### Convergence through Partnership with TRIFED

HCLFoundation has partnered with the Tribal Co-operative Marketing Development Federation of India Limited (TRIFED) to empower tribal artisans across India. Dr. Nidhi Pundhir from HCLFoundation signed the MoU at the Aadi Mahotsav, a vibrant festival celebrating India's tribal heritage, culture, arts, crafts, cuisine, and commerce at New Delhi on Feb 19, 2025. Through this collaboration, artisans will receive training and their handcrafted products will be showcased on the My E-Haat platform. This Partnership further strengthens livelihoods, supports indigenous crafts and preserves India's rich cultural heritage.



### Volunteers collect 45 kgs of dry waste at Okhla Bird Sanctuary Clean-up drive

A clean-up drive and bird-watching event at Okhla Bird Sanctuary was organized on Feb 15 by My Clean City and it brought together 75 enthusiastic volunteers from HCLTech. During the plogging drive, the team collected 45 kgs of dry waste, demonstrating their commitment to conservation and waste reduction



### HCLFoundation's work recognized by the CIMSME

#### **Dhwani 2025 Conclave**

Dhwani 2025, beyond barriers is a conclave under the Project Vayati – Solidarity Foundation's flagship livelihood programme. Project Vayati, has been supported by HCLFoundation since 2022, under which 714 community members from LGBTIAQ+ communities have been impacted. Out of this, 592 community members have been trained in topics of Foundation and Life skills such as Communications, Leadership, etc. Upto 47 community members have been provided with career opportunities, 176 community members have accessed mental health support, and 40+ members have gained access to social entitlements, such as bank accounts, transgender cards, access to Government schemes, we celebrated inclusion and their progress on 28th Feb at Bengaluru International Centre. We had entrepreneurs come forward and showcase their skills and products along with government officials talk about various aspects of gender and inclusion under skills and livelihood for the LGBTIAQ+ community.

She felicitated 30+ Indian Army veteran who successfully established businesses after training with I Create. This recognition underscores the organization's commitment to supporting the approximately 60,000 veterans who retire from the Indian Army each year, helping them channel their discipline, commitment, and risk-taking abilities into entrepreneurial success.



Piyush Wankhade, Manager at HCLFoundation, represented HCLFoundation, at a conference in Mumbai, co-organized by the Tribal Welfare Department and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). The event was attended by prominent figures, including Shri Devendra Fadnavis, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Maharashtra, and Shri Uikey, Minister of Tribal Welfare, Government of Maharashtra. During the conference, Piyush highlighted HCLFoundation's initiatives in Nagpur, focusing on the HCLTech Grant projects that benefit tribal populations. This model showcases HCLFoundation's commitment to creating a positive impact on the lives of people and communities through sustainable programmes.



Manu Khanna, Senior Manager at HCLFoundation, attended the CII event at the Tata Center of Excellence in Jamshedpur, where 15 grassroots organizations showcased their innovative work in sports development. The event brought together key stakeholders, including government officials, industry leaders, and sports experts, to discuss ways to promote sports at the grassroots level. Notable speakers, such as Mr. Joval, CEO of TOPS, Government of India, Mr. Chanakya Choudhary, VP of Tata Steel and Chairman of CII Sports, and Mr. Sunil Misra, Principal Advisor of CII, shared their expertise and insights on fostering a stronger sports ecosystem in India.



Meha Tiwari, Manager at HCLFoundation, represented HCLFoundation at the inaugural National Family Summit, organized by the Miracle Foundation. The summit focused on prioritizing family strengthening and family-based alternative care for children. The event convened key experts from renowned NGOs (Udayan Care, Sambodhi, FES, CINI, among others) and government agencies (NCPCR, state child protection authorities from Karnataka, MP, TN, Telangana and more).



#### Knowledge to action: empowering youth climate innovators

TERI, an Environment Education and Awareness (EEA) partner, and HCLFoundation recently held a two-day Teacher's Training Workshop in Bengaluru, Karnataka. The workshop, part of the "Knowledge to Action: Empowering Youth Climate Innovators" program, brought together 33 high school and 25 primary school teachers from Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) government schools. Expert-led sessions focused on innovative teaching methods for addressing local environmental issues. Participants also collaborated in groups to develop and present gamification ideas for teaching students about climate change. Following this as part of continuation of the program, a five-Day Student Training workshop aimed at educating students about climate change, sustainability, and environmental conservation. A total of 396 students and 20 teachers from 15 schools under the BBMP participated in the event. The workshop covered key concepts related to climate change, tailored to the local geography. Engaging, hands-on activities were incorporated to deepen students' understanding of environmental issues and highlight the role they can play in mitigating their impact. The event fostered meaningful discussions and collaboration across schools, successfully reaching a broad audience. By the end of the workshop, students were not only well-informed but also motivated to take concrete actions in their daily lives to address climate change.



