### **Key Highlights**

#### HCLTech Grant India celebrates a decade of purpose, partnerships and progress

HCLTech Grant celebrated its 10 year long journey of empowering the Fifth Estate to create a lasting change in the rural hinterlands of the country. Launched on 16th January 2015, Mr. Shiv Nadar, Founder of HCL, announced a 100-crore commitment towards identifying, supporting and scaling the work of SPOs that are driving impactful change in the core areas of Environment, Health and Education. Graced by the jury member of the HCLTech Grant, Ms. Robin Ann Abrams, Jury HCLTech Grant, Ms. Roshni Nadar Malhotra, Chairperson – HCLTech, Trustee – Shiv Nadar Foundation, Founder & Trustee – The Habitats Trust, Chairperson –CSR; Mr. Suresh Narayanan, Former Chairman and MD, Nestle India Ltd.; Mr. B. S. Baswan, retired IAS Officer, the event was a celebration of a decade of partnership with these grassroots organizations. The event also witnessed the esteemed presence of Mr. Shiv Walia, CFO, HCLTech; Mr. Rahul Singh, COO, HCLTech; Dr. Nidhi Pundhir, SVP – Global CSR, HCLTech and Director, HCLFoundation, among other dignitaries, partners and changemakers. From unveiling the 10 Years Impact Book to honoring changemakers who have redefined the development landscape, every moment resonated with pride and gratitude. The evening shimmered with cultural performances, shared stories, and heartfelt reflections – a reminder that when communities, corporates, and compassion come together, progress follows.



## MoU Signing with National Crafts Museum and Hastkala Academy

HCLFoundation and National Crafts Museum and Hastkala Academy signed an MoU to advance and visibility of artisans across India through skill development on product and design innovations, digital and financial literacy and enterprise development. The MoU was signed by Col. Manoj Rana, Senior Director, National Crafts Musuem and Hastkala Academy and Dr. Nidhi Pundhir.



## HCLFoundation signs MoU to drive youth skill development in Tamil Nadu

HCLFoundation and Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation (TNSDC) signed an MoU to launch a transformative skill development project on November 11. Held in the presence of the Honorable Deputy Chief Minister Mr. Udhayanidhi Stalin, TNSDC Managing Director, and senior officials from HCLFoundation – this partnership highlights a collective commitment to equip youth with industry–relevant skills and strong employability prospects.

The initiative aims to bridge the gap between training and livelihood placement, enabling youth to secure sustainable jobs-while uplifting their socio-economic status.



#### Para sports equipment handover to paralympic committee of India

Deepening its commitment to nurturing para-athletes, the HCLFoundation under its special initiative Sports for Change collaborated with the Paralympic Committee of India (PCI). 14 elite para-athletes received high-performance sports gear worth ₹37 lakh. Scholarships were also awarded to 6 para-athletes under the Power of One initiative, ranging from ₹1 lakh to ₹5 lakh. The program has impacted 64,000+ athletes, with 25 para-athletes already representing the nation internationally.



### **Key Representations**



Dr. Nidhi Pundhir, SVP – Global CSR, HCLTech and Director HCLFoundation, participated in the 10th edition of Coffee for Cause, joining leaders from corporate, government, academia, the armed forces, and civil society to explore new dimensions of sustainability and social responsibility. The dialogue focused on two key themes: "Sustainable Consumption: Reframing Value, Behaviour, and Responsibility in the Age of Excess" and "From Giving to Growing: CSR Projects that Scaled for Impact." Discussions highlighted how conscious choices and collective action can redefine social impact.




Sjoshua Livingstone, Senior Manager HCLFoundation, represented the organization at a roundtable hosted by Rashtriya Raksha University (RRU), Ahmedabad. The dialogue brought together representatives from 15 leading CSR entities, including ONGC, Adani, GMR, Tata Croma, and other prominent PSUs. The session was chaired by Abhishek, CEO of Adani Foundation, and Ashwini, CEO of GMR Varalakshmi Foundation, alongside Prof. Dr. Patel, Vice Chancellor of RRU. The discussion focused on collaborative strategies to strengthen social impact and foster partnerships for sustainable development.



Dr. Nidhi Pundhir participated as a distinguished panelist in a session on the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) approach to wetland conservation, organized by the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) in collaboration with GIZ. The discussion brought together leading scientists, ministry experts, and representatives from various institutions. In her address, Dr. Pundhir highlighted the importance of establishing clear regulatory frameworks for accurate wetland boundary demarcation, fostering collaborative ecosystems that bring together government, corporates, and local communities, and leveraging social media outreach to inspire youth and citizens to actively engage in wetland protection.

Dr. Nidhi Pundhir participated in an envisioning workshop organized by ASPIRE at IIT-Delhi, which brought together policymakers, thought leaders, and government stakeholders to explore collaborative approaches for systemic impact through CSR, philanthropy, academia, and government. The discussions focused on building shared data infrastructure and dashboards, developing research and case studies to inform best practices, strengthening trust and partnerships across corporates, academia, civil society, and government, and activating changemaking networks to create a powerful network effect.



Some journeys begin not in boardrooms or classrooms, but in fields — shaped by soil, seasons, and the quiet discipline of hard work. For Viswalingam Manickam, Group Operations Head of HCLFoundation's Samuday programme in Thoothukudi, this grounding has defined not just his career, but his philosophy of development. This, is Viswa's story.

Excerpts from an interview – edited and condensed for clarity.



#### From village roots to professional purpose

Born in Veeramangudi, a small agricultural village in Thanjavur district, Tamil Nadu, Viswalingam grew up immersed in farming life. From sowing and weeding to harvesting and processing, agriculture was not a subject he studied later — "it was a way of life I lived from childhood - both my parents were farmers, you see," Viswa notes.

Viswalingam's education journey reflects aspiration. And perseverance. After studying till Class 5 in his native village, he moved to Kumbakonam for schooling and later completed his higher secondary education at St. Joseph's Higher Secondary School, Trichy. He went on to earn a BSc in Agriculture from Annamalai University, followed by a postgraduate qualification in Environmental Management through distance learning — a conscious choice that aligned with his growing interest in sustainability. An only son with three sisters, Viswalingam credits his parents — for instilling in him resilience, humility and a deep respect for the land.

#### Learning by doing: A career built on the ground

Viswalingam's transition into the professional world was intentional and field-driven. Instead of moving directly into desk-based roles, he spent two years as a Junior Research Fellow at research stations under Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, gaining critical practical exposure.

This was followed by an entrepreneurial phase, where he ran an Agri-Clinic and Agri-Business Centre in Thanjavur, advising farmers directly. He later spent nearly eight years in the sugar industry and 13 years with a national-level agriculture service organisation, sharpening both technical expertise and operational leadership.

His first association with Project Samuday came in 2015, when he was deputed as an agriculture expert. The experience left a lasting impression. When the opportunity arose to formally join HCLFoundation in 2023, Viswalingam stepped into his current role in Thoothukudi — bringing with him decades of field wisdom and a rare calm authority.

