government schemes and programs that benefit Yuvakendras or young people involved in youth development activities:

National Youth Development Scheme (NYDS)

Objective: The National Youth Development Scheme aims to promote the overall development of youth in India by providing funding and support to various youth welfare programs. The scheme focuses on leadership development, skill-building, education, and community development.

Key Components:

Support for the establishment of youth clubs and centers.

Funding for youth development programs in rural and urban areas.

Promotion of youth participation in social and national development.

Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY)

Objective: PMKVY is a skill development program that offers youth an opportunity to gain skills and certification in various sectors. This helps them become employable and start their own businesses.

Key Components:

Short-term training programs in various trades. with financial support for youth attending skill development courses.

Recognition of prior learning (RPL) to certify the skills youth have acquired through experience.

Collaboration with training centers, which can include Yuva Kendras, to conduct the programs.

Startup India Scheme

Objective: The Startup India scheme aims to promote entrepreneurship among youth by providing financial assistance, mentorship, and a conducive environment for startups.

Key Components:

Simplification of business registration and tax processes.

Atal Innovation Mission (AIM)

Objective: The Atal Innovation Mission aims to promote innovation and entrepreneurship among youth by setting up Atal Tinkering Labs and Atal Incubators. This initiative encourages young people to develop innovative solutions to societal challenges.

Key Components:

Setting up of Atal Tinkering Labs Organizing innovation (ATLs) in schools and youth challenges and centres for hands-on learning competitions for youth and experimentation. participation.

Skill India Mission

Objective: The Skill India Mission aims to equip youth with industryrelevant skills and create a robust skill ecosystem that empowers them to access better employment opportunities.

Key Components:


Collaboration with YuvaKendras and train centres to offer skill development programs