### GenCAN youth Climate Summit at Lucknow, Hardoi and Bijapur

Centre for Environment Education (CEE) in collaboration with HCLFoundation, hosted the GenCAN Youth Climate Action Leaders' Summit across three cities—Lucknow, Hardoi and Bijapur. The summit brought together over 275 student leaders and mentor teachers from 36 government schools for a transformative experience focused on climate change awareness and action. The event kicked off with mixing student leaders in different teams, followed by an engaging quiz session—Bhujo to Jaane, setting a lively and interactive tone for the day. Students then took part in a creative act on key climate concepts such as weather VS climate, climate change, greenhouse gases, carbon footprint, handprint etc. A key segment of the summit was a

group discussion and presentation, which encouraged students to explore the local impacts of climate change. By incorporating traditional knowledge and local examples, the students were able to connect the global issue of climate change with real-world experiences in their communities. The summit concluded with the students sharing the valuable insights they gained throughout the program, along with the actions they have undertaken as Climate Heroes in their respective schools and communities. Some of the notable climate actions taken were-switching to LED bulbs, saving electricity, starting kitchen gardens, composting wet waste, reducing & recycling dry waste, repairing leaky taps, opting for cycling/walking and many more. The GenCAN Summit served as an important platform for empowering the next generation of climate heroes.





#### Responsible kite flying: combating the impact of manjha on avian wildlife

Animal Warriors Conservation Society (AWCS) collaborating with HCLFoundation is committed to mitigating the devastating impact of nylon and glass-coated manjha on birds through a comprehensive conservation initiative. As part of the efforts Manjha Cleanup Drive, a proactive initiative aimed at removing discarded kite strings was conducted at Indira Park, a prominent community park in the heart of Hyderabad, to prevent further harm to wildlife. 40 Volunteers from HCLTech, HCLFoundation, conservationists, and local community joined forces to clear manjha from trees, streets, and other high-risk urban areas, collecting an astounding 60 kg of synthetic manjha during the cleanup event. These efforts not only eliminate immediate threats but also promote responsible kite-flying practices among citizens.



#### **Environment comic creation**

World Comics India (WCI) in partnership with HCLFoundation with the support of OfERR NGO successfully conducted the EE Comics Campaign at MPB Government Girls Higher Secondary School, East Tambaram, Chennai, bringing creativity and environmental awareness together through the power of visual storytelling. The campaign witnessed the enthusiastic participation of around 30 students, many of whom became first-time comic creators. They not only presented their self-made environmental comics to their peers and teachers but also stepped into the role of peer trainers. In interactive small-group exercises, they guided fellow students on how to express environmental issues creatively through comics. By the end of the day, the participants collectively produced more than 80 visual drafts on various environmental themes, showcasing their artistic talents and deep understanding of sustainability topics.



#### Field assessment for Biomass Estimation, Carbon Sequestration, and Phyto-diversity

Ecosystem services evaluation was conducted, including vegetation sampling, and biodiversity monitoring at Green Connector, Lucknow from 4-13th February, 2025. The survey resulted in 12 vegetation, 45 litter & 24 soil samples. As part of Bird assessment, 120+ individuals belonging to 19+ species had been recorded and a herbarium of 20 plant species is made. This initiative supports ecosystem restoration efforts, strengthening the role of urban forests as effective carbon sinks and biodiversity hotspots.



#### Seasonal bird count – A citizen-science initiative

A Scientific Bird Count was organized at Harit Upvan Upralsi and Police Line Water body, Noida with HCLTech volunteers from 4-6th February 2025. This Citizen science initiative engaged volunteers (150+) in counting birds, observing & recording bird behavior (Ethogram). The activity resulted in recording 388 individuals belonging to 48+ bird species and 8100 seconds of Ethogram. This initiative will be carried out in three seasons and further will be replicated in other PAN India Harit sites.





#### 10 DFAs launched to strengthen dairy value chain in Hardoi

Samuday has established 10 new Dairy Farmers Associations (DFA) in three blocks of Tadiwayan, Mallawan and Kothawan to enhance milk production, support local farmers, and strengthen the dairy value chain from Feb 24-27. The programme has been leading a comprehensive Ecosystem Development Project in Hardoi to create a sustainable and integrated milk production system with a goal to provide alternative sources of income for marginalized households. Offering scientific, technological, and training support to its beneficiaries, it also promotes sustainable farming at the grassroot level.