#### Samuday in Thoothukudi: Adapting solutions to geography

As the conversation shifts to the realities on the ground, Viswa responds with a quiet smile. The otherwise concise Viswa surprises with a longer answer. "Leading Samuday in Thoothukudi has required deep contextual thinking. Unlike regions with abundant groundwater, Thoothukudi's coastal geography means saline groundwater, heavy dependence on rainfall, and prolonged water stress. Recognising this, me and my team reshaped Samuday's interventions to suit local realities."

"How so?", we asked. Viswa went on (and on!):

"You see, naturally, water stewardship became foundational — we did so through rainwater harvesting, rejuvenation of water bodies, restoration of supply channels, and drainage systems. Farm ponds were strategically constructed in farmers' fields, enabling water storage and encouraging second-season cultivation using drip irrigation.Climate-smart agriculture was introduced and controlled pilot plots that allowed farmers to compare outcomes directly. Also installed were automated Weather Stations across blocks like Vilathikulam and Pudur, providing farmers with hyper-local, real-time climate data. One particularly impactful intervention has been the removal of Prosopis juliflora, an invasive species that renders farmland unusable. Clearing these thorny growths has helped reclaim land and bring it back under cultivation — restoring both productivity and farmer confidence.

#### A day-in-the-worklife of Viswa @HCLFoundation

Viswalingam M.'s day begins early. He wakes around 4:30 am, spending time in prayer, meditation, and physical exercise before the field takes over. Once he reaches the office in Thoothukudi, his day is largely shaped by people, not screens — phone calls from community members, visits from farmers, and onground problem-solving.

"Once I reach the office, I am fully engaged with people from the community. Many times, I don't even get time to check my emails until late evening or the next day," Viswa says with a quiet laugh.

As Group Operations Head for the Samuday programme in Thoothukudi, Viswa oversees interventions across health, nutrition, and livelihoods, in addition to agriculture and water. Health interventions include mobile health services and Non-Communicable Disease (NCD) screenings, along with the provision of Otoacoustic Emission (OAE) machines to district health authorities to support early identification of hearing impairment among children. Anganwadi centres in project villages are being upgraded into smart Anganwadis, equipped with digital panels, learning materials, and child-friendly infrastructure.

On the livelihoods front, dairy farmers have been organised into producer groups, with milk collection centres established in collaboration with Aavin, ensuring assured pricing. The programme also works with palm tappers, supporting traditional livelihoods linked to palmyra-based products such as Neera and palm sugar.

Shaped by decades of field experience, Viswa's approach today is deliberately focused. Often described by his team as "strict," he is equally known for his respect for grassroots wisdom, openly crediting junior colleagues and community members for the insights they bring through trust, communication, and deep local knowledge.

"Earlier, I believed that if we gave farmers many technologies, they would follow them. But I learned that it doesn't work that way. It is better to focus on a few solutions that truly help them, and support those deeply."

#### A Memorable Moment

One moment that stands out for Viswa is the Tuticorin flood response during Cyclone Michaung in 2023, when the district received nearly 95 cm of rainfall, inundating homes and even breaching the district collectorate. Working closely with the district administration, the Samuday team assessed urgent needs on the ground and supported the distribution of clothing for 15,000 people and dry rations for 9,000 people, with packaging carried out by 400 SHG women. The swift coordination and timely support, later acknowledged by both affected communities and government officials, remains a deeply memorable experience for him.

#### Advice to the next generation

"Have a service mindset. Go deep, serve honestly and ensure the benefit reaches the last person."

Viswa is Thoothukudi-based and shares his life with his wife Sasikala, a Gold Appraiser with the State Bank of India, and their two daughters, Sornasri and Sreenika. He is a morning person at heart, who finds comfort in the humble idli and dosa, prefers books over films, beaches over mountains, and weekends spent with family over any adventure. If not in development, he says he would have stayed in research — still seeking answers, still learning. When asked playfully, "What if Dr. Nidhi & Alok allotted your project unlimited resources? A hypothetical blank cheque for Samuday Thoothukudi!?", his answer doesn't change: "Water first. Always."





#### Small steps to big beginnings

As part of the GenCAN programme, Center for Environment Education (CEE) in partnership with HCLFoundation celebrated Global Handprint Day across six locations—Lucknow, Hardoi, Noida, Bangalore, Chennai, and Nagpur. Over 500 students and teachers participated in activities introducing key concepts of carbon footprint and simple handprint actions. The events featured quizzes, green games, poster-making, and hands-on projects such as creating kitchen gardens, conservation-themed signages, GenCAN bulletin boards, and initiating composting practices.



## Pan-India water conservation awareness campaigns on Children's Day

On Children's Day, HCLFoundation partnered with Aroh Foundation, Tarun Bharat Sangh, Development Alternatives, Dhan Foundation and YUVA Rural Association to promote water conservation among young stewards in Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra. Activities included drawing competitions, slogan writing, and creative sessions where over 245 students expressed their vision of clean ponds, green villages, and sustainable practices through sketches, slogans, and essays – encouraging creativity, ownership, and awareness.



#### Responsible kite flying awareness program

Harit, in collaboration with Animal Warriors Conservation Society, organized 'Responsible Kite Flying' awareness drives at schools, urban parks, and local shops in Hyderabad. The initiative focused on educating children, communities, and local vendors about the dangers of nylon manja to birds, humans, and the environment. Participants were encouraged to switch to eco-friendly cotton threads and support the enforcement of bans on synthetic manja. Over 1,700 people including children, youth, and urban park staff, were sensitized through the sessions. This collaboration aims to protect birds from severe injury and death caused by nylon manja, especially with the upcoming kite-flying season.



## Inspiring young eco-champions by igniting nature curiosity

Interactive Butterfly Biodiversity Sessions were held across nine NMC schools in Nagpur by partner AROHA, engaging 328 students. The sessions introduced the world of butterflies, their life cycles, ecological roles, and the importance of protecting natural habitats. Students explored examples and gained a deeper appreciation for the urban biodiversity around them. To strengthen experiential learning, hands-on demonstrations were conducted at the Nutrition Gardens, reaching 121 students. Children observed composting techniques, soil health practices, seasonal planting, contributed to nutrition and sustainability.



### Empowering communities for water security in Karauli

Under the campaign "Harit Jal Jan Jodo Abhiyan", with our partner Tarun Bharat Sangh (Karauli, Rajasthan) a community meeting was convened with over 30 local participants to foster water dialogue and collective action. This was followed by a Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) session, enabling the community to map existing water resources and identify priority areas for intervention. The PRA approach ensures inclusive participation, integration of local knowledge, strengthening community-led water management, and promotion of sustainable water conservation practices for long-term water security.



## Seed collection drive strengthens afforestation efforts in Madurai

In partnership with DHAN Foundation a seed collection drive was conducted in Yercaud and Kolli Hills, Madurai. The team—Dr. D. Stephen, V. Prakash, and Adavi gardeners Periyapalichi and Rakku collected 1,600 planting material, including seeds, saplings and stem cuttings from 59 native plant species available in the season. This initiative supports afforestation and biodiversity restoration by conserving local genetic resources for future planting programs.