#### Samuday's Crafts showcases at NIFT Bangalore

At a recent event "Festival of Handmade", organized by A Hundred Hands displayed the craftsmanship of Samuday Crafts women artisans from Feb 12-16, at the NIFT Bangalore campus. With handcrafted products generating sales of approximately Rs 70,000, the event offered valuable insights into consumer preferences and product refinement. Additionally, it also helped artisans expand their customer base and engage with B2B clients.





#### Samuday at Ullas Mela in Lucknow

The literacy achievements and future plans of Sakshar Samuday were showcased during the Ullas Mela held at the State Resource Centre, Literacy House in Lucknow on Feb 5. The Mela emphasized the literacy progress made by Uttar Pradesh under the New India Literacy Program, and was inaugurated and addressed by Shri Sandip Singh, Minister of State for Basic Education (Independent Charge), Uttar Pradesh, and Shri Deepak Kumar, Additional Chief Secretary of Basic Education. Yogesh Kumar, Deputy General Manager and Ashish Singh, Sector Lead of Education at HCLFoundation highlighted Samuday's efforts in educating 158,000 community members using various communication strategies and content dissemination platforms in Hardoi.



# District-level workshop on Adult literacy highlights impact of Sakshar Samuday

An adult literacy workshop was held on 18th February in Hardoi district of Uttar Pradesh to promote adult literacy, with a focus on foundational, financial, and digital literacy. Bringing together key stakeholders, the event welcomed the District Development Officer of Hardoi, block education officers and representatives of Sarvoday Aashram and Sahbhagi Shiksha Sabsthan, who spoke on the role of literacy in empowering communities.

The workshop had several activities including a panel discussion on collaboration and strategies for adult literacy programmes, certificate distribution among neo literates, and a street play demonstrating the practical relevance of literacy.



#### Certificate distribution event for Neo literates held across 5 blocks of Hardoi

A series of five literacy events were organized across various blocks of Hardoi through the month of February to promote education and literacy within the community and distribute certificates among qualified learners under the New India Literacy program. Of the 750 neo literates were also those qualified by HCLFoundation post the completion of the course.

Guests including HCLFoundation Sector Lead Mr. Ashish Singh, Pradhan, Madhoganj Police Station In-Charge, Block Education Officer and Academic Resource Person of Bharawan, Madhoganh, Sursa and Ahirori graced the events. In addition to this, a Literacy Awareness Rally was also held to raise awareness around education and financial literacy.



### KGVB teachers trained on DLCC & Al at DIET in Hardoi

In an effort to unite technology and education, Samuday by HCLFoundation, in partnership with ARTPARK organized a two-phase training program at DIET (District Institute of Education and Training), Hardoi on Feb 14-15, Catered to KGVB teachers, composite, and upper primary schools in 19 blocks of Hardoi, the program saw participation from 106 faculty members who learned gained knowledge on Digital Literacy, Coding, Computational Thinking, and Artificial Intelligence (DLCC& AI). This included hands-on training with Microsoft Office, Scratch, Python programming, Al tools, and the internet. The programme was graced by DIET Principal Mr. Yogendra Singh, who motivated teachers by highlighting the role of technology in education and its use in preparing students for the future. The event concluded with a certificate distribution among participants, along with a feedback session.



### Training workshop on Wizbot Robotics technology held under the Happy School programme in Hardoi

Under the Vidyarambh ECCE initiative of the Happy School Program, Samuday by HCLFoundation conducted a four-day residential training workshop on Wizbot Robotics technology between 6th and 9th February in Lucknow.

The training aimed to integrate robotics into early childhood education, fostering curiosity, creativity, and foundational skill development. A total of 50 volunteers from across 100 schools of Hardoi participated, gaining expertise in innovative teaching methods, child psychology, and the National Curriculum Framework (NCF).





## National Science Day celebrated across 100 Anganwadi centers in Hardoi

A hundred Anganwadi centers under Happy School Program by Samuday celebrated National Science Day with 4,000 children on Feb 28, in Hardoi. Blending science and technology, students participated in several innovative activities such as coloring with leaves, matching colors, exploring the world of robotics with Wizbot etc. The integration of Wizbot robotics encouraged development of fine motor skills and cognitive abilities. Guided by Anganwadi workers and Vidyarambh volunteers, the event also featured card games and direction tracking exercises.



### Strengthening TB care under TB Elimination Programme

Samuday has established 12 TB (tuberculosis) hubs across 11 blocks of Hardoi through the month of February. With a goal to enhance TB care and support, each hub is staffed with a dedicated TB Champion offering counselling and guidance to patients and family on treatment adherence, precautions, and tackling existing stigma. Through the initiative, Samuday aims to strengthen community-based TB care and promotes better health outcomes.



### Offering nutritional support to 612 Tuberculosis patients of Hardoi

As part of Samuday's TB Elimination Programme, nutritional support was offered to 612 TB patients across five blocks of Hardoi, including Sandila, Ahirori, Kothawan, Kachhauna and Tadiyawan. Along with distributing nutrition kits, the program also facilitated peer-based counseling and conducted anthropometric screenings in all five blocks.



### MHC hosts 11 specialized health camps for Hardoi beneficiaries

As part of its Mobile Health Clinic (MHC) intervention, Samuday, in coordination with the government, organized 11 specialized camps in Tadiyawan, Bilgram, Kothawan, Bharawan, Ahirori, Behendar, Mallawan, Madhoganj, Sandila, and Ahirori blocks of Hardoi district through February. A range of services like ANC screening, dental check-up, lab testing, counselling, dentist and OPD medication prescription were provided to 1,260 attending beneficiaries.



#### Samuday's Quality Accreditation Project secures NQAS certification

Furthering its goal to bridge the gap between public and private healthcare services, another Ayushman Arogya Mandir (AAM) was certified with the National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS) on Feb 11. The AAM Munnukheda from Sandila block of Hardoi also achieved an impressive score of 88.97%, reflecting its commitment to excellence in healthcare.



#### Career guidance workshop to support unemployed youth of Vilathikulam

A day long Career Guidance and Skill Mapping Workshop was held by HCLFoundation in Vilathikulam block of Thoothukudi district on 15th February. The event aimed to facilitate employment among the unemployed youth by introducing attendees to skill development programs focused on IT, agriculture, animal husbandry, logistics, industry, accounts and finance etc.

Sessions were held by various industry leaders who offered insights on career building to participants. The event also led data collection activity with a goal to connect youth with programs relevant to their skill and interest.

The workshop welcomed distinguished speakers such as Thiru. K. Shanmugham, Rtd I.A.S.; Thiru. K. Elambahavath, Former Chief Secretary of Tamil Nadu, Selvi. R. Ishwarya, I.A.S., District Collector of Thoothukudi and I.A.S., Additional Collector and Project Director (DRDA) of Thoothukudi district, and Mr. Alok Varma, Project Director for Samuday and My Clean City, HCLFoundation.







### Banking Institute of Rural Development (BIRD) visit to Samuday projects @Hardoi

As part of a three-day training program on 'Bankable Models for Mainstreaming Climate Financing', 15 members of the Banking Institute of Rural Development (BIRD) visited the CATT and solar interventions in Hardoi under Samuday by HCLFoundation on 13th February.



The agricultural team also showcased the value-added products of the Hardoi Kisan Producer Company Limited (HKPCL). The batch was keen in understanding the implementation & monitoring aspect of such projects and appreciated Samuday's overarching objective of working towards sustainable models of intervention.



Participants of the field visit included bankers from Public Sector Banks Cooperative Bank, regional rural banks, along with Mr. Prashant Dubey, the Deputy General Manager of National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) and faculty member at BIRD.



### Corn silage distributed to 200 dairy farmers in Pudur block

Samuday distributed corn silage to 300 dairy farmers to better support cattle nutrition and improve milk production in the Pudur block of Thoothukudi district on 5th February. The initiative aims to promote sustainable dairy farming by reducing dependence on seasonal fodder. Silage, a form of green fodder is produced by fermenting crops like maize. Ensuring a steady fodder supply during dry seasons, it offers benefits like improved cattle health and high milk yield. The event was attended by General Manager Aavin, SI Dairy Department and Dr. Mukul, who highlighted the importance of quality fodder for dairy farming.



### Samuday leads workshop with community volunteers of Pudur block

Samuday by HCLFoundation held a workshop with 95 community volunteers on the Village Development Plan (VDP) in Pudur block of Thoothukudi district on 8th February.

The session focused on key components such as community needs, and planning strategies. Mr. Shanmugam, I.A.S, Rtd, Former Chief Secretary of Tamil Nadu, offered valuable insights to ensure an engaging and informative discussion. As a result, the volunteers also gained a clear understanding of contributing effectively to the VDP. A total of 7 retired BDOs (Block Development officers) were also present during the workshop.



### Community volunteers briefing held in Vilathikulam block

To ensure accurate data collection for the Career Guidance and Skill Mapping Workshop, Samuday by HCLFoundation led a meeting with 95 community volunteers in the Vilathikulam block of Thoothukudi district on 19th February.