#### 'Mere Sapno Ka Talab' with the water friend-Chintu

In the "Mere Sapno Ka Talab" campaign being carried out in GB Nagar, UP in partnership with Aroh Foundation, an interactive water conservation awareness program named Jal Jagran was conducted involving 56 students from primary and secondary govt. schools in Gulawati Khurd village. The initiative featured a Muppet show with "Chintu, the water-dost" to address challenges in preserving local water bodies, followed by a student-led skit emphasizing the importance of clean water resources – motivating students to adopt sustainable water management practices within their communities.



#### Training for safer snake interactions

A series of three workshops were conducted to strengthen frontline staff for safer human-snake interactions. Harit in collaboration with the Madras Crocodile Bank Trust, trained 133 participants, one workshop in Nagpur for NGO partners and two for the Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve Forest Department. Under Project SAFE (Snake Awareness for Everyone), the sessions focused on snake ecology, safe rescue techniques using props, and basic first aid. Participants received resource materials, and selected members were provided with snake rescue kits to support field operations.



## Drawing Change: Students use comics to champion the environment

In partnership with World Comics India, an Environment comics workshops was organized in Noida and Chennai. Students enthusiastically embraced the idea of learning through comics, using storytelling and illustrations to express their understanding of environmental issues. Students at KGBV Dadri, Upper Primary School Itehra, and Junior High School Jalpura created the classic four-panel comic on themes like Environment conservation, waste, and water, while a two-day workshop at Chennai Higher Secondary School, Lakshmipuram saw over 60 students create 50+ green comics on issues such as deforestation, water conservation, and habitat loss.



#### Cultivating a greener tomorrow

Harit partner Technology Informatics Design Endeavour (TIDE) conducted 8 activity-based sessions on energy conservation and waste management, amounting to 700+hours of active learning and reaching 389 students. (The Green School initiative is designed to instill proenvironmental behavior among students while encouraging eco-friendly practices within schools.) A midline assessment across five newly onboarded schools revealed that 90% of students demonstrated moderate to high levels of improvement in environmental awareness—reflecting positive shifts in knowledge, attitudes and behaviors toward sustainability.



#### Academic visit @ Harit Upvan, Amarpura

Second-year MBA students from FORE School of Management, New Delhi, visited Harit Upvan, Amarpura, GB Nagar as part of their course "From Field to Framework: Designing Solutions for Social Problems." The group of 54 students engaged in interactive, activity-based sessions on themes such as Animal Welfare, Biodiversity, Water Management, and Plant Ecology. The visit offered practical insights into nature conservation and environmental sustainability, bridging classroom learning with real-world applications.



#### Building spaces for reptiles to thrive in Urban Mini Forests of Lucknow

A natural log-and-slab structure has been introduced at Atal Harit Upvan Lucknow by partner Give Me Trees Trust to create microhabitats for reptiles. These shelters provide shaded crevices, thermal regulation, and safe hiding spots, supporting species like lizards and nonvenomous snakes. Such features enhance biodiversity in urban green spaces and afforestation sites by offering refuge and promoting ecological balance.



## Promoting water conservation through awareness and action

Aroh Foundation, with support from HCLFoundation and HCLTech volunteers, organized a community awareness program at Beel Akbarpur village, GBN, UP to promote pond conservation and water management. The event included a poster-making competition for 40 students followed by a rally around the waterbodies.





## HCLFoundation strengthens digital skills in the classroom in Hardoi

The Digital Literacy, Coding, Computational Thinking & Artificial Intelligence (DLCC & AI) Program is transforming education for KGBV students, equipping them with essential digital skills for the 21st century.

A Student-Led Peer Learning Group - TechToli was introduced as a new concept to foster collaboration and improve hands-on practice in coding and AI.

From November 19 –21, training of 34 teachers was held in Hardoi across seven modules: Computer Fundamentals, Internet Usage, Microsoft Office, Logical Thinking, AI Basics, Scratch, and Python Programming. Educators explored the UP OER (Uttar Pradesh Open Educational Resources) portal and HCLFoundation's innovative LMS for structured digital learning.



## HCLFoundation commences construction of advanced veterinary hospital in Sandila, Hardoi

Samuday by HCLFoundation is building Uttar Pradesh's first advanced veterinary hospital in Sandila, Hardoi. Being developed as a Centre for Artificial Insemination and Animal Husbandry Extension Services (CAAES), the facility will function as a Centre of Excellence in the field of Animal Husbandry aimed at strengthening animal health services in the region. The Centre will provide modern treatment facilities for livestock, pets, poultry as laboratory animals, ensuring easy access to high-quality veterinary care for livestock owners.

It will also serve as a training hub, offering capacitybuilding programs for livestock farmers on improved and scientific animal husbandry practices.



## Samuday's TB elimination program trains 33 champions in Sandila

Samuday by HCLFoundation is driving its Tuberculosis (TB) Elimination Program across 11 blocks of Hardoi district by reaching thousands of patients through a peer-led, person-centric care model and protein-rich nutrition support.

Over the past two years, the program has impacted 6,000 TB patients – focusing on stigma, awareness on treatment adherence and community engagement. To strengthen this mission, 33 TB Champions were trained in Sandila on November 11–12. The workshop was graced by the District TB Officer (DTO), who addressed the participants and appreciated their commitment to supporting patients.



## Samuday empowers leaders through skill development in Sandila

Samuday Crafts organized a day-long capacity-building workshop at the Samuday Crafts hub in Sandila on November 18.

A total of six Center Managers (from Moonj craft, wheatgrass, hand-block printing center, Taat hand embroidery, chikankari hand embroidery centers) and three Board Members participated with Directors Mr. Nitesh Vimal and Ms. Savitri Devi facilitating the workshop. The session focused on three critical areas – entrepreneurship, hard skills, and soft skills development to strengthen leadership, communication, and operational efficiency at the grassroots level.

Participants learned to think like entrepreneurs, calculate costs, set fair prices, and explore new market opportunities while adopting eco-friendly practices.



### Samuday signs MoU with TNSRLM in Thoothukudi

This month, as part of its Animal Husbandry initiative, HCLFoudation signed an MoU with TNSRLM (Tamil Nadu State Rural Livelihood Mission) to implement a Front-End Subsidy Model project for dairy-based livelihood promotion. The initiative aims to support 238 poor families, especially SHG women, to generate sustained income through dairy activities. Each beneficiary will receive ₹20,000 as an installment subsidy for the purchase of a high yield milch animal.

The project focuses on increasing livestock population and improving milk yield through quality animal induction. It will further strengthen the dairy value chain by linking SHGs, cooperatives, and AMCUs for efficient production and marketing. Ultimately, the project is designed to empower rural women through asset ownership, income control, and long-term economic independence.



## Samuday leads training on climate smart agriculture in Thoothukudi

We organized a training on Climate Smart Agriculture on November 21 for Frontline Demonstration farmers at Nagalpuram Panchayat in Vilathikulum block of Thoothukudi. The session introduced dryland farming technologies to boost resilience and productivity in rainfed areas. 80 farmers actively participated, learning sustainable practices like soil moisture conservation, crop diversification, and integrated nutrient management to adapt to changing climates.



### Strengthening the dairy ecosystem in Thoothukudi

Samuday is boosting sustainable dairy productivity and improving cattle health by enabling year-round cultivation of green fodder. To achieve the same, 10 beneficiaries were provided with water-plumbing materials to complement the borewells dug earlier, ensuring efficient irrigation. This leads to better milk yield and enhanced household income and livelihood.



## Agricultural inputs distributed across 255 villages under Climate Smart Agriculture

Samuday by HCLFoundation distributed agricultural inputs to 731 Frontline Demonstration farmers this month across 255 villages in Vilathikulam and Pudur blocks of Thoothukudi. As part of its Climate Smart Agriculture initiative, farmers received neem cake, seeds, biopackages, pest traps, and other essentials to promote sustainable farming and crop resilience.



### Night Chaupals promote sustainable farming in Sandi block of Hardoi

As part of the Nurturing Nature project, 5 Night Chaupals were organized across multiple Gram Panchayats in Sandi block in Hardoi district to raise awareness and build community capacity. Through open dialogue and practical learning, 176 villagers are being trained and empowered to adopt eco-friendly methods for a healthier environment and resilient livelihoods.



## Cool season crops promoted for 60 farmers in Thoothukudi

Samuday team conducted a demonstration for farmers at Kandhasamy Puram on November 14 to introduce cool season crops in a region where they are rarely grown. 60 farmers were taught carrot cultivation on raised beds – promoting crop diversification, soil health, and resilience under the Climate Smart Agriculture initiative.



### Engineering day celebrations unite 100 schools in Hardoi

This month, Samuday team celebrated Engineering Day across 11 blocks of Hardoi district in Uttar Pradesh. Students were engaged in activities like poster presentations, quiz competition, and debates on technology. The series of events inviting 100 schools were held at UPS (Upper Primary School) Jamu in Sandila block and UPS Pilkhana in Madhoganj block on November 6 and 7.

Winners were awarded by BEO (Block Education Officer) Madhoganj Shri Santosh Kumar. The programme also conducted a 3-day teacher training with HCLFoundation and Eklavya team to support better use of the science kit in classrooms.





#### Samuday celebrates Shaurya Diwas to promote waste management in schools

On November 12 and 13, four Urban Local Bodies—Nagar Palika Parishad Mallawan, Sandila, Nagar Panchayat Kachhauna Patseni and Beniganj—came together under Mission Shakti and the Plastic Bank Initiative to celebrate Shaurya Diwas with a vibrant poster competition organized by the Swachh Sarathi Clubs.

Centered on the theme "Women's Contribution to Cleanliness," the event honored the courage and pivotal role of women in the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan while promoting environmental responsibility. A total of 86 children in 4 schools joined a ten-minute cleanliness drive on their school premises, reinforcing the message of individual responsibility for a cleaner environment.





#### **Exploring the work of PlanatEarth**

Mr. Robin G Thomas, Associate General Manager, HCLTech Grant and Ms. Prakriti Khar, Deputy Manager, HCLFoundation visited PlanatEarth, the Edition VIII HCLTech Grant #Environment category award winner, on 25th and 26th November 2025. The team gave a detailed presentation on the progress of Project DROP (Drive to Recover Ocean Plastic) and Project VMF (Vembanad's Macro Fight), where they shared the waste collection and recovery achievements, upcycling and circular economy models, community engagement and operational developments. The team visited the Upcycling Unit, where they observed the waste art techniques and workforce training and empowerment initiatives; and the VMF Production Unit at Puliyanam where they witnessed the Water Hyacinth drying operations, sawdust processing and moisture management, briquette production workflow and material movement and daily output planning. They also interacted with the fishermen community at the collection point of Munnambam Harbour. In the past two years, the project has demonstrated a scientific approach to efficiently integrate waste-to-energy solutions.

**HCLFoundation delegates visited The Corbett** Foundation, the #Environment category winner of HCLTech Grant Edition IX to witness the ongoing project, "Guardians of Grasslands: Empowering communities to safequard pastures for the long-term conservation of critically endangered bustards and associated species in Kutch, Gujarat". Chair of the HCLTech Grant Jury, Ms. Robin Abrams and Dr. Nidhi Pundhir along with Ms. Simi Suri and members of the HCLTech Grant team, engaged closely with communities and conservation partners working to protect the fragile landscape of Naliya along with the Director of TCF, Mr. Kedar Gore, Mr. Jhala, Dr. Rather and Ms. Vidhi where they encountered one of India's rarest living treasures — the critically endangered Great Indian Bustard (GIB). Across every interaction, the spirit of Kutch - its communities, biodiversity, and conservation champions - shone through, demonstrating how meaningful change unfolds when leadership, grassroots action, and scientific commitment unite.







#### Mr. Robin G Thomas visits Pallium India Trust

Mr. Robin G Thomas, Associate General Manager, HCLTech Grant visited Pallium India Trust – the #Health category recipient of the Edition X HCLTech Grant. The aim of the visit was to meet the leadership and team of the organization including Dr. M. R. Rajagopal, Chairman Emeritus and Founder, Binod Hariharan, Chairman & CEO and Shriya Singh COO; discuss the possibilities of collaboration and volunteering; and engage with the community to better understand the work executed by Pallium India Trust under the project – "Palliative care service delivery through home visits in Rural Trivandrum". He also visited homes in the area Vilappilsala, under the City 2 Homecare team along with Sr. Falin Jothi, Deepak C Zachariah and Palliative care assistant – Abhilash. The project focuses on delivering accessible, compassionate palliative care to individuals in their homes and thus enhance the quality of life for patients and families while addressing healthcare disparities.





#### The story of Shashikala: From reluctance to leadership

Shashikala, a 30-year-old tribal woman from Penjalli tribal hamlet, reluctantly became an Anganwadi helper and faced immense challenges when the teacher retired. Managing both cooking and preschool education alone, she struggled, especially with irregular support from the in-charge teacher.

Makkala Jagriti intervened with training, mentorship, and regular coordinator visits, equipping her with effective preschool techniques and boosting her confidence. Despite the absence of a permanent teacher, Shashikala took full responsibility, ensuring child attendance and conducting activities. Recognized as a top helper in her circle, she became a community role model, proving that targeted support can empower individuals to create lasting change.

### World Toilet Day: Volunteer engagement for sanitation awareness

SOCHARA organized a Volunteer Engagement Programme at BBMP Boys School, Austin Town, with active participation from sanitation workers. The event began with introductions and interactive sessions that fostered awareness and understanding of the challenges faced by sanitation workers. Volunteers from Maya Bazaar performed a powerful street play on waste segregation and management, delivering impactful messages through creativity. As part of a support initiative, 100 pairs of protective boots were distributed to sanitation workers, reinforcing safety and acknowledging their vital role in maintaining community hygiene. The programme successfully blended awareness, creative expression, and practical support, inspiring collective responsibility for sustainability and community well-being.