The meeting briefed members on identifying youth interested in skill training, ensuring participant count and precise data collection for efficient planning and outreach.



# HCLFoundation ensures waste management at Samuday Premier League 9.0

Samuday Premier League, HCLFoundation's annual sports event held its 9th edition at Hardoi stadium from 21st to 23rd February. The three-day event ensured sustainable waste management using an on-site E-garbage loader. A total of 395 kgs of waste was collected and sent to a Material Recovery Facility (MRF) for further processing.



### Samuday distributes bora bags for dry waste collection in Sandila

Aiming for a cleaner and greener environment, HCLFoundation distributed high-quality, durable poly bags to households and businesses for the collection of non-biodegradable waste in Sandila.

As part of its ongoing initiative across 25 wards to enhance waste segregation, residents were encouraged to gather dry waste such as empty plastic bottles, glass containers, metals, paper waste, and other recyclable materials to be handed over to garbage collectors during the daily door-to-door collection services. Workers and staff members from the NPP (Nagar Palika Parishad) were also engaged to inspect the collected waste and ensure appropriate sorting.

The initiative aims to spark a positive behavioral shift among the residents of Sandila, fostering a collective commitment towards a sustainable future in Hardoi district.



### Remodeling of RRC in Hasnapur village by HCLFoundation

Under its Clean Village Initiative, HCLFoundation has recently concluded the remodeling of a Resource Recovery Centre (RRC) in Hasnapur village of Unnao district in Uttar Pradesh.

Previously non-functional, the RRC is now effectively carrying out waste management activities in the village including proper transportation, segregation and recycling. Following the project's implementation, the RRC collected 421 kgs of dry waste and 1,170 kg of wet waste, marking a notable improvement.



### Samuday leads mobile oil extraction demonstration in Sitapur

A successful training and demonstration of a mobile oil extraction unit for Vetiver oil extraction was conducted in Biswan block of Sitapur district, Uttar Pradesh from 4th – 8th February. A total of 26 farmers were trained on the process of extraction and on the best practices for Vetiver crop production.



#### Ambedkar University students visit Samuday in Sandila

Samuday by HCLFoundation hosted students from Ambedkar University at its Sandila office on 14th February. Visiting students learned about the community development projects undertaken by HCLFoundation and the Hardoi Kisan Producer Company Limited (HKPCL). HKPCL also showcased the various value-added products and shared its inspiring journey since inception with students.





#### Samuday launches Gulaabi Haath at SPL 9.0

Towards the closing of SPL 9.0, Samuday proudly unveiled 'Gulaabi Haath – Crafting Empowerment and Coloring Lives' during Festivista, launching a vibrant range of handcrafted products specially designed for Holi. Celebrating heritage, sustainability and empowement, the products showcase skill and dedication of the female artisans.

This event was also graced by dignitaries and senior management, Mr. Raj Walia (EVP Finance, HCLTech), Mr. Alok Varma (Project Director, Samuday) and Mr. Yogesh Kumar (Deputy General Manager, Samuday) who lauded the event for fostering economic independence and preserving cultural heritage.





# Celebrating two years of transformative projects with Meghshala & IIH

As the Edition VIII winners of the HCLTech Grant, Meghshala Trust and Innovators in Health (India) celebrated two years of successful project implementation with the HCL Foundation. Their journey was beautifully captured in a video shoot across the scenic landscapes of Namchi in Sikkim and Dalsinghsarai in Bihar.

Meghshala Trust, winner in the Education category, has been leading the project "Technology-Enabled Teacher Capacity Building – A Case for the State of Sikkim." Their efforts have been crucial in reviving indigenous languages within the region. The video shoot highlighted the integration of indigenous language curricula in government schools, celebrated the area's rich cultural heritage, and showcased the voices of local communities around Namchi, reflecting the deep impact of their work.

Innovators in Health (India), winner in the Health, has been working on reducing tuberculosis (TB) cases in the long term and lowering mortality among TB patients in rural Bihar through their project, "Universal Tuberculosis Care through Active Case Finding and Treatment Support in Rural Bihar." Their efforts have addressed major health issue and improved community health.

These projects exemplify the power of innovative solutions to create lasting change in education and health in remote areas.





### LLF celebrates 10 years of transforming education in Bastar

The Language and Learning Foundation (LLF), winner of the HCLTech Grant 2022 in the Education category, marked its 10th anniversary on Feb 27. #### Fitness assessment






#### **Breaking the Stress Code: A Guide to Exam Success**