### Children's Day Celebration: Spreading joy across anganwadi centres

United Way Bengaluru celebrated Children's Day across 24 Anganwadi Centres, bringing together 327 children, 88 mothers, 23 workers, and 16 helpers for a day full of fun and bonding. The celebration featured creative activities like handprint art and coloring portraits of Nehru and roses, followed by energetic performances and engaging games that kept spirits high. The festivities concluded on a sweet note with a cake-cutting ceremony sponsored by parents, making the day truly memorable.



### Children's Day Celebration with IIHMR: A day of joy and learning

On 14th November, Pillaganahalli came alive with vibrant celebrations as the community marked Children's Day with enthusiasm and warmth. The event featured fun games, creative sessions, and interactive learning activities that sparked curiosity and encouraged self-expression among children. Adding a special touch, two dedicated volunteers ensured smooth execution and brought energy to every moment, making the celebration lively and engaging. The day concluded with a heartwarming gesture of gift distribution, leaving children with smiles and cherished memories.



### School Health Awareness Drive: KHPT & CUPA Foundation educate students on rabies and snakebite safety

On 29th November 2025, KHPT, in collaboration with the CUPA Foundation, organized an impactful School Health Awareness Programme at Gottigere and Jambusavari Dinne Government Higher Primary Schools. The initiative focused on rabies and snakebite prevention, addressing growing concerns over dog-bite cases in Bangalore. The session, led by Ms. Harshita, featured an engaging and child-friendly discussion on topics such as rabies, safe interaction with animals, prevention of animal bites, and essential first aid measures. Students learned about the causes and symptoms of rabies, the importance of timely medical care, and practical safety tips for dealing with urban wildlife. Additionally, the program covered first aid responses for snakebite incidents, emphasizing common mistakes to avoid. Visual aids and live demonstrations made the learning interactive and easy to understand, equipping children with confidence to handle emergencies.



#### Bridging Gaps in healthcare access through Ayushman Bharat Card generation camp

On 22nd November 2025, KHPT organized an Ayushman Bharat Health Card Generation Camp at Jambusavari Dinne to help community members access healthcare benefits under the scheme. The initiative aimed to bridge documentation gaps and improve access to essential health services, receiving strong community participation with 95 members registered, 29 new health cards created, and 34 individuals assisted in downloading existing cards. By supporting smooth service delivery, the camp played a crucial role in empowering the community to move closer to affordable and quality healthcare.



### World Diabetes Day: KHPT leads community awareness through interactive sessions

In November 2025, KHPT organized a series of diabetes awareness sessions across Gottigere UPHC communities, reaching People with Non-Communicable Diseases (PWNCD), ANC women, mothers of children under five, Mahila Aroqya Samithi (MAS) and Self-Help Group (SHG) members, as well as workplace groups. The initiative aimed to deepen understanding of diabetes prevention and management through practical, engaging activities. Sessions began with a recap of previous discussions and moved into interactive demonstrations. One activity used three glasses of water mixed with turmeric to illustrate blood sugar fluctuations—low during fasting, higher after meals, and persistently elevated when uncontrolled. Another creative exercise explained insulin resistance using a cloth (blood vessel), stones (sugar), and a spoon (insulin), showing how excess sugar makes insulin's job harder. Facilitators emphasized that while diabetes is increasingly common, it can be managed with early diagnosis, regular blood sugar and BP checks (especially for those above 30), and healthy habits like exercise, yoga, meditation, and a balanced diet. Participants appreciated the practical approach and clear quidance, leaving with strong messages about early screening and lifestyle changes.





#### Nurture Your Plant: Promoting self-care and well-being

On 24th November 2025, KHPT conducted the first targeted intervention activity for women and elderly groups at Yarabnagar Slum, Yarabnagar UPHC. Each of the nine participants received a jasmine plant and was encouraged to observe its needs, reflecting on how nurturing the plant parallels caring for their own wellbeing through healthy eating, exercise, social interaction, and mindfulness. The activity aimed to promote self-love and holistic health, creating a symbolic connection between plant care and personal care. A follow-up will be conducted to understand how this experience influences participants' daily habits and mindset.



### Diya Painting Activity: Creative engagement for elderly well-being

On 25th November 2025, a Diya painting activity was conducted at Gundamma Compound, Madiwala UPHC as part of an induction program for elderly community members. The session saw active participation from seven beneficiaries, who engaged in painting as a way to relax and express creativity. The objective was to mobilize the elderly and introduce the concept of mental well-being in a simple, engaging manner. Participants shared that the activity helped them forget their worries and feel calm, highlighting the positive impact of creative engagement on mental health.



### ISB-DLabs and HCLFoundation empower women entrepreneurs through skill-building bootcamps

On November 20-21, 2025, ISB-DLabs Incubator, with strategic support from HCLFoundation, conducted Bootcamp 2 in Bengaluru, training 37 women microentrepreneurs in Kannada. The sessions covered MSME schemes for women, business planning using the Business Model Canvas, and practical guidance on digital tools like WhatsApp Business, Instagram Business, and Canva. Participants also received training in financial literacy and Detailed Project Report (DPR) preparation aligned with banking requirements. To ensure continued learning, two virtual sessions on DPR preparation were held on November 14, 2025, for participants from the September Bengaluru cohort and October Madurai cohort. Delivered in Hindi and Tamil, these sessions provided deeper insights into financial concepts and DPR templates, strengthening financial readiness for womenled businesses.



### Social Security Schemes Camp: Driving awareness and enrollment in Anekal

A Social Security Schemes Camp was organized near Marsur Gate, Anekal, by Yuvakendra in collaboration with Head Held High Foundation, Bengaluru, to promote awareness and facilitate enrollment in Government of India's social security programs. During the drive, the team introduced various schemes and explained the benefits of E-Shram Card, PMSBY, and PMJAY, while educating beneficiaries on their features and advantages. The camp supported 36 community members, enabling enrollments for 8 ABHA IDs and 28 E-Shram cards. Additionally, local residents were mobilized to participate, ensuring greater outreach and understanding of these schemes aimed at improving social and financial security.

### Empowering tribal women through value addition training on millets and amla

The Rural Development Council, committed to uplifting tribal communities in the hills of Denkanikottai, conducted a two-day value addition training program for women from the tribal community. The sessions focused on strengthening traditional food processing skills and promoting livelihood opportunities. On Day 1, participants learned to prepare Kollu Podi and Uluntham Kanji Mix, while Day 2 covered Dry Amla Processing. The training included hands-on practice in cleaning, roasting, grinding, slicing, boiling, and drying, along with guidance on the safe operation and maintenance of grinding machines. Additionally, a workshop on Shikakai powder production was conducted to diversify product development. A total of 14 women benefited from the program, which not only enhanced technical competencies but also promoted traditional healthy foods and supported income generation within the community.







### I Create India and HCLFoundation Empower Indian Army Veterans through entrepreneurship training

HCLFoundation, through its sponsored Business Incubation Centers (BICs) in Bengaluru, Lucknow, and Nagpur, is enabling retiring Indian Army personnel to explore entrepreneurship as a viable career option and become job creators. In November 2025, three workshops were conducted—one in Bengaluru with 39 participants, one in Lucknow with 34 participants, and one in Nagpur with 31 participants—providing comprehensive training on business planning, financial literacy, and digital tools.

#### Success story:

Naik Abdul Malek Malitya from Murshidabad, West Bengal, attended the HCLFoundation-sponsored Aspiring Entrepreneurs Workshop at AMC Centre, Lucknow. Equipped with skills in market research, planning, negotiation, and cost-effective promotion, he invested ₹5 lakhs post-retirement to start a B2C medical store. His shop now earns a 15–25% profit margin and enjoys strong customer trust.

Abdul plans to expand into medical equipment, baby care, and wellness products, introduce online ordering and home delivery, and build partnerships with nearby clinics. His venture has significantly benefited the local community by ensuring reliable access to essential medicines and healthcare products, especially for the elderly and chronically ill.

#### Chennai

### Vibrant children's day celebration with cultural performances

OfERR team organized a vibrant Children's Day celebration at Govt. ADW Girls Higher Secondary School, Kannigapuram. The programme began with an insightful explanation of the significance of Children's Day, followed by a short motivational talk to inspire students. The event featured engaging activities such as the Voice Wall, slogan writing, fun games, and interactive sessions on child rights awareness, ensuring meaningful participation from students. The celebration concluded with captivating cultural performances by program students, adding color and energy to the day. A major highlight was the Folk Arts (Parai) training students' performance, which showcased their skills and confidence gained through dedicated training sessions. Their energetic presentation received enthusiastic applause from both teachers and students, making the event truly memorable.



#### Students explore environmental issues through comics

The OfERR team, in collaboration with World Comics India, organized an exciting Comics Workshop at Chennai Higher Secondary School, Lakshmipuram. The sessions were facilitated by expert trainers Mr. Jagjith and Ms. Charu, bringing comic storytelling to life for students. A total of 62 students participated enthusiastically, and many successfully created their first comic during the workshop. Through this hands-on training, students learned how to identify and illustrate basic environmental issues in their school and surrounding community using creative comic techniques. The workshop not only enhanced artistic skills but also encouraged critical thinking and social awareness, making learning both fun and impactful.



### Volunteering sessions by Mr. Naveen at Asha Deep Foundation Yuvakendra

On 12 November 2025, Mr. Naveen (AGM, HCLTech) visited the Asha Deep Foundation Yuvakendra Centre and conducted an insightful session on time management, understanding work progress, and maintaining work ethics. He returned on 20 November 2025 for another impactful session focused on skill development and entrepreneurial thinking, inspiring trainees to explore ways to become self-reliant and future-ready. These sessions provided valuable guidance to the youth, helping them build confidence and prepare for professional success.



#### Diabetes awareness programme at yuvakendra centre

On 14 November 2025, Asha Deep Foundation, in collaboration with HCLFoundation, organized a Diabetes Awareness Program at the Yuvakendra Centre. The event featured Dr. Rahul, Diabetologist from Dr. Mohan's Diabetes Specialties Center, and Ms. Thilothama, Coordinator at Thozhi Shelter, as chief quests.Dr. Rahul delivered an informative presentation covering the purpose of Diabetes Awareness Day, the effects and types of diabetes, common symptoms, and essential lifestyle practices to prevent diabetes. His session emphasized the importance of early detection and healthy habits for longterm well-being. As part of the program, all 42 participants received a free random blood sugar check-up, ensuring practical engagement alongside awareness. The trainees actively participated, asked questions, and benefited greatly from the session, leaving with a deeper understanding of diabetes management and prevention.



### Recreational exposure visit to Vedanthangal Bird Sanctuary

On 26 November 2025, trainees from the Yuvakendra Skill Training Centre, including PWD, non-PWD, and transwomen, along with staff, embarked on an exciting exposure visit to the Vedanthangal Bird Sanctuary. Traveling in two vans, the group enjoyed observing a variety of migratory birds from across the globe, creating a memorable learning and leisure experience. The day included a shared lunch, fostering camaraderie among trainees and staff. Post-lunch, participants engaged in fun activities like singing and dancing, adding joy and energy to the outing. This visit provided a refreshing break from routine training, promoting team bonding, relaxation, and a sense of celebration after a productive month of skill-building activities.



### Micronutrient support for children and mothers in chennai

Nutrition support initiatives were carried out across multiple locations to improve health outcomes for vulnerable groups. At Stanley Hospital, 15 children benefited from micronutrient support, while at the Institute of Child Health, 35 children received assistance. Through SIP Memorial Trust and community outreach, 50 children were supported, with 25 from SIP Memorial Trust and 25 from the community. Additionally, targeted nutrition support was provided to 50 TB-infected children, 10 HIV-infected antenatal mothers, and 10 TB-infected antenatal mothers at Kilpauk Urban Primary Health Centre in Central Chennai. These efforts aim to strengthen immunity, improve maternal and child health, and reduce the risk of complications among high-risk groups.



### Community cleaning drive transforms kannagi's 8th cross street

On 8 November, the Indian Institute for Human Settlements (IIHS) organized a community cleaning drive at 8th Cross Street, Kannagi, with active participation from residents and volunteers from HCLFoundation and IIHS. Residents took collective responsibility for cleaning areas around their homes, removing garbage, household waste, and construction debris from recent renovation works. Notably, the collected construction material was repurposed to level a damaged lane between blocks that had been affected by water stagnation. In total, approximately 80 kilograms of garbage and 45 discarded bottles were collected. The initiative aimed to promote community participation, raise hygiene awareness, and encourage environmental responsibility. The drive concluded successfully, leaving the street visibly cleaner and strengthening community ownership in maintaining a healthy, sustainable neighborhood.



### World toilet day celebration promotes sanitation awareness in Kannagi Nagar

On World Toilet Day, IIHS, with support from HCLFoundation, organized a series of community events at Asha Nivas Hall, Kannagi Nagar to reinforce the theme "Sanitation in a Changing World."The highlight was a Clean Toilet Contest, tracking behavior change among families. Initial checks were conducted by HCLTech volunteers, while TNUHDB officers and an external expert carried out the final assessment. All 20 finalists received awards, with the top five winning special prizes. Over 100 residents attended an awareness session addressed by TNUHDB officials, followed by a vibrant rangoli competition and a folk performance that brought the sanitation message to life. The program concluded with a community pledge to maintain clean toilets, fostering ownership and commitment to hygiene.



#### Tsunami awareness through creative engagement

To raise awareness about tsunami preparedness, a poster-making activity was organized for college students. Tsunamis are powerful sea waves triggered by underwater earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, or landslides. Though rare, they can cause massive destruction within minutes, making awareness and preparedness critical—especially for those living in coastal regions. The session emphasized that while tsunamis cannot be prevented, their impact can be significantly reduced through knowledge, awareness, and quick action. Students learned the importance of staying informed and prepared, as they play a vital role in creating safe, resilient communities. By using creative expression, the activity encouraged open dialogue and reinforced the message that preparedness saves lives.



#### World premature day awareness at Perumbakkam PHC

On November 19, 2025, Ekam organized an interactive awareness session at Perumbakkam PHC to educate antenatal mothers on caring for premature babies. Using a creative butterfly-themed activity, participants learned key practices such as temperature maintenance, safe sleep, KMC, hygiene, and feeding.Mothers actively engaged by reading messages aloud and adding them to the butterfly chart, reinforcing learning through participation. The session saw involvement from 20 antenatal women, along with VHN, SHN, and PHC staff, making it an impactful and memorable event.



### Bridging the Digital Divide: ICT labs inaugurated across five schools

We inaugurated five ICT Labs and distributed Science Kits across five government schools with support from HCLFoundation at Nehru Government Boys Higher Secondary School, Nanganallur. The event was graced by Mrs. Sri Rajarajaswari Duraisamy (HR Manager, HCLTech), Mr. C. Newton (Senior Manager, HCLFoundation), and Mr. A. L. Rangarajan (Country Manager, ILP), along with teams from HCLFoundation and ILP.Students showcased ICT tools and science experiments learned through these initiatives. The ICT program will benefit Grades 7–9, reaching 1,000+ students, while Science Kits will support Grades 6–9.



### Igniting Curiosity: Students showcase creative science models

We hosted Science Fairs across government schools in November, where 139 students from Grades 9–12 showcased innovative models on topics like Global Warming, Climate Change, Electricity, Water Cycle, Waste to Wealth, Renewable & Non-renewable Resources, and Environment. Four HCLTech volunteers joined as jury members alongside Science teachers. Students presented their projects with guidance from teachers, ILP facilitators, and parents. Prizes were awarded to top projects, and all participants received certificates and medals for their efforts.



### Connecting communities: Spreading awareness on shelter services

An outreach programme was conducted at Koyambedu Bus Stand to raise awareness about free shelter services available in Chennai. Working with Chennai Corporation coordinators, the team distributed leaflets detailing services such as safe accommodation, food, healthcare, counseling, and other essentials across different city zones. Staff engaged directly with passengers, workers, and vulnerable individuals, explaining how shelters operate and who can access them. Many were unaware of these services and appreciated the information. The team also identified individuals in immediate need and guided them to the nearest shelter.



#### Tobacco-Free Youth Campaign 3.0 - Adyar

The Tobacco-Free Youth Campaign 3.0 was held at the Cancer Institute (WIA), Adyar, empowering students to advocate for a tobacco-free generation. Experts from public health and psycho-oncology engaged participants on the harmful effects of tobacco and the importance of prevention. Key speakers included Dr. R. Swaminathan, Associate Director, Cancer Institute (WIA), and officials from the State Tobacco Control Programme, who emphasized collaboration for effective tobacco control. Interactive sessions highlighted mental health, prevention strategies, and the role of healthcare professionals. The programme benefited 27 students, equipping them with knowledge and motivation to lead and promote a tobacco-free lifestyle.



### National Cancer Awareness Day 2025: Building Community Champions for Health

The Cancer Institute (WIA), Adyar, with support from HCLFoundation, observed National Cancer Awareness Day through an initiative titled "Empowering Women SHG Leaders on Cancer Prevention and Early Detection." The program aimed to equip women self-help group leaders as community ambassadors for cancer awareness and healthy living. Key sessions covered women-related cancers, early detection, lifestyle diseases, and the role of SHG leaders in cancer control, delivered by experts from oncology and public health. Participants also underwent cancer screening. The event engaged 84 women leaders, making it an impactful step toward promoting health literacy and early detection in communities.



#### Children's Day Celebration - Gandhi Nagar ECCD Center

The center was filled with joy as little ones celebrated Children's Day in vibrant costumes, paper hats, and balloons. The day featured storytelling, rhymes, dance, games, good manners lessons, and a lively fancy dress competition, showcasing the talents of every child. Parents joined the festivities, sharing cake and chocolates, while children received gifts of coloring books and crayons, making the celebration truly memorable.



#### Child Rights Day - Gandhi Nagar ECCD Center

On 20 November 2025, Gandhi Nagar ECCD Center, Chennai, observed Child Rights Day to raise awareness among children, parents, and the community about child rights and their importance.Ms. Malini from Childline shared insights from her experience handling child abuse cases, while Ms. Uma, ICDS Supervisor, spoke about ICDS and government schemes. The program, organized collaboratively by BSSSG and ICDS Tamil Nadu, emphasized creating opportunities for children to participate in decision-making and promoting inclusive, child-friendly practices.The event engaged 40 parents and 10 ECCD teachers, making it a meaningful step toward strengthening child rights awareness.



#### Celebrating Halloween at ECCD Center

The day was all about creativity, imagination, and socialemotional learning at Gandhi Nagar ECCD Center. Children enjoyed mask crafting and playful chants, fostering sharing, teamwork, and empathy.



#### **Enhancing Digital Literacy**

Weekly ICT classes at Police Boys' & Girls' Clubs are equipping 1,211 students (Grades 8–12) across multiple centers with essential digital skills. Students learn Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint through hands-on training, creating documents like letters and mark sheets. This initiative boosts academic performance and builds job-ready computer skills, ensuring students gain practical expertise for future educational and career opportunities.



### **Empowering Youth: Scouts and Guides Advance Through Training Camps**

On 1 November, a Test Camp was held at HOPE Foundation School for Scouts and Guides from T7 Tank Factory PBGC and Ezhil Nagar PBGC, successfully meeting all scheduled requirements. The Second Zone Test Camp followed on 22–23 November at T7 Tank Factory PBGC, with participants from Avadi, Korattur, and Villivakkam PBGCs. Additionally, the Rajyapuraskar (Governor Award) Test Camp was conducted from 14–16 November at Our Lady School of Excellence, Thiruvottiyur.





### **Equipping Young Minds: Disaster & Safety Awareness Sessions Conducted**

Two important safety programs were held at Police Boys & Girls Clubs:Disaster Management at Arumbakkam PBGC, led by the Disaster Rescue Team, covering emergency preparedness, response techniques, and practical demonstrations.LPG Safety at Pallikarnai PBGC, teaching safe handling, leakage prevention, and emergency steps for gas-related hazards.Both sessions strengthened students' understanding of safety measures and equipped them with essential life-saving skills.

The camp focused on key topics such as "Say No to Drugs" and Nutrition, while also promoting skill development, behavioral change, and self-confidence. Activities were designed to help participants overcome stage fear and included engaging games and competitions that encouraged teamwork, leadership, and positive interaction. The sessions aimed to instill discipline, motivation, and healthy habits in daily life. #### Science Centre Workshop

Science Center Workshop was organized at the Young Kalam Discovery Science Center for Corporation school students and teachers where they explored fascinating STEM concepts such as the Star Wheel, Sound, Persistence of Vision, Concave and Convex Mirrors, Light, and the Gyroscope. Students learned to identify constellations using the star wheel and understood how Earth's rotation affects the night sky. Through engaging demonstrations, they discovered how sound is produced by vibrations and how it travels through different media. The principle of persistence of vision was illustrated with optical toys like the thaumatrope, showing how motion pictures work. Experiments with concave and convex mirrors helped them understand real-life applications in telescopes and vehicles, while light experiments demonstrated reflection, refraction, and dispersion beautifully through prisms. The gyroscope activity fascinated students as they observed how spinning motion helps maintain balance and direction, just like in drones and spacecraft. The workshop was highly interactive, deepening students' curiosity, creativity, and scientific understanding through real-world, hands-on learning experiences.



### World Toilet Day: Promoting Sanitation Through Community Engagement

The World Toilet Day event was celebrated in Susaiapparpuram with a creative rangoli competition designed to raise awareness about sanitation and hygiene. This activity served as an engaging platform to highlight the importance of proper toilet use and the urgent need to eliminate open defecation. #### **Strengthening SSC Exam Readiness**

With the support of HCLFoundation, NGO Masoom engaged nearly 900 students in November 2025 through structured learning worksheets across 28 Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) schools and 4-night schools. These worksheets reinforced classroom lessons, enhanced conceptual clarity, and boosted student confidence. Teachers observed increased participation as students practiced and mastered key concepts. This initiative underscores a strong commitment to academic excellence, with plans to scale further and empower more students to succeed in the upcoming SSC exams.



#### **Empowering Students for Future Careers**

Under the ongoing Financial Literacy project, NGO MelJol, with support from HCLFoundation, conducted aptitude tests for 300 students across 7 NMC schools in Nagpur using the Dermatoglyphics Multiple Intelligence Test (DMIT). Personalized reports revealed strengths and learning styles, while career experts guided students on opportunities after 10th and 12th. The initiative boosted confidence and future readiness, earning praise from teachers for its transformative impact.



#### Fostering Innovation through STEM Education

NGO SEDT, with support from HCLFoundation, is engaging NMC school students through science workshops and Young Kalam Science Centre (STEM lab) exposure. The team also promoted the Inspire Award–MANAK program, leading to five idea submissions from Surendragadh NMC School in 2023. Two students, Divyansh Gupta (Smart Basket) and Ansh Dwivedi (Touchscreen Pen), were selected and awarded ₹10,000 each. With guidance from the Young Kalam Science Centre (STEM lab) team, they showcased their models at the Nagpur District Level Exhibition.

## Empowering Adolescents: Family Planning & Sexual Health Awareness

Agragami India, with support from HCLFoundation under the Uday Project, conducted an interactive session on Family Planning and Sexual & Reproductive Health in collaboration with skill partners—Noida Deaf Society, Doctors for You, Access Development Services, EFRAH, and Udayan Care. The programme saw active participation from 141 adolescents and women, reinforcing the importance of early detection and preventive care.

On 10 November 2025, HCLFoundation and FPA India Noida organized awareness sessions for ANC and PNC mothers at Anganwadi centers in Sector–22 and Sector–102. The sessions emphasized timely immunization for children under five, vaccinations for pregnant women, and the importance of breastfeeding, nutrition, and routine health check–ups. ASHAs and Anganwadi workers joined to share information and improve access to maternal and child health services. A total of 86 mothers were sensitized on the significance of on–time immunization.



# Celebrated World Diabetes Day: Driving Awareness & Early Detection

On 14 November, Doctors For You (DFY), with support from HCLFoundation, organized a Diabetes Awareness and Screening Camp under the 1000 Days MCH Project. This year, 79 students from HCLFoundation-supported government schools in Gautam Budh Nagar participated enthusiastically. In Phase 1, students explored fiction, non-fiction, and poetry under the guidance of mentors and submitted their entries for the North Region qualifying round. Out of these, 35 students advanced to the Regional Level, and 28 attended an interactive workshop hosted at Summer Fields School, Gurugram. The excitement soared as five talented students earned their spot in the Grand Finale, which will be held in Chennai marking a proud moment for the schools and participants alike.



#### Katha Utsav 2025 (North Regionals, Delhi)

On 28th and 29th November 2025, a two-day creative workshop on "How to Write a Story and Poem" was organized at Summer Field School, Gurugram, with six enthusiastic college students participating. This year marked the first time that Katha welcomed college students to the Katha Utsav—an esteemed platform designed to help young writers learn, grow, and showcase their literary talent. Guided by experienced mentors and renowned authors, the students developed their final stories—both fiction and non-fiction along with original poems, all of which will be submitted for the Katha Utsav finale in Chennai. Throughout the



workshop, participants learned essential writing skills such as building strong plots, creating compelling characters, writing with emotion and imagery, and shaping narratives that resonate with readers. For many, it was their first handson experience with creative writing, and the sessions helped them overcome hesitation while discovering their storytelling potential. Students shared that the workshop was inspiring, enjoyable, and deeply motivating. By the end, they felt confident and proud of their work, and excited for the possibility of being selected for the Chennai finale.

#### **Exposure Visit to the International Trade Fair**

On 26th November, a group of 42 students from Noida Deaf Society participated in an exposure visit to the International Trade Fair in Delhi. For many especially those who had travelled from various parts of the country it was their first experience attending an event of such scale. The visit offered the students valuable insights into diverse industries, innovative products, and emerging technologies showcased at the fair.



# Observance of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women

On 25 November 2025, Yuvakendra marked the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women by organizing an awareness programme at its Noida center with 56 students (25 girls and 31 boys). The event featured a poster-making activity where students used art to convey powerful messages on women's rights, gender equality, and the need to end violence. Following the activity, participants held a rally from the NCUI Building to Boodha Kakrala, raising slogans including "महिला सम्मान हमारा अभिमान — हिंसा मुक्त हो देश महान"-to spread awareness across the community. A total of 64 students participated (30 girls and 34 boys). The session was facilitated by Ms. Jasbeer Kaur and Ms. Pooja from the Family Planning Association of India. Students learned about family planning, sexual and menstrual hygiene, STI prevention, and key protections under the POCSO Act. Separate sessions for boys and girls created a comfortable environment for open discussions, enabling participants to ask questions freely and clarify personal doubts. Many students shared that this was their first time receiving structured information on these topics particularly safe hygiene practices and their rights under POCSO. By the end of the session, students reported increased confidence in identifying unsafe situations, understanding reproductive health, and making informed choices. Overall, the session significantly boosted awareness, corrected misconceptions, and empowered young people to take charge of their health and safety.


#### Enhancing Skills: Kalamkari Artisans Attend Contemporary Design Workshop

The fest created a safe space for questions and experience–sharing, helping participants gain knowledge, confidence, and awareness. By the end of the event, students were empowered to adopt hygienic practices and advocate for menstrual health within their communities.


#### Diabetes Unseen - Bridging care across life and work

Experts Dr. Usha Sriram, Dr. Nachiket Mor, and Ms. Usha Rani shared insights from clinical practice, systems research, and grassroots engagement. Opening remarks were delivered by Dr. Chethana Thirthahalli(Technical Lead – Health at HCLFoundation), with technical support from Dr. Swaroop N., and moderation by Dr. Sanghamitra Savadatti.

Speakers stressed the need for people-centered, integrated diabetes care that connects medical expertise with community action—underscoring collaboration as key to tackling non-communicable diseases.


#### **ARSH for You - Batch VIII: Orientation highlights**


